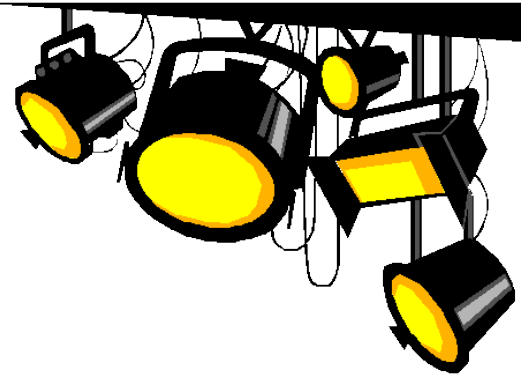

Ben and Dana Hext, BRN 31597

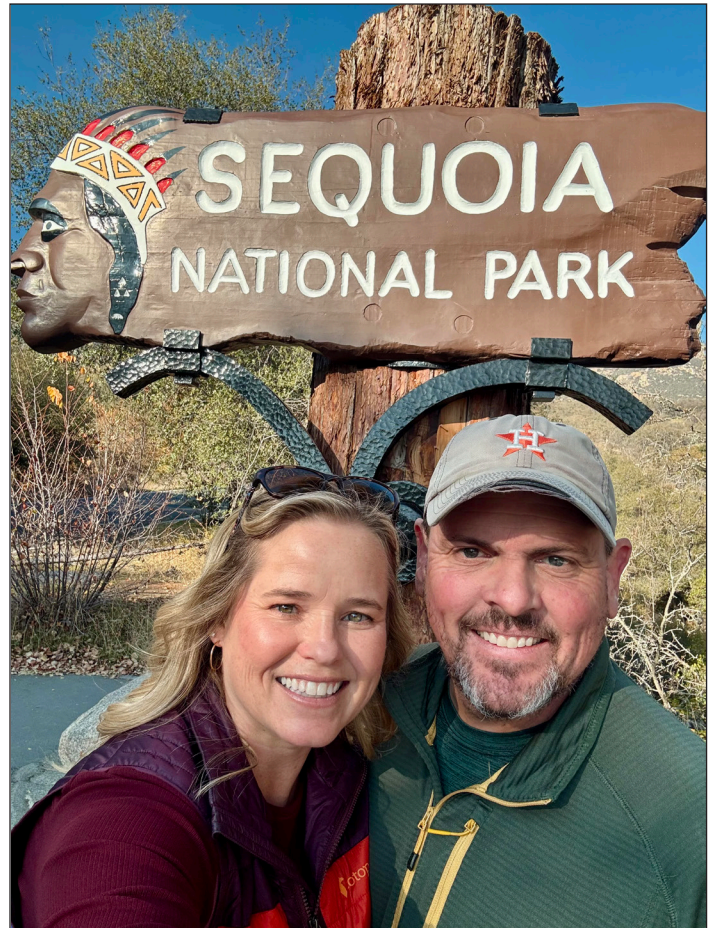

Editor David's Airstream Club Primer

January 2025 : Governance

Did you see the email from NTxAC Leadership with the subject line IBT Meeting and Study Session? Are you wondering what the heck that means? Has the title of this month's column put you off already? This club is about friends and fun and travel and adventure ... but ... governance? Yawn!

Well, let me tell you, this is a large and growing club, and it doesn't run itself. If you're a new member who has taken advantage of some club benefits—joined a rally or caravan, courtesy parked, gotten a discount—then you've seen the results of club leadership and governance. This organization doesn't run on autopilot ya' know. So, if you're still with me, let's learn where we can find out more about how the ACI is governed.

Think of it as a resource for potential leaders as well.

There's a lot to discover here—many links—so I won't go through it all. But let me direct your attention to the section headings on this page. This will give you a flavor for the gold-mine of information you can explore.

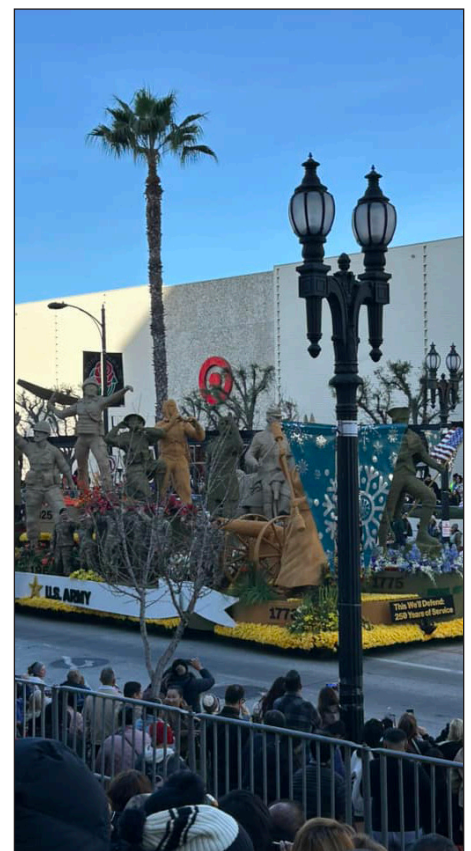
