As the 2024 camping season comes to a close in the Northeast, I wanted to talk about what it means to be a part of the Airstream community. They don't tell you this at the dealer, but the way I see it, the value in the Airstream isn't in the unit at all. It's in this community. That might be the best kept secret for new Airstreamers. If you know, you already know. But just in case you don't, let me tell you what I've discovered.

It started with Keystone when I found friends from just about all walks of life from every end of the political spectrum that shared a common bond and could have a darned good time. But then I realized it's not just Keystone.

Admittedly, I've had issue upon issue with two different rigs. While researching these issues on-line, I met strangers who came from out of the blue to help. I've lost track of the number of questions I've posted on Facebook or Airstream Forums and gotten answers to in seconds. I've had engineers call me to discuss my hitch set up, a guy in Texas sent me the specs for his truck after he sold it to someone else 5 minutes before I called, a woman offered to coach me when I started, a friend helped me turn my dinette into a desk and rescued me the day the cabinet that held my fridge fell off the wall (whoever bought my 20 can rest assured that cabinet is NEVER coming down again), and another friend helped me fix a fan and do roof maintenance at an Airstream Park. I've become fast friends with Solo Streaming Sisters in three states. The list is endless.

Last year, on the Smidge of the Blueridge Caravan, while witnessing the kindness of complete strangers when another Airstream backed into me, it hit me: Kindness is what it means to be an Airstreamer. But this culture continues for one reason only - because we want it to.

It had been a rough day. Part of it was spent untangling a bicycle rack from my front bumper and I pulled into camp exhausted after a tense 5-hour drive in a truck I wasn't sure I should be driving. Just about the time that I sighed a sigh of relief, I realized I was responsible for salad. I had to unhitch, go find a grocery store in a strange town and buy the salad, prepare and serve it for the caravan's dinner that night. It was 4:30. And all I wanted to do was curl up under a blanket when I heard my name. Word of the accident had spread, and these people rallied around me. Lesa and her husband ran over before I even got unhitched and asked me what I needed. I tried to wave them off, but they insisted. "Salad," I said, slightly panicked. "I need to get salad." I dug for the envelope of kitty money, and they ran off. As they left, Lesa put her hands on my shoulders and said, "We got this. You are done." And I was. I could finally breathe.

Another accident that day required more help. Have you ever seen 15 people calling around to find a repair shop? Someone had a grandchild in the town we were in who knew someone...and they got a shop to fit them in.

Keystone Apple Festival Rally



The official dates of the rally are Sunday to Sunday, arriving November 10 and departure the 17th. Location, Washington DC south KOA, Fredericksburg, VA.

If you cannot make the entire week, come when you can. Fredericksburg is steeped in history and a cool town at that. You'll find bicycle trails, parks, and the nation's capital nearby along with great places to eat with cool evenings to grill your own grub and sip your coffee by the campfire.

Trap Pond Cypress and Eagle Rally September 19-21 2025

They open up for reservations a year in advance, so if you want to get a jump on things, you can begin making your reservation now. 




On the Road
