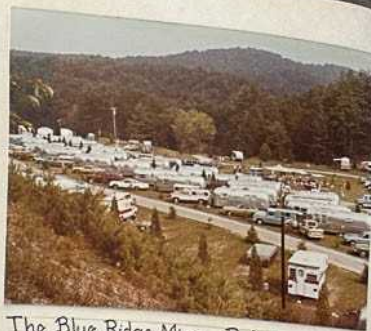

# MEET THE ASSOCIATE STAFF



Being a senior at North Carolina State University, and having been subjected to a number of job interviews this semester, I have been consistently asked to explain exactly "What is Triangle Youth for Christ and its Campus Life Ministry?" During the past four years I have had the privilege of working Campus Life at Millbrook High School and the ministry has become so much a part of my life that I am not at all sure I can accurately explain its many facets. Yet, I am absolutely convinced that Campus Life is not just "another" youth ministry, for our focus is on a special group of people at a very unique period in their lives.

During these last four years I have witnessed God honoring this goal and believe me, there is nothing as exciting as seeing God perform miracles in the lives of young people!
