Maintenance Minute

An often overlooked maintenance item is tire pressure, both on your rig and tow vehicle (TV). While I will not be discussing TV tire pressure, it worth making sure you are in compliance with your vehicle's guidelines.

So let's talk about Airstream tire pressure. There are really two schools of thought here. One is the max operating pressure of the tires themselves. Many people feel this is the one sure-fire way to make sure your tires have the air pressure they need. The second, is minimizing air pressure to improve ride quality.

Most tires coming out of the factory have been Goodyear Endurance tires. For the 225/75 R15 tires, Goodyear recommend a max tire pressure of 80 PSI. At 80 PSI, the tire is rated for 2,830 pounds. If you have 4 tires (2 axles) that would give a total capacity of 11,320 lbs. Most Airstreams do not weigh this much. Our 25 foot International has a gross vehicle weight of 7,300 pounds. Based on the below chart, we could run our tires at just over 50 PSI (7,300 lbs / 4 tires = 1,825 pounds per tire).

So what is a person to do on tire pressure? It is really best to look at the two competing factors mentioned earlier, factor of safety (running tires at maximum tire pressure) and ride quality minimum (running tires are tire pressure). The lower the tire pressure yields a softer ride for your Airstream. A softer ride means fewer popped rivets and less mess when you open your door after a road trip.



For us, we run our tires with both factors in mind. After some trials and testing (using the TPMS), we found that running at 65 PSI (at 80 F) is best. There are a couple reasons why we find this to be optimal inflation. When it gets colder, our pressure can drop 7-8 PSI and when it gets warmer it can rise 4-5 PSI. By running at 65 PSI, we are always in the safe operating range with our tires.

We also have found that our rig rides really well at 65 PSI in terms of ride. The lower pressure (vs 80 PSI) means the tires absorb some of the bumps in the road instead of the rig frame. At the same time, we are still well above the minimum pressure based on our gross vehicle weight and tire load rating.

There is no right or wrong answer to the question of tire pressure unless you are out of the safety range. The important thing is you know your tire pressure and that you regularly take tire pressure readings and know how to be safe.

Product Review

It seems we are always on the lookout for a better camp chair. In fact, we have a closet full of chairs that were not exactly the comfort and convenience we liked. After all, a comfortable chair can make sitting around the campfire a wonderful experience or a back breaking one.

We have tried the cheap (Walmart for \$15) to a more expensive Rtic brand (\$100+). We even did a test drive in the Yeti chair (very nice, but a little pricey for our taste for a chair that can catch a runaway ember and burn up). What we landed on was essentially a his and hers combination of chairs. Hawley has the GCI Outdoor Kickback Rocker Chair.





This chair is a little shorter than the normal "one-size fits all" chair and has the rocker feature of other GCI chairs.

Doug likes the bigger GCI Outdoor Roadtrip Rocker.



It is a little more "robust" for a bigger person and has a mesh back that is really nice during warm weather.

Both chairs fold up in a cylinder shape and store nicely in the back of the truck. They are lightweight yet heavy-duty enough to withstand the abuse of a regularly used camp chair. The price is acceptable for a chair you know will likely wear out at some point. Amazon has them \$10-15 off the list price on occasion.

Doug also really likes the GCI Freedom Rocker XL. This chair is a bit bigger (wider) and heavier duty. However, is just does not fold up in a way that makes it easy to throw in the back of the truck.

So far these chairs have held up very well with 5-6 trips of abuse. We recommend them for comfort, convenience and portability.
