#### FROM YOUR PRESIDENT:






How many miles from your home are you willing to travel for a Local Club rally?

What length (duration) of rally interests you more?








What do you think prevents members from participating in rallies or luncheons?

How many years have you been in the club?



#### FROM YOUR 1ST AND 2ND VICE PRESIDENTS

Paradise Park Florida

A few years ago, Joel and I were heading down a country road in Charlotte county Florida. We were looking for the sandy dirt road that would take us to our Hip Camp campsite. We had originally planned on staying the night in the parking lot at the Ft. Myers Cracker Barrel but it was too hot that day. The heated asphalt of the parking lot made the camper feel like an oven. We couldn't even safely walk the dogs. So, we got on the Hip Camp app and found something close by. Even though this campsite was located inside a fenced longhorn steer pasture, it had an electric hook up.





Slowing down on this country road to look for our turn, we drove past this "old timey" R.V. park that was full of

Airstreams, both vintage and new, all sitting next to colorfully decorated Florida rooms. We both thought, what is this place? We need to find out how we can stay there! The following year we rented a site in Paradise Park that included a shed with a washer/ dryer/refrigerator, but no cute and colorful Florida room.

This is what we found out about the park.... It's a 55+ land owned condominium community. I was told it was created some time in the 1970's by the land owner and his Airstream club friends. The original owner had orange groves here, but when the trees died, instead of replanting, he built the Airstream travel trailer park and sold the

Airstream only park. It now allows class A motorhomes as well. One story I was told is that someone toured the park to consider buying a lot, saw some Class A Airstreams (he had a class A motorhome) and he bought a lot. When he showed up in a non- Airstream camper and was told no, this is an Airstream only park. He went to court and he won. (I heard a few variations of this story so I'm not sure this is accurate, but it's close).

I was able to find some park bylaws on the internet that called the park an all Airstream park, and these were dated 1995. So, I'm guessing the addition of the motorhomes happened sometime after 1995. Today it's probably half motorhomes, half Airstreams. Some people here say the park may not have survived without allowing the motorhomes in, as there was a decline in Airstream ownership in the park.

This is our second year renting here, without a Florida room, which is something we need because of our two dogs always being underfoot in the camper. Because of this we have decided to buy a site here with the extra room. Although this is not a public R.V. park, visitors of owners are welcome as a guest of property owners on a short-term basis. There is a sec-



tion of the park with water and electric hook ups, dump station. There are twelve sites. So, if you're interested in visiting the Punta Gorda / Ft. Myers area, and want to check out the park, you are invited - give me a call.

Some of the things we are enjoying in the area:

- Florida Everblades hockey games. There is a restaurant

(heated) above the rink so we go early and make a whole night of it.

- Punta Gorda Visual Arts classes, this year Joel and his brother Chuck are taking a silver and copper jewelry class. I'm taking a water color painting class.
- The Ringling Circus Museum and the John and Mable Ringling Museum of Art.
- Arts festivals almost every week end (from Naples to Sarasota)
- Labelle Swamp Cabbage Festival (turns out swamp cabbage is hearts of palm)
  - South West Florida Agriculture Fair and Carnival.
  - Shark tooth and fossil hunting. (Casperson beach in Venice Florida is full of shark teeth and is also dog friendly)
  - Golfing. (there is a 9-hole course here at the park)
  - Arcadia Florida hosts an All-Florida Championship Rodeo.
  - Babcock Ranch Farmers Market. (this is a solar powered neighborhood/town built on what was once the hunting

grounds turned cattle ranch of 1918 Pittsburgh mayor Edward Babcock).

We often take our bikes here to ride the trails they have. There is also a really fun eco tour near here, on the preserved area. I haven't seen a Florida panther on the tour yet, but lots of birds, alligators, and wild pigs!

- Great seafood restaurants! One of our favorites in Peace River Seafood and Botanicals.

The six indoor tables are in an old (small) cottage. The rest of the seating in outside on the deck or in the large yard on picnic tables beside a pond. The best place for picking crabs!

- Thrifting in Naples is awesome. I have a friend that calls one of the thrift stores the Neiman Marcus thrift shop.
- National Shell Museum & Aquarium on Sanibel Island.

COMMITTEE: Tours & Sightseeing

COMMITTEE #: 270

RALLY TEAM LIAISON: Sherrye McCabe

#### RESPONSIBILITIES:

This position is responsible for:

- Coordinating professional bus tours to take place 1-2 days prior to the first day of Rally.
- Set up guidelines for minimum number of participants, payments, tour schedules, tour pick-up location, etc.
- Maintain good records of tour participants, how much they have paid and what tour they are attending. Rally Planning team can assist with JotForms for registration purposes.

#### SCHEDULE:

#### Prior to Rally:

- Contact the chamber of commerce or visitor bureau of rally location and obtain a list of professional tour operators.
- Contact tour operators and review their day tour offerings (sites visited, costs/person, tour popularity, etc.) Obtain references if possible.
- Evaluate tour operators and choose one to work with.
- Work with Rally Planning Team to determine number of tours to be offered and tour schedule.
   Tours should be completed prior to opening ceremony of Rally.
- Work with Rally Planning Team on tour payments:
  - Confirm with tour operator if deposits are required, their payment process, if members can pay the tour operator directly, etc.
  - If ACI is collecting payments, determine payment process online registration is preferred. Rally Planning Team can assist with JotForms and credit card payments.
- Create an article for the Blue Beret describing the tours.
- · Compile a list of local attractions or day trips in the area that members may want to explore.
- Provide updated information for posting on Rally website and social media as tours develop or changes occur.
- Time commitment varies.

#### At Rally:

- If ACI is collecting fees, obtain checks from Cashier for tour company and ensure payment is delivered.
- Meet the tour director at the bus each day and verify tour attendees. See the tours off.
- Provide a short tour evaluation to attendees so we can use their feedback for future tour planning.
- Provide a final accounting to the Rally Planning Team of monies collected and paid for tours.

Time commitment varies.

RALLY TEAM LIAISON: Sherrye McCabe

#### RESPONSIBILITIES:

This position is responsible for:

- Identifying organizations in the city where the rally is to be held that would benefit from donations (monetary, pop tabs, goods, etc.) and services that the club can provide during rally.
- 2. Organize activities during rally to fundraise and provide support for the organizations identified.
- 3. Maintain good records of donations and provide reporting.
- Write articles and updates to promote and recap community service projects.

#### SCHEDULE:

#### Prior to Rally:

- Research local organizations and select organizations that the club will support during rally.
- Act as liaison between local organizations and the club.
- Post articles in the Blue Beret to announce the community service projects and engage membership. Articles are due 2 months in advance of the publication date.
- Work with Rally Planning Team to designate an area for donations.
- Recruit volunteers to assist with donation collection at rally.


#### At Rally:

- Set up and work a table at Welcome with information about the community service projects and an area to receive donations (including aluminum tabs).
- Provide daily updates to Rally Planning Team about items collected, goals, announcements, etc.
   to be published in the daily rundown communications to rally attendees.
- Process aluminum tabs through magnetic sorter. Once sorted, place tabs in boxes weighing up to 20 lbs. Seal with tape and contact designated charity to pick up the boxes. Inform the Youth Chair of the amount received for the tabs. (Coins that are recovered from the sorting are forwarded to Common Cents for Kids. Other items of value found among the tabs are turned in to Youth Chair for identification and dissemination.)
- Bag/box other items donated and coordinate pick-up/delivery to the designated charity.
- Provide Master of Ceremonies with community service project announcements (# of items collected, charities receiving items, money raised, etc.)
- Arrange for local representatives to attend the Closing Ceremony and speak briefly about the charitable organization and to receive the donation check (if applicable).

#### After Rally:

Write an article for the Blue Beret recapping the community service projects.
