## **Blazing Airstreams Rally**

Boulder Creek RV Park Lone Pine June 3-7, 2020

Please come and join us for a rootin' tootin' good time in Lone Pine. We have a fun rally planned in the heart of Alabama Hills, which was Hollywood's go-to location for great Cowboy films.

Want scenery? Many believe the Owens Valley is the most scenic mountain valley in the world. Try the drive to the Whitney Portal; it was featured in the Lucille Ball Classic movie "The Long, Long Trailer." (Hint, leave your trailer at the rally site, you will enjoy the scenery more.) Care to see some of the oldest rocks in California? Try Convict Lake where 200 million year old rocks, amongst the oldest in California, lie high atop the recent and still rising Sierra Nevada mountain range. Just to the east is the White Mountain range where Methusela resides. It is a bristlecone pine and the oldest nonclonal organism on earth.

Like extremes? Nearby Mt. Whitney at 14,500+ is just 85 miles from lowest point, -282', on the North America continent in Death Valley. Interested in volcanism? The Long Valley Caldera is the site of one of the largest explosive caldera eruption in world history. It spewed pyroclastics as large as houses over 100 miles, some have been

covered with petroglyphs. Recent earthquake swarms, volcanic domes and craters are evidence there is still an active magma chamber close to the surface here. There is a lot to see from earthquake fault lines to the tufa formations at Mono Lake.

A film fan? The Alabama Hills are filled with yesteryear film information of the early westerns



(think Tom Mix and Hopalong Cassidy and the singing cowboys Gene Autry and Roy Rodgers), the classic westerns by John Wayne, up to and including modern westerns and space thrillers.

Are people more your thing? There is a Shoshone Indian Reservation close by as well as the historic courthouse in nearby Independence. Laws Railroad Museum in Bishop has steam engines and rolling stock dating from the narrow gage railroads of the logging and mining era.



We will be visiting Manzanar, the World War 2 Japanese internment camp. Information will be provided on other excursions so



you may enjoy the ones you prefer on your own.

Our planned activities include: a Wednesday welcome dinner of Elain's world famous Potato Soup with Sheepherders bread from Schat's Bakery in Bishop.
Saturday there will be a Chili Cook off, a long time Nor Cal tradition, so bring your "fave" recipe to cook and share for the evening dinner. We will supply the salad, bread, and dessert. Prizes will be awarded.

John will be putting together presentations on repairing refrigerator drain hoses, something with which Dometic and Airstream have favored us all (it is only a question of time), and replacing fluorescent lights with LED strings.

Let's dress the part. Bring your favorite Cowboy hat and gear. We will judge and prizes will be awarded.


