If you have renewed your membership, congratulations and welcome back! If you have not renewed your membership, please do so. It's easy! Go to <https://airstreamclub.org/renew>. Dues for International Membership are \$75 + \$5 for NorCal Club dues. If you do not know or recall, check with Marget Williams at norcalmembership@comcast.net. **NOTICE: This will be your last Poppy unless you renew by the end of January 2021.**

Lifetime members: you must go through the renewal process. This lets WBCCI Headquarters know that your Lifetime membership is still active and is in good standing with NorCal. If WBCCI does not receive your renewal as a Lifetime Member, you will not be renewed for 2021.

Complete Instructions for Ordering Personalized NorCal Airstream Club – Garden Flag – 12.5” x 18”

For new members or those unaware, the NorCal Airstream Club's Personalized Garden Flag is available directly from our vendor Flagology! Flagology has created a private link that does not appear anywhere on their website for our members to order a garden flag. Click here to order:

Once at their web site, note of any discount code pop-ups. The standard price for the flag is \$19.99 plus shipping, however discount codes are almost always available. Write down the discount code to use at time of checkout to apply discount.

Click the "Customize Now" button to start your order. Enter your personalization in the text editor on the left. You will see your personalized text appear on the flag to the right. Click the fonts button in text editor to view and select from available fonts.

When you are happy with the personalization, click the "love the design? Add to cart" button above the flag.



You will see a pop-up screen to confirm the personalization is exactly how you want it. If all is good, click the "YES my design is ready to fly" button.

Next you will see another pop-up screen to select your fabric. There are two options: Flagtastic and Flip-it. The Flagtastic fabric will have slightly more vibrant colors, however please note that the TEXT WILL APPEAR BACKWARDS ON THE BACK OF THE FLAG. The Flip-it fabric is \$5.00 more, but the personalization text will appear normal on both sides of the flag. Choose the fabric you prefer.

When you arrive at the shopping cart, enter your shipping preference (standard or priority) and remember to enter your discount code in the coupon box before proceeding to checkout. At checkout you can pay by credit card or PayPal. For any questions the NorCal Club contact is John Bibby (707) 592-4891. The Flagology contact is Connor Young (855) 347-4922.

Please remember the flag does not come with a garden flag stand. You can purchase a stand separately at almost any hardware store. John Bibby reports he purchased one from Lowe's for \$7.99 that is sturdy and breaks down for easy storage and transport. Many people hang them with clips from their rock guards or elsewhere on their trailer. Enterprising members have drilled holes into wood bases so that the flag stand will stand despite hard terrain.

Looking for Rally Hosts!

If Not You Then Who?

How would you like to host a party with other people's money? And be appreciated too. Then sign up to host a NorCal rally. You can do it! We need you.



NorCal is a popular Airstream Club in part because it has a rally almost monthly at different venues, typically with a wide variety of activities. This gives members a chance to enjoy their Airstreams almost all year round, and to visit with their Airstream friends that they otherwise would not see very often, if at all. But these rallies don't just happen. They are planned and executed by volunteers who (1) participate in and enjoy the rallies, (2) want to express their appreciation to those other members who make the rallies possible by stepping up and hosting one too, and (3) want to keep the different rallies going as a club amenity.

You see, for several reasons the Club cannot expect the same people to continually host rallies, nor does the Club want that. If there are no volunteer hosts for the rallies, they will be canceled, eventually leading solely to informal no-host flash rallies, which means everyone is on their own to reserve and pay for their own site (no more group rate), and do their own food and activities. This is fine for the occasional flash

rally, but is not healthy for the Club as a whole that strives to be inclusive rather than exclusive and provide a variety of experiences for all its Club members.

Most rallies are put on by co-hosts, so you will not be doing the whole thing by yourself. Tasks can be easily delegated. Secondly, there are plenty of people around you can contact for any input or assistance you might need and who would be delighted to do so, e.g. the Smithsons, Carole Echols, the Murrays, Jane Malone, the Davisons, the Christies, the Crutchfields, Pat Lazzereschi, the Bibbys, the Verdegaals, Carmen Ortiz, etc. Just ask! Third, numerous people in the Club have special talents that can be tapped to facilitate your rally, such as cooking, craft making, music making, or just great ideas.

The easiest way to start is to pick a theme. Once you have a theme, the rest falls into place with some planning.

(1) Figure out the basics of the rally you are co-hosting and the per person costs, e.g. what is the cost of the site per night (get this information from the rally chair); two meals are generally planned – the Welcome Dinner on Wednesday and the Saturday night Dinner, both of which can be anything – catered by a local restaurant or caterer, pot luck, cook-your-own, host BBQ, group products provided by Costco or Smart and Final, or something else. Be creative. Figure out what you want to do and estimate the cost per person/serving. Next decide if you want to offer any group activities (typically with a

group rate) and figure the per person cost associated with the activity(ies).

(2) Write a brief explanation of your rally and why you think people should attend. Provide your summary, the site cost per night, and the per person cost of any meals and activities to the Newsletter Editor two and a half months prior to the rally. This will allow for promotion of your rally and timely registration.

(3) Plan your rally: welcome bags, décor, dinners and activities, if any. Keep track of your expenses on a chart or spreadsheet, put all receipts in an envelope or file scanned to your computer to keep everything handy for when it comes time to submit your receipts for reimbursement. You will be reimbursed for any decorations, food, welcome bag items, door prizes, up front activity expenses and hospitality purchases after you submit your receipts.



(4) Execute and Enjoy. Take or have someone take photos of the event.

(5) Submit receipts and spreadsheet for reimbursement to Treasurer. Send article and photos about your rally to the Newsletter Editor. You are done!

Is it work? Yes, although the amount will depend on the size of the rally you choose. Some tend to be bigger than others. If you would rather start out with a smaller one, contact our Rally Chair for more information. I would say most of the work is in the planning. The more you plan, the better your rally will be.

Is it gratifying? Oh yes! Most people are very appreciative that you stepped up and in to host them. You will get to know more Club members. Plus, you can enjoy all the other rallies guilt free because you stepped up and volunteered to do your part to keep what sets NorCal apart from other Airstream Clubs. If enough people stepped up (after all we have well over 100

members), the same people would only co-host every couple of years.

NorCal has published a booklet that very helpfully and specifically sets forth what you need to do for a successful rally. (See below.) In summary, not only do you get to host a party with other people's money but you won't be alone in doing so (unless you want to be). So what are you waiting for?




UPDATE: This article was first published January 2020, before COVID. Since that time, our rallies

are dependent on the pandemic situation and the restrictions and safety protocols in place. NorCal has held hosted-rallies during the pandemic, in which the hosts provide information, goodie bags and suggestions for where to go in the area to eat or sightsee on an individual basis. There are no group meals, events or activities, which actually has made hosting easier.

At this writing it is unknown when we will be able to resume our regular rallies, but the Club does intend to hold rallies as planned, if they can be done safely, so the need for hosts still very much exists. If a rally is canceled, you will be reimbursed for any costs incurred prior to the cancellation. Please contact Rally Chair Pat Lazzereschi for more information and to sign up.

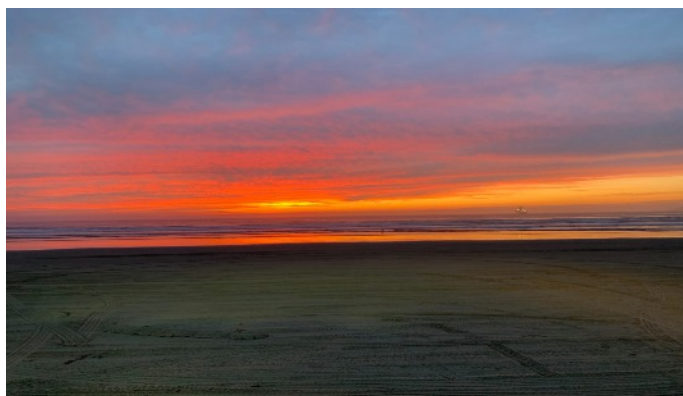

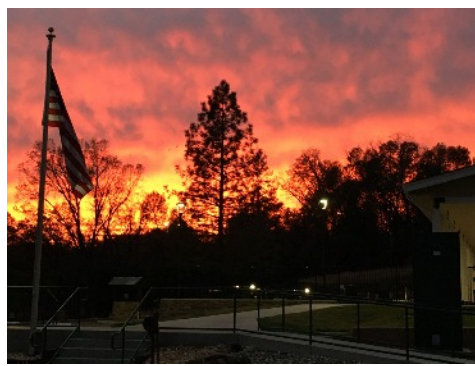

Cover's Apple Farm Where Ed Ungerman taste- tested pie



Carol Echols' Cranberry Cake

Note: full recipe makes 10-12 cups of batter, which is four (4-cup) loaves, between 24-30 cupcakes or one 10" spring form cake.

- 3 large eggs
- 2 cups granulated sugar
- 3/4 cup unsalted butter (1 1/2 sticks) cubed and softened
at room temp for 1 hour
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 teaspoon almond extract
- 2 cups all purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 2 1/2 cups fresh or frozen cranberries (12 oz)

Preheat oven to 350

Lightly grease a spring form pan, loaf pans or cupcake pans

Beat eggs and sugar with mixer until very smooth and increased in volume – it will turn a pale yellow, leaving ribbons on top of batter when you lift the beaters

TIP: (if using stand mixer, beat on medium speed for 6-7 minutes with whisk attachment; if using an electric hand mixer, beat on high for 6-8 minutes)

Beat in the butter, vanilla and almond extract - Beat for 2 minutes until the butter is smoothly incorporated

Using a spatula, fold in the flour salt, and cranberries – batter will be quite thick

Spread gently into prepared pans

Cook for 1 hour to 1 hour 20 minutes

Optional pecan topping:

- 1/4 cup (4 Tablespoons) unsalted butter
- 1/4 cup packed dark brown sugar
- 1 cup raw pecans

Melt butter in a large saute pan over medium heat.

Add the sugar and stir

Add the pecans and cook for 2 minutes, until the butter and sugar mixture is shiny and smooth and the nuts are well-coated.

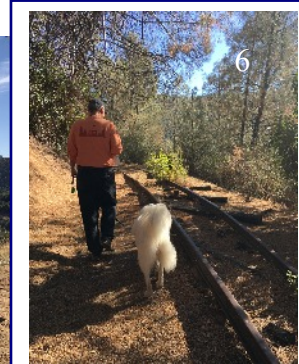
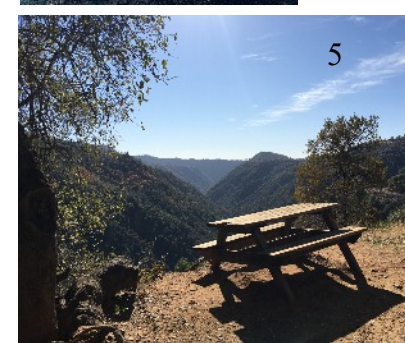
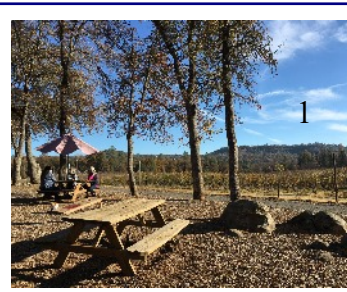
