New E-Bikes to Consider

Tern Electric Bikes unveiled their Limited Edition Airstream electric bikes last month at the International in Sedalia, Mo. While Tern has many models of E-bikes, (11 lines) the two it is touting as perfect for Airstreams are the HSD P51i and the Vektron S10, both utilizing Bosch motors and easily fold-up for carrying. They claim the compact Airstream e-bikes comfortably fit people from 4'-10" to 6'-5" "with power and range to spare." The HSD has a slightly bigger battery than the Vektron, and has a range of 32-76 miles while the Vektron's range is 34-68. It is also understandably heavier, able to support 396 pounds while the Vektra can support up to 275 lbs. Both the HSD and the Vektron can go a maximum of 20 mph. It appears the company was exclusively selling the Airstream bikes at the



International, but you can purchase the unbranded version at a bike shop selling them.

To get the specs, go to the Tern website https://www.ternbicycles.com/us where you can find the same bikes albeit unbranded bikes and do a comparison on those and their other offerings. (Unbranded they are \$100 less) The website also lists the location of bike shops selling Tern Bikes, with many in the Bay Area, from Santa Rosa on down the coast to Carmel. Sorry, San Jose - no bike shops there carry Terns. The closest shop to Sacramento at this writing that carries Tern bikes is in Martinez.

Message from your Outgoing Registrar

It's been a rewarding experience being your rally registrar for the past three years. However, it's time to pass the torch to someone else.

Three years ago I received a call from Gail Crutchfield asking me if I'd like to take over as registrar. She said, "You are perfect for it; you are detail oriented and would make a great registrar." It was the farthest thing from my mind at the time, but I said I would think about it.

I love helping where I can and volunteering is such a rewarding experience. But this would also be a serious



commitment. Our club only exists because of people who are willing to give of their time and help the club. John, my husband, was president at the time, and I thought, Yes! I can do this. called Gail back and told her that I would give it a try.

Gail explained that

I would receive information via paper coupons and/or the digital Jotform and then have to enter the information onto an Excel spreadsheet. She and Mike Minadeo worked together to create a spreadsheet specifically for each rally. I've done data entry and created a few very simple spreadsheets in the past but nothing with formulas in it. So as Mike helped Gail, John helped me by creating a spreadsheet specific to each rally. I could not have done this job without his help.

In addition to taking each member's registration information and entering it onto the spreadsheet, I would personally respond to each registrant, advising that I had received their registration and they were enrolled in the rally, or that they were on the dreaded waitlist. My...how things have changed. When I first started, I would receive registration requests over a period of days or weeks. Now, a rally can fill up in a matter of 12 minutes. YIKES! There are no more paper coupons; registration is all online via Jotform, which is helpful in keeping track of who registers when, but makes the spreadsheets and formulas more complicated. Plus, while all rally goers used to register soley through me since the Club held a block of reserved sites that were "resold" to members,

we have started rallying at parks that demand individual park registrations first, requiring us to adapt yet again. But we managed to figure it all out and make it workable for us and you.

This position was/is such a great way to get to know you all a little bit more personally, and probably the most rewarding part of the job. If you were on the waitlist, I'd let you know that you would have a great chance to get into a rally, as people are always cancelling. I'd say "good luck, I hope you make it to the rally. " Unfortunately, that "luck" would require another call from someone else with sad news. Some of you had truck issues, health issues, accidents from falls, cancer, deaths in the family, graduations and simply "oopsies" (is that a word?), or another engagement on your calendar that you overlooked or you didn't know about because you forgot to check in with your spouse!

Additionally I made many emails and calls to verify your Jotform choices. Fun fact - the most commonly made mistake has been in choosing the wrong nights you wish to attend. If you are leaving on Sunday, do not check Sunday! If you check Sunday that means you are leaving on MONDAY! (Yes, I know this is different than most online RV reservation systems which ask the day you are leaving, NOT what days you are attending.) The second most commonly made mistake is when writing out your check. Make it out to WBCCI/NORCAL. Or better yet, pay by Zelle.

I still plan on making my pot holders for the hosts. I might start making zippered pouches as I think everyone has enough pot holders by now! And I still plan on making a blanket to raffle off to the hosts at the Installation rally in December.

I'm confident your new registrar, Victoria Bartelt will do a fantastic job in 2025. Over the past three years the rally spreadsheets spreadsheets have gotten very very complicated. Vicky is a whiz at spreadsheets and she is very detail oriented. Vicky and her husband, Paul, have hosted a few rallies and she knows the in's and out's of how rallies work, which will also be a big help to her. Vicky still works, so she's going to have to juggle her day job with this volunteer job. A big Thank you to Vicky for being willing to be our next registrar. She'll do a great job!

Thank you all for making my last 3 years so rewarding. See you at the December Rally.

So What Do You Do at a Rally Anyway?

"So what do you do at a rally, anyway?" I was informed by our outgoing registrar Lori Bibby that this was a typical question by new members/first time rally goers. Having been with the Club for several years and to several rallies,



I was initially taken aback by the question. I remembered back to our first rally at the KOA in Santa Cruz in April of 2017, and that I never questioned what one did as I assumed that you camped and met other Airstreamers, which is what I was interested in doing. It was our maiden voyage in our new- to-us 23-footer and I was a sponge for other people's information. Once

we went to our first rally, I found out what one did at a rally (including spending time cleaning up the entire trailer after a bottle of Merlot that broke when it slid out of our oven while travelling), and there was no looking back. We were part of a Community.

But I had to agree that if simply meeting other Airstreamers was not a priority, then of course you very well may ask that question. So I thought an answer might be helpful.

First, please know that each rally is different, depending on the location and the hosts. However, the purpose is always the same: to provide a fun and/or relaxing time Wednesday to Sunday (or longer) for Club Members at a select location. Despite some beliefs to the contrary, there is no requirement to attend or do anything, or be social for that matter; the choice of what to do is up to you, although if you are anti-social, a group rally may not be for you.


Beyond that, there are some common threads in Norcal rallies: (1) there are usually nightly "happy hours" where Club Members assemble and enjoy their BYO beverage of choice and potluck appetizers made by various members while mingling and sharing stories with each other. This is where announcements if any are made, introductions of new members, celebrations of birthdays and anniversaries, etc.; (2) there are typically one or two catered or prepared group meals that are prepaid through the registration process; and (3) there can be various activities with the logistics preplanned by the hosts. These have included group wine, cider, and coffee tastings, gold panning seminars, tours to local sites and museums, theatre outings, concerts, tech talks, cooking demonstrations, Manhattan tastings, campfires, games, contests, group hikes or bike rides; in short whatever the hosts think up or decide to offer that may be of interest to members. Having said that, some rallies have no preplanned activities since the locale lends itself to just exploring on your own. These activities or lack thereof are usually announced in the Rally Summary that accompanies the Rally Registration information printed in this newsletter, generally in the issue two months in advance of the rally. Take some time and peruse the back issues of the Poppy for past rally reports and photos of prior rallies. These will tell you and show you exactly what happened and what people did at any particular rally.

In the end, it is hoped you invest a bit of time and of yourself in the process of connecting with the Airstream Community, meeting new friends and having new experiences that you otherwise might not have had, making the trip worthwhile. Once you do, you will no longer be asking the question about what one does at a rally, but enjoying them.


Reports From Members:





After you have been "degreened," you will receive your badge, along with a five inch club logo sticker for your Airstream or Tow Vehicle. It has the same design shown on the masthead of The Poppy. Contact NorCal's Membership Chair or Rally Registrar to get yours for no cost to you when you are eligible. Affiliates are eligible to purchase badges after their third NorCal Rally.
