We hope that you have been taking advantage of the longer days of summer to get out and explore our marvelous province, or beyond, in your Airstream.

Trenor and I had a wonderful 35-night cruise from Boston back to Boston on Holland America Line's Zuiderdam. Starting on the 20th of July, we cruised to Bar Harbor, Maine, up to Newfoundland and Labrador where people were as friendly as reputed, then headed to Greenland where we saw only one of the two ports we were scheduled to visit because of the dangers of massive icebergs. As only the second cruise ship through Prince Christian Sound in Greenland this year we saw many glaciers and lots of rock on the eastbound trip, but we later saw many gorgeous waterfalls during our passage in sunny skies on the westbound trip. Skirting around 60 to 70 km out of the way due to icebergs as we came out of the scenic cruising of Prince Christian Sound, we stopped at a few ports in Iceland (which is greener than icy Greenland ---- go figure?) before visiting with friends in Oslo, Norway. We then headed west towards Rotterdam, Holland America's home port. The second half of the voyage was working our way back to Boston, with stops in Ireland and Northern Ireland (no we did not kiss the Blarney Stone), and then back to different ports in Iceland and Greenland before hitting the Canadian Maritimes again. We had to miss St. John's because of Hurricane Ernesto, so we returned to Corner Brook, Newfoundland before our final stop in Halifax where we visited with long time friends. We met many wonderful people and enjoyed lots of delicious food. We hiked on numerous trails and learned about many topics with the guest lecturers on board the ship. We also saw many different performances – a bigger range than we had experienced on Holland America before. Overall, a terrific "Legendary Voyage"!

So, now it is time to load up our Airstream and adventure closer to home. We are leaving tomorrow (Monday 26 August) for the Fishing Rally at Sheridan Lake. We are looking forward to connecting with our Airstream friends and enjoying Sheridan Lake's calm and (hopefully) warm waters. We don't fish, but we are sure that there will be plenty to do without fishing. We will be providing a French Toast breakfast one morning – should be fun!!!!

From the 12th to the 15th of September, we will be co-sponsoring, with John and Chris Millard, the Golf Rally at Twin Lakes, near Penticton. This promises to be a fun event, even for those of us (like this writer) who don't play golf. The marshmallow drive and other events are usually a cause for lots of hilarity in my experience.




























Friends-Giving Rally



We have new B.C. Airstream Club crests using the design work of Marilyn VanIderstine and Tom Akam (and approved by International).




