We have just completed the 67th Annual Airstream International Rally in Sedalia, MO. With 200 Rigs registered (376 members) Region 9 offered several events at the Rally. These included the Region 9 Breakfast and continuation of the recent tradition of coordinating the Blood Drive for all International Attendees. This year we partnered with Kansas City's Community Blood Center with a goal of collecting 120 Units of Blood. The event went exceptionally well; we collected 164 units of blood which exceeded the goal. We came in at 136% of goal and potentially saved 492 lives. Scott Graham is the coordinator with Anna & David Brandon, Tim & Allison Ebbers and Nancy Fitzgerald coordinating the onsite event. A huge thank you goes out to all the volunteers that worked the drive and those that donated - your support is very much appreciated..

If you're looking for the best Mardi Gras in Texas, it's time to register for Streamin' on the Strand! This one-of-a-kind Airstream Rally is centered around the 114th Galveston Mardi Gras. Airstreams will line either side of the Parade Route in the Entertainment District during the first weekend of Mardi Gras! Galveston. 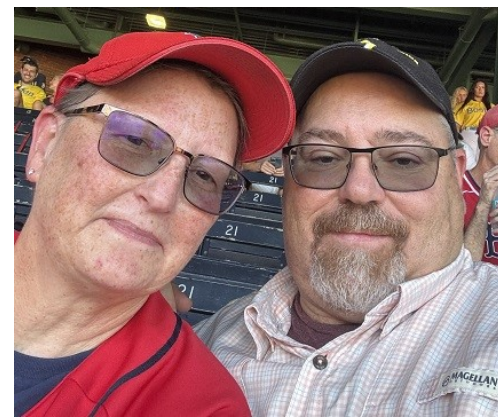

Leaky Kitchen Faucet

Ken and Sue Roe BRN 3805

We're back with another leak to fix in the Airstream. For those folks that don't know us, we're Ken and Sue Roe (BRN 3805). We live in Buda, TX and we 'Stream in a 2018 International 28 RBT we named Maisie. We purchased her used and have spent most of the last 2 years repairing things the previous owner either didn't attend to or neglected. We have also done some modifications to make Maisie our own.





For those that may recall our last submission to the newsletter (THCU May 2024 Newsletter) involved us identifying and fixing a mystery leak. This leak was part of a damaged inline pressure regulator on our Acuva Water Purification system.









As we all know with RVs, things wear out and break. After all, our rigs are bouncing down the road on air inflated tires on some type of spring suspension system. It's pretty much expected that we will be in a constant state of repairing something. It just goes with the joy of owning our rigs.

Our latest was a near constant drip from our kitchen faucet. We were thinking we would need to replace the entire faucet. Not that this is a difficult job, it's just a pain trying to get behind the sink or removing the sink. We got even more concerned when we looked the faucet up to buy a replacement Grohe faucet. The replacement cost online was about \$400.00. Ouch!

As we researched the issue, we learned that the cause of the drip may be a faulty Valve Cartridge. For those with a single handle on the faucet this cartridge is what the handle connects to for you to control water flow and water temperature. We were also pleased to learn that this is a \$75 part. Detailed Step	Pictures
The first step is to either shut off the water leading to the faucet or to the rig. You will also want to open the tap to let any pressure off and to drain the water line	
We will need to remove the handle. This is easily done by looking at the bottom part of the handle. There will be a rubber or plastic stopper there. Remove it carefully. Place it in a safe place so you don't lose it	
Next you will need an allen wrench/key to loosen the screw holding the handle in place. No need to remove the screw, just loosen until the handle separates from the faucet

<p>Now we need to remove the collar to expose the nut that holds the valve cartridge in place. The collar just pops right out.</p>	<p>Collar on</p> 	<p>Collar off</p> 
<p>Next is to remove the nut. We used the large 27mm deep socket. You may need a 30mm. At this point the cartridge will come out of the housing. You may need to wiggle it a bit, but it will come out.</p>	<p>Removing the nut</p> 	<p>Nut is gone</p> 
<p>Here's a layout of the disassembled handle and valve cartridge. This is both the old and new cartridge. The old one has an adapter sleeve on it. You will need this. Simply remove the O-ring at the bottom and the sleeve will slide off. Under the sleeve is the part number. You may want to remove the cartridge well in advance so you can get the part number to be sure the new cartridge fits and will work. Slide it back up on the new cartridge and install the new O-ring.</p>		
<p>Put the faucet back together starting with the valve cartridge. This will only go in one way. You may need to wiggle it a bit. Be sure it seats properly. Reinstall the nut and tighten. Be careful not to over tighten. Place the decorative collar back on. Align the handle and tighten the set screw. Replace the rubber or plastic cap.</p> <p>It's the reverse order of the first few steps.</p>		
<p>TEST: Turn the water on and try it out. You should be all set with no more drip.</p>		

Remember, YouTube can be a huge help. There are several great videos that can walk you through the process. We hope this helps and as always, if you have questions swing on by when we're at a rally. We're always happy to share information and talk Airstreams! Ken and Sue
