

We also had the opportunity to visit the Mitchell Antique Car Museum. The most extensive Mitchell Motor Car Company collection in the world.

You may or may not have heard of Mitchell cars, but they are all over the world in private collections, museums, and in several locations in Europe where they are extremely popular and valuable.



In 1902 the company made its first motorcar, powered by a single cylinder horizontal air-cooled engine with a chain drive. Eighteen cars produced that year with a top speed of 15 mph. Our visit here began with a short video followed by a guided tour of these elegant "Touring Motor Cars." Knowledgeable antique car restorers were on site to answer any questions and explained how these rear cars are broad back to life and safely stored. One room in the museum is designated for the current restoration of antique Mitchell car. Mr. Lewis Miller, the owner of this remarkable collection, is a direct descendent of the family who began the Mitchell Motor Car Company.



In the afternoon we visited the Warm Springs Ranch. You probably know that this is the home of the famous Clydesdale horses. More than 100 Budweiser Clydesdales including baby Clydesdales live here. They are giant horses with a gentle attitude due to their intensive blood line and training.

Warm Springs Ranch is the official breeding facility for stallions, geldings, mares, and foals. The ranch is located on more than 300 acres scenic, rolling acres in Cooper County, MO.

The official home for the Clydesdales is still the ornate brick and stained-glass stable built in 1885 on the historic 100 acres Anheuser-Busch Brewery complex in St Louis, Missouri.

The ranch also features barns, a veterinary lab and 10 pastures with a customized, walk-in shelter and access to fresh, free-flowing water. Each year between 30-40 foals are born here.

To be a Budweiser Clydesdale, the horse must be born with the proper markings which include a bay coat, a blaze of white on its face and a black mane and tail.

When selected for the team, the horse must be 4 years of age, stand 6' tall and weigh between 1,800 and 2,300 pounds. If all these criteria are met, the horse may get a spot on one of the traveling hitches or a chance to appear ibn commercials.

These famous horses cover thousands of miles each year, traveling to hundreds of appearances to entertain crowds.



We visited the town of Boonville, MO which is located along the Missouri River, about 100 from Kansas City. For thousands of years, native Indians were the only inhabitants of the region.

The Kemper Military School was in Boonville, MO which was sometimes referred to as "The West Point of the West."

Will Rogers attended the school who would later become a famous entertainer. George Lindsey would later play "Goober" on the Andy Griffith show also attended the school. Sadly, during the last several years, most of these schools have closed with only one remaining is in Mexico, Missouri.





We visited the town of Arrow Rock, MO. A special town unlike any other in the country. The current population is 60 residents. From its earliest days it was the destination of many I Indians trials and was considered neutral territory. In 1972 the Hollywood movie *The Adventures of Tom Sawyer* was filmed in Arrow Rock and this musical was an adaptation of Mark Twain's classic 1876 book of the same name.

We had excellent center section seats at the historic, renovated, and professional Lyceum Theater. The Lyceum Theater is the oldest professional theater in Missouri. In 1870 the building was originally a Baptist Church and is now a theater for the performing arts.

We also attended The Smash Hit Show "Million Dolar Quartet" Elvis Presley, Jerry Lee Lewis, Carl Perkins, and Johnny Cash. Four Legends, One Unforgettable Night.

On December 4, 1956, four extraordinary artists ran into each other while visiting producer Sam Phillips' Sun Records studio in Memphis. They began playing together, melding their gospel, country blues, R&B, pop, and bluegrass roots into the new genre called rock-and-roll.

Based on that real-life event, this Tony Award-nominated musical takes you inside the greatest jam session in history, exploding with hits like "Blue Suede Shoes," "Fever," "Walk the Line," "Sixteen Tons," "Who Do You Love," "Great Balls of Fire," "I Walk the Line," and more.

We also visited the nearby community of Blackwater; MO. Blackwater was founded in 1887 by the Missouri Pacific Railroad although it had existed for a long time as a trading post. The population is about 170 people.

As the weeklong rally ended with the Closings Ceremonies, lots of hugs and safe travels were exchanged as we all prepared to depart the next day floating the highways with airstreams going in different directions.







My World Trip (Part Four)

We started in Chester. England, a beautiful city with fine architecture, a Roman Amphitheater and a magnificent church. We also saw a wedding party similar to a Gypsy Wedding. I do not know how the bride and her bridesmaid's were able to walk in those dresses with their hats on their high heels. The bride and her father left in a horse drawn carriage where the bride's dress took up most of the carriage. I had never even heard of a gypsy

wedding. I had to look it up on the internet.

We traveled to Conwy, Wales to see the castle Edward I built to protect his interests in Wales, which at that time was under English rule. Later on that day we hiked a National Park with its surrounding mountains.

We stopped in many village towns for rest stops and lunches. There we learned some of the local history and perhaps take a hike. Of course, we would try the local food. The pasties or meat pies were quite good. These are what the workers would pack in their lunch boxes. They would still be warm by lunchtime. If you've been to



the upper peninsula of

Michigan or in Wisconsin, you have probably tried one of these pies.



We stayed at the Swans Inn in the Lake District of the UK, where William Wordsworth went for a few flagons (a large container for your beer or ale). They have preserved the chair he sat in. We saw Hadrian's Wall and Vindolanda, a Roman community and museum. We learned about the Vikings and the Norwegian influence on the area. Visited Edinburgh and its castle. Had a tour by a local guide

who once was homeless on the streets. There is a program that trains the homeless to give tours and thus become self-sufficient.

It was an amazing enterprise and our guide told stories of the city you might not get with other guides. The organization is called Organization's Invisible Cities. We also enjoyed a lovely Scottish dinner with haggis by a local Edinburgh lady, who happened to be a chef. Every OATs tour has you spend an evening with a local for dinner. They are always wonderful, delightful and fun. In Kirkwall, the capital of the Orkney Islands we learned to make a local bread called bannocks. We also learned about The 'Kirkwall Ba Game' is a traditional game of football (soccer), played on Christmas and New Years day, in the streets of Kirkwall, by two teams the 'Uppies' and the 'Doonies.

Other sites include Skara Brae. WWII museums, rings of Stones. Isle of Skye, Culloden, the Cotswell, the Johnnie Walker distillery, Inverness and the river Ness, London, Oxford, and Cambridge. I could probably tell you stories from each of them, but that might make a book. Our post trip Guide made us a video that sums up our trip. I hope it still will work.



The presidential library system consists of 15 libraries and museums dedicated to preserving documents and artifacts from each of our presidents dating back to Herbert Hoover. They operate under the guidance of the National Archives and the Presidential Libraries Act of 1955. While all the libraries have similarities, each is unique. Some are on university campuses, some at their boyhood homes and some are located where they chose to spend their retirement years.

When Tim and I traveled to Texas in April as part of the Texas Eclipse Caravan, post eclipse activities included a visit to the LBJ Library and Museum in Austin. As with any good tour you exit through the gift shop. It was there I discovered the Presidential Library Passport. Unit 30 Technical Discussions Via WhatsApp

How to Adjust the Opening and Closing Latch Tension for the Glass Window in the Airstream.

- 1- Using a 1/2" open end wrench, break the nut loose and spin it a few turns towards the frame (where the screen is) along that bolt.
- 2- Move the flat latch piece backwards along the bolt against the nut in the back (the one you just moved).
- 3- Tighten the front nut along that bolt so it squeezes the latch again between the two nuts.
- 4- You may have to do this step a couple of times a few millimeters at the time until you are satisfied with the tension on the latch.

PICADILLO (Spanish Sloppy Joe's)

¼ cup oil¼ lb. ground ham1 onion¾ cup capers & olives

1 green pepper 1 tsp. salt
1 clove garlic 1/8 tsp. pepper
½ lb. ground beef ½ cup tomato sauce
1/2 lb. ground pork ¼ cup dry wine

Heat oil and sauté minced onion crushed garlic and minced green pepper.

Add the meat and cook for a few minutes, stirring constantly to avoid sticking.

Add the remaining ingredients and cook over medium heat for approximately 35 minutes.

Serve on a hamburger bun or over rice.



THE SECRET BEHIND THE MAGIC OF OUR RALLIES

South Florida Airstream Club Planning Guidelines January 21, 2023

PLANNING TEAM:

The planning team will consist of the President, 1st VP, 2nd VP and Past President. This team will plan the master calendar dates keeping in mind that we want to extend each rally through the weekend to encourage attendance by members who may still be working. This team will identify the region of Florida that will be targeted for each of the rallies. This team will identify areas for future rallies within a **2 year time frame**. This team will solicit new camping venues from the members.

LOGISTICS TEAM:

The Logistics Team will consist of the 1st VP, the 2 one year Trustees, and 2 club members from different families. This team will develop the schedule for each rally. This will include the day, time of day for each activity and will also include free time. The schedule may be adjusted as the Action Teams share their suggestions.

One or more members of this team will visit the campground to assess arrival information or campground information that must be shared with the members. This team will work with the Communications Team (Fun Times, Facebook, Website) to create enthusiasm and to promote attendance at the rallies.

The Logistics Team will contact individual members to be in charge of one small activity at the rally. The objective is to involve members in a variety of activities at future rallies. This team will provide the Action Team with specific written job descriptions. This team will work with the Member Outreach Team to recognize new members and invite them to share their interests with the club members at some time during this rally.

ACTION TEAM:

One member (family unit) will be responsible for one small activity during a rally. The person organizing an activity may ask other members to help if needed. The idea is to have many others helping. This team will be provided a specific written job description.

MEMBER OUTREACH TEAM:

Team leader chooses 2 additional members for the team. Here are some of the important activities of this team.

- Contacts new members
- Phone call/email welcome to new members
- Introduces new attendees at the rally
- Recognizes birthdays and anniversaries through a phone call and at the next rally.
- Informs new members of Facebook page and privileges

COMMUNICATIONS TEAM

- Fun Times Editor email newsletter to all members
- Directory Editor keeps the membership list updated and sends a directory to new members.
- Facebook Administrator (chooses 2 members as manager assistants) to keep page updated with club information, monitors posts and enters new members to our page. Will keep the WBAC website up to date with club activities.
