Region 1 Newsletter

In case you were wondering, Airstream Club International Clubs and Units are organized in 12 geographic Regions. Each Region provides overall leadership and guidance to the Local Club through elected Region Officers. Region Officers also represent their Local Clubs and Units on the International Board, serving on the International Board of Trustees.

Region 1 includes the five New England States and the Canadian Atlantic provinces.

NEMAC 2024 Retrospect

As the Executive Board is working on plans for the coming camping season, let's look back on the 2024 season. There were 7 NEMAC events, with 2 in New Hampshire, 2 in Vermont, and one each in Maine, Massachusetts, and New York. Five events were "dry" camping – no electric or water hookups – taking advantage of our Airstreams' self-sufficiency, to enjoy interesting or unique locations: we camped at an oceanfront site near Freeport ME in early June and a week later at the foot of spectacular Mt Washington in the cog railway parking area.



23 Mountaineers enjoyed a pleasant lunch at T-Bones Great American Eatery in Concord NH on October 19th The event included the installation ceremonies for our elected officers, and a 'thank-you for your service' for our retiring president, Tim Vadney. We also had two "dry" rallies in beautiful state parks in July and August: Crown Point State Campground in NY, and Quechee State Campground in VT. The fifth dry event was the Brandon VT Downtown Takeover at the end of September – a unique and very successful rally. We also had two late-season rallies at

campgrounds with water and electric hookups, one in the Connecticut Lakes region of northern New Hampshire and the other at Mt Greylock Park in northwestern Massachusetts.

We also provided members an opportunity to share their own plans with other interested Mountaineers. This was a closed email group – the information was shared only between the 21 members who asked to participate. You'll see below the sites shared in 2024.

We will offer the TripShare option for 2025 – watch for the sign-up email in December.

And what about 2025?

Will NEMAC be sponsoring the events and rallies that you want to join? We're trying to get a head start on planning them, so it's not too early to speak up. How do you feel about dry/boondock camping – are you more or less likely to participate if there are no hook-ups? Ideas are percolating – help make sure we know what you want!
