

campers build a split rail fence

to protect a portion of the park from snowmobilers who would injure young saplings.



After lunch, it was then my turn to help in a work shed staining long planks of cedar for the pavilion's ceiling. Conversation centered around a variety of topics but notably to me, was the story of a widowed volunteer who found camaraderie and acceptance within the organization after the death of his wife. I loved that this man, who was not a veteran, was accepted by the veterans in the organization at a time in his life when he needed them most.

While at the rally. Eric and I had a chance to explore the town of Cadillac. While we were there, the town had a Model T car show and an art fair. We enjoyed seeing all the Model T's as we drove

around the town. I also loved walking through the art fair's many booths and admiring the talent the artists displayed. As always, the Cadillac's waterfront presented a stunning view.

Hitching up and leaving after these perfect weekends is always hard! We do not want to leave our new friends behind or the simplicity of life in our trailer. For Eric and I, it is back to the routine of our everyday life and counting the days until our next long weekend when we can escape on a camping trip (or better yet, attend another Airstream Rally).


MAC Gives

Veterans Serving Veterans Service Project by Pegeen Smith, BRN 8039

As Tanua wrote in the previous article, the Airstreams Return to Cadillac Rally was a unique opportunity for rally attendees to have fun camping and give back to the Veterans Serving Veterans Park. The park never allowed

campers on their property before but Dr. Roger Bandeen. the Director and an Air Force Veteran found a mutually beneficial means to give the Michigan Airstream Club access to the park along with a way for all the campsite proceeds to be donated to the Veterans Serving Veterans [VSV] organization. Rally attendees made a tax-deductible donation of at least \$25.00/night made payable through the VSV website. All in all, the club raised \$2250.00 which paid for 340' of split-rail fence supplies with money left over to fund other projects at the park. Additionally, the Michigan Airstream Club executive board approved the

> donation of a large engraved brick and a group of rally attendees also pitched in for a second brick to the flags at the front of the park.





On Friday, July 19 the Director gave a presentation to all of us into 2 crews to work



and a group of 18 rally attendees were split up on the split-rail fence at the west end of the

park. The new fence is an extension of an existing fence that helps deter snow-mobiles from accessing the property and damaging saplings and native plants. 2 members worked in the maintenance building staining wood to be used later as shingles. And of course, Eric Graettinger donated his time and supplies to feed everyone delicious pizza for lunch. The crews worked along side veterans and had the split-rail fence completed in less than 6 hours! A heart-felt thank you for all you volunteered that day.

Roger Bandeen was so impressed with the Airstreamers that he has asked us back next year and we are planning on it so mark your calendars!


