Recipe Round Up ~ Baked Brie with Cranberries and Pecans

For an easy and crowd-pleasing holiday recipe, this is simple to prepare, looks impressive, and is always a hit at gatherings.

Ingredients:

- * 1 wheel of Brie cheese
- * 1/2 cup dried cranberries
- * 1/2 cup chopped pecans
- * 1/4 cup honey
- * 1 tablespoon fresh rosemary, chopped (optional)
- * Crackers or sliced baguette for serving



Instructions:

1. Preheat the Oven:
Preheat your oven to 350°F
2. Prepare the Brie:
Place Brie on a baking sheet lined with parchment paper.
Score top of Brie in a crisscross pattern with a sharp knife.
3. Add Toppings:
Sprinkle the dried cranberries and chopped pecans over top of Brie.
Drizzle with honey and sprinkle with fresh rosemary if using.
4. Bake:
Bake in preheated oven for 10-15 mins, or until Brie is soft and gooey.

2025 Region 5 Rally A Racing Good Time!

ACI Region 5 announces the opening of sign-ups for our 2025 Region Rally to be held in Indianapolis, Indiana from May 8th to May 14, 2025. (6 days!)

This Rally will highlight much of the best that Indianapolis has to offer, including a day of racing at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway for the IndyCar Sonsio Grand Prix, visits to downtown Indianapolis and the town of Speedway, fun themed dinners and much more.

Our Rally Site will be the beautiful Fitness Farm located 10 minutes from downtown Indianapolis on West 44th Street in the Wynnedale neighborhood. Here's the link to the Fitness Farm: <http://fitnessfarm.org/>

Rally Pricing: *There will be two pricing options for camping at The Fitness Farm.*

- ⇒ \$315 including 30-amp generator power for 1 rig with 1 person.
- ⇒ \$215 for boondocking (personal generators ok) for 1 rig with 1 person.
- ⇒ \$35 for each additional person.
- ⇒ \$35 for children 6 to 17 years old, under 5 years old free.

Water and sewer hookups are not available. Bring your freshwater tank full and your holding tanks empty! 30-amp power will be supplied by a commercial generator.

Potable water and black tank pump outs will be available. There will be a charge for pump outs – pricing being negotiated now.

Because only 44 electric sites and 56 boondocking sites will be available, these sites are being offered to Region 5 members first until November 17, 2024. After that date, Rally sites will be offered to other ACI members. Please register as soon as you can!

We will keep a waiting list for both electric and boondocking sites if your choice is not available.

Looking forward to seeing you in Indianapolis in 2025 for A Racing Good Time!

Member Highlight ~

Ironman Barry Boyer

Barry started doing Ironman races in 2013. A full Ironman race consists of 2.4 mile swim, 112 mile bike and 26.2 mile run - a full marathon. Barry's first full Ironman was in Louisville in August 2013. At that time, when he signed up, we were both already marathoners and we had just started biking for fun. Neither of us were swimmers. Ironman Louisville swim is in the Ohio river and can be quite challenging. I thought he was out of his mind!

Barry trained for almost a year and I did a lot of training with him. We both took masters swim programs to learn how to properly swim.

The day of his first race, I worried he might die! After tracking him all day, running around to various viewing points to cheer for him, seeing some frightening bike wrecks and experiencing the amazing energy of the crowd, he survived, and I caught the bug and signed up for my first Ironman the next year!

We both did Ironman Wisconsin in 2014 (I was the last official finisher that year lol). After that, we were hooked. We did countless half distance Ironman races, and Barry started to think about how to get to the Ironman world championship in Kona Hawaii.

Each Ironman branded race offers 1-3 qualifiers per age group for men and women and as you can imagine it's very competitive. The more races we did, the more he wanted to get into the legacy program where people can automatically be in a lottery to participate without a qualifying top finisher time if they have completed 12 Ironman races. I completed 3 full races, and continued to do half distance races. Barry kept going. And, except for 2020, has done at least one full race every year since 2013.

Ironman Florida on November 2 was his 12th. At the end of November he will apply for the legacy program and is hoping to get into the 2027 world championship in Kona. In the meantime he has to do one more full race to maintain his status.

It's a full time job to take care of and track an athlete. Training is basically year round and especially intense for 6 months prior to race day. You have to prioritize training over travel, parties, etc. to keep yourself in top shape. And we aren't getting any younger! But the benefits are many, including feeling

younger despite your age and achieving something only a very few ever dream of. Throughout our Ironman journey, we have also met amazing people that became great friends too.

As a former racer and marathoner, I'm so proud of all he has achieved and looking forward to our big payoff trip to Hawaii!
