**Registration for this rally opens at 9 a.m. on January 1, 2025.** At that time, you may access the Jotform registration page via the Club's webpage:

Attendees are chosen on a first-come, first serve basis based on the time the completed Jotform is sent to the registrar. After completing and sending the Jotform, wait for an email from the registrar confirming that you are registered for the rally, and the amount you owe. At that point, you may either pay for the rally via Zelle to the NorCal Airstream Club (initiate through Zelle App or bank app if your bank participates) or send a check for the full amount directly to the registrar. Zelle is preferred.

If you pay by check, make your checks payable to "WBCCI/NorCal" and mail directly to Vicky Bartelt, 1111 Olive Hill Ln, Napa, CA 94558. If you want to pay via Zelle but do not know how or if your bank participates, check out: https://www.zellepay.com/.


If you do not hear back from the registrar on the day you register, contact her within 48 hours via: wbccinorcal.registrar@gmail.com. If you are placed on the waitlist, do not pay until you hear from the registrar that you are confirmed for the rally. She will let you know your status via email. Your registration is incomplete and not fully confirmed until we receive BOTH your registration and payment. Typically, Zelle payments will confirm your registration quicker than sending in a check. Do not wait until the last minute to pay or you may not have a site regardless of when you initially apply. If using Zelle, make sure to add your name, rally location, and how you accessed Zelle in the "memo" or "message" area before sending payment. If you need to contact the Registar for any reason during the first week of the month, for best results please do so ONLY via text or email.

Refund Policy: The park has a 48 hour cancellation policy. However, if you cancel and there is someone on the wait list to take your spot within the 48 hour period, a refund for the site will be issued. Deadline for cancelling meals is two weeks prior to the start of the rally, that is February 18, 2024. After that date, meal payments will not be refunded. Contact the registrar to cancel meals or if you have ANY changes to your registration or wish to register deadline. Best after the to email at: wbccinorcal.registrar@gmail.com. She will contact you as soon as she can. Under no circumstances are members to contact the RV Park with changes or cancellations.

The Park's Pet Policy is as follows: ""They are friendly, they won't bite," Is not part of our Ranch policy; Clean up the Poo folks. There are bags available at the Poo Pen and the office; Take an extra to have on hand; No Pitbulls, Fighting or Aggressive Breeds. (sorry, those are the rules.); Absolutely no pets in the pool area; and barking dogs left in camper alone are grounds for ejection." Please adhere to this policy. Finally, If you are ill or not feeling well, please stay home and get better. Thank you for your courtesy in this regard.

# April 2025 Rally Vibin' at the V6 Ranch April 2 - 4 2025 We need your Help!

The April NorCal Rally is scheduled to be held at the 20-acre V6 Ranch located in the middle of the Cholame Valley on April 2 - 6, 2025.



The Varian Family that owns the V6 Ranch has built a lovely and magical western-style campsite in a beautiful grove of Blue Oaks amidst the rolling hills that includes: 4 bathrooms, 4 showers, a large gathering room/open barn, a kitchen with 2 refrigerators, sink and storage room, a water station, and plenty of outdoor tables in a central gathering area (including a fire pit and a BBQ pit) that is lit up at night via Edison string lights.



What it does <u>not</u> have is any sewer or electric service to the RVs, so it is a boondocking experience. However, those with generators or solar will be fine, and with the external bathrooms, use of your gray tanks and sewer facilities can be limited.

The campsite's location is wonderful, but what in part makes it so wonderful is its isolation as you are on a working Western Ranch but with upgraded amenities. Within 5 miles is the "town" of Parkfield, consisting primarily of a restaurant (that is very good) and a hotel. Many a wrangler has easily ventured from the campsite to the restaurant for lunch on bikes or via truck. I-41 is about a 20 minute drive from the campsite and there are a few establishments there, but the closest town, Paso Robles, is about 30-45 minutes farther down the freeway. Consequently, we are envisioning this rally being low key and self-contained, with hiking, biking, sitting, visiting, relaxing, hanging out, playing games and cards, reading, and similar activities being the name of the game. We are in the planning process for rally activities so any suggestions are encouraged.

Unfortunately, there is a cattle drive that weekend so all their horses will be otherwise occupied and unavailable for trail rides. On the plus side, we should have good weather, with temps about 71 for the high and 40 for the low. Average rainfall that time of year is close to 0, so it should be clear and dry before and during our rally.

The rally is four nights only: arrive on Wednesday afternoon and leave on Sunday before noon, at a set price of \$300 per trailer. We will probably have three catered dinners by the Ranch, at different price points,that will total roughly \$110 per person, or more if we throw in a breakfast or two. The final food offerings are still under discussion however.

The help? We need at least 20 trailers to participate in the rally or it cannot go forward. Thursday morning, the group journeyed across the bay to the beautiful Filoli Estate in Woodside. We enjoyed an informative talk before exploring the "house" and its superb gardens. Others explored the museums and grounds of the Stanford campus and took a peek at the Golden Spike, which ties back to Niles being the terminus of the Trans Continental Railway.

Saturday evening, the hosts put on a "home-cooked" German dinner, featuring Kasekrainer and Bratwurst sausages, sauerkraut, potato salad, cabbage salad, and special cupcakes for dessert. All items were either vegan or had a vegan version.

Preheat oven to 350

- cup butter
- cup sugar
- 1 cup brown sugar, firmly packed
  - egg

1

- 1 cup vegetable oil
- 1 cup rolled oats - regular
- cup crushed cornflakes 1
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cup shredded coconut
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cup chopped pecans
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cups all-purpose 3 flour
- tsb baking soda 1
  - tsp salt
- tsp vanilla extract 1

Cream together butter and sugars until light and fluffy; add egg, mixing well, then oil, mixing well, then flour, baking soda, and salt. Add remaining ingredients and mix well. Form into balls the size of walnuts. Place on ungreased cookie sheet. Flatten with fork tines dipped in water. Bake 12 minutes. Allow to cool on cookie sheet for a few minutes before removal.



**Place Cookie** 

Preheat oven to 350 Place racks in the upper and lower third of the oven

1 cup peanut butter

1 cup sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla extract 1 large egg, lightly beaten Coarse sea salt, for sprinkling

In a medium bowl, mix peanut butter, sugar, vanilla, and egg until well combined. Spoon 1 Tablespoon of the mixture about 1 inch apart onto 2 ungreased cookie sheets.

Flatten the mounds with fork tines, making a crosshatch pattern on the cookies. Sprinkle course salt on top of the cookies.

Place a sheet on each oven rack

Bake until golden around the edges, about 10 minutes, switching the sheets halfway through baking.

Transfer cookies to racks to cool. Repeat with remaining dough.


