New info shown in green. Dates are arrival and departure for planned rally, although you can often request early arrival or Monday departure. Sign-ups are accomplished by submitting a completed Registration Jotform and payment to the Club Registrar. If a rally is full, there is a wait list. "Buddy" events allow you to invite a nonmember even if they don't own an Airstream. Events lacking hosts or the minimum number of campers may be be cancelled.



# Clio's River's Edge Rally

# September 10-14, 2025

Hi all! We are getting ready for our 2025 rally year! Tary Salinger, our incoming president, has selected some amazing locations, one of them being Clio's River's Edge RV Resort. This is a beautiful location, in Eastern Plumas County on the Middle Fork of the Feather River, with lots of amenities in and around the park. Check out <a href="https://rvthelostsierra.com/">https://rvthelostsierra.com/</a> for more information on the park and its location.



The rally is scheduled for September 10-14, **2025**. Why are we promoting this rally so early? Clio's River's Edge is very popular during the Fall and does not take group reservations, so **members will need to make their own reservations exactly one year in advance of the day you plan to arrive** at the campground to assure you will get a spot. For example, if you plan to arrive on September 10, 2025, you will need to book your site on September 10, 2024, through Clio's website. If you plan to arrive earlier, you should book earlier, a year out from the planned date of your arrival. See the next page for site booking and rally registration information, which is very similar to how booking/registration for the Dumbarton Rally was handled. The cost of the site will vary depending on type and location.

This should be a great rally; it is being hosted by our esteemed "camp counselors," the Bartelts and Salingers, who brought you the recent low-keyed Costanoa rally.



There are a few campground rules to take note of: (1) Dog Rules: There is a maximum of 3 dogs per site. Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times and cannot be left unattended. Dogs that exhibit aggressive behavior are not allowed in the Park. Dog fees apply and are \$2/dog/day;(2) the Cancellation Policy: Cancellations and modifications are subject to a minimum \$15.00 processing fee. Cancellations within 72 hours of check-in are subject to a charge equal to one night's stay. No refunds after 1 pm on day of arrival, or for early departures, and (3) State fishing licences are required to fish in and around the RV park. They can be obtained in Graeagle. Other rules and FAQs are posted on Clio's website;

It has been a few years since NorCal rallied at Clio, so we are looking forward to returning. Hope you can join us.



# Booking & Registration Instructions for the September 10-14, *2025*Clio Rally

- 1. All attendees must make their own reservations beginning 1 year in advance of the day you plan to arrive at the campground. For example, if you plan to arrive to the rally on September 10, then you may make your reservation beginning September 10, 2024. If you plan to arrive earlier, then you can make your reservation on an earlier date as long as it is one year from your arrival date.
- 2. You must make your own reservation through the Clio website or call the office at 530-836-2375 during business hours. The direct link:

https://bookings13.rmscloud.com/Search/Index/12489/90/ or go to Clio's website and click on "Book Now" in the ribbon at the top of the page. If you reserve online, Clio recommends you use the most recent updated version of your browser. Follow the directions, fill out the form, and book your site. Site costs will vary depending on location.

- 3. **Once you have secured a site,** please click on the following jotform link and fill out Jotform #1: https://form.jotform.com/242246670249156. You will not receive the appropriate follow-up rally information if you fail to do so.
- 4. A second Jotform link from the camp counsellors will be sent out via email closer to the rally to all who have registered for the rally through Jotform link#1, with sign-up and payment information, if any, for whatever they have planned.
- 5. Check-in a the park is at 1 p.m.
- 6 **Cancellation policy:** See prior page. You will be responsible for your own cancellations and the fees attached. Refunds for other items will depend on whether funds have been spent by the hosts.
- 7. Dog Policy: See prior page.
- 8. Finally, if you are ill or not feeling well, please stay home and get better. Thank you for your courtesy in this regard.

# ACI Courtesy Parking Update

The Airstream Club has announced they are in the final countdown for the official launch of the merger with Harvest Hosts and ACI Courtesy Parking, where Harvest Hosts will provide the platform for booking overnight stays through AC!'s Courtesy Parking program. A new website is being developed

for ACI members to access ACI Courtesy Parking, replacing the current system. Even if you are not a current Harvest Hosts member, you will still have access to the **new** ACI Courtesy Parking website and the ability to view and request a stay at all host sites offered by ACI members on their property. Instructions for using the new website will be sent to you in September. If you wish to join HH, ACI



members can join for a discount of 50% for the first year of Harvest Hosts membership. Information is on the ACI website.

If you are a current Harvest Host member, you will need to confirm that your email for your Harvest Hosts membership is the same as your email for ACI to have the ACI courtesy parking icons show on the Harvest Host map. To check that your Harvest Hosts member email address matches your ACI email, log into your Harvest Hosts account. If the email addresses match, no further action is necessary. If not, you will need to access your account information either through "profile" on your mobile app, or "account name" on your desktop, and you can edit your personal information. If you have forgotten your ACI email address, you can log on to the ACI website and check under your "Membership Dashboard."



Two and a half weeks into the Texas Six-Shooter Caravan we were in Fredricksburg, roughly 70 miles north of San Antonio. Fredricksburg, the County seat of Gilliespie County, is in Texas Hill Country, a region in Central Texas known for its rolling hills, oak trees, ranching and agriculture. It was founded in 1846 by German immigrants and named after Prince Frederick of Prussia, a heritage evident even today. While San Sabo near Lampassas (site of our Eclipse Rally) is the "Pecan Capital of the World," Fredericksburg is the "Peach Capital of Texas." Unfortunately no peaches were evident in late April when we passed through, although we passed numerous empty peach stands. (Evidently May-August is the season.)

Nonetheless, there was plenty to see in the area and we were not able to see it all in the four and a half days we spent there. On most of our days, we were free to do as we wished. Main Street Fredericksburg, with its shops, historical district and buildings, restaurants and bakeries, biergartens, wine tasting rooms, and other attractions is a must visit.

But be aware that because everything is open on the weekends for all the visitors that pour in from urban Texas cities, many establishments are closed Monday and Tuesday, and possibly Wednesday as well. So crowds must be endured if you wish to see the sights.



Not to be missed is the National Museum of the Pacific War in downtown Fredricksburg, behind the Admiral Nimitz Museum. This is a comprehensive tour through the Pacific theatre battles of WWII. The docents give you the prelude of the War in the Pacific during 1941 that led to the bombing of Pearl Harbor on December 7th, then lead you to a room with a large scale model of a battleship where the bombing raid is recreated and the history of that day is told. From there, you embark on a trail that leads though

every battle theatre/island in the Pacific up to the dropping of the atomic bombs on Japan. The tour is sobering.

Fredericksburg is the boyhood home of Pacific Fleet Commander Admiral Chester Nimitz, for whom the Musuem is named, and why it is located in the middle of Texas. Make a reservation before you go.

Some other attractions we saw: the Texas Ranger Heritage Center operated by the Former Texas Ranger Association, Wildseed Farms, the nation's largest working wildflower farm that includes a market center, gift shops, coffee stand, wine tasting, biergarten, nursery and walking trails through acres of beautiful gardens and landscaping, the beautiful

the Johnson Ranch itself, which is still a working cattle ranch where you can drive through and see the before-his-time

ranching and farming practices of LBJ as well as the way the ranch looked when LBJ was President, the music venue of Luckenbach (below), established in 1849 as a trading post but made famous by Willie Nelson, which has a general store, historic dancehall, a bar, outdoor picnic areas and live music daily under 500 year old Live Oak trees.







the "Texas Cowboy Capital" of Banderas (due to its history as the staging area for Texas cattle drives, with its quaint western Main Street, shops and fun bars (yes, Ed got the T shirt), the town of Kerrville, located on the Guadalupe River and home to the 25-acre Coming to the King Sculpture Prayer Garden with multiple bronze statutes the artist was told by God to make, including the bronze cross that sits visible for miles on the hill above

the freeway, (where spiritual music plays from wireless speaker rocks), the town of Ingram with its Art Center and scale model of Stonehenge ("Stonehenge II") and two Easter Island (Moai) statutes, and of course wineries, wineries and more wineries since the area is known as "Texas Wine Country."

Know if you go that many of the wineries are not dog friendly, not even allowing tastings on the patio with your dog, which was somewhat frustrating to us who have a dog who could not be left in the trailer, or car, due to heat and anxiety. Also many wineries are not open on Mondays or Tuesdays so plan accordingly.

While in Fredricksburg, the Caravaners partook of more authentic Texas BBQ at a nearby restaurant, and our Leaders treated us to an evening of Texas Country music performed by a local band, Country Cactus, with a fiddler that at age 9 won the Texas State Youth Championship Fiddle Contest and later won the State Championship more than once. She was incredible and after a few tunes, our entire group was up and dancing the Texas Two Step, and doing a conga line. Ok – some alcohol may have been involved. The band was a highlight of our trip.







What was **not** a highlight for us, beginning in Fredricksburg, was the Central, and North Texas spring weather. Fortunately, we were spared the worst – we had no hail and no tornadoes where we were, although they happened to the East of us. However, we endured the onslaught of mid-west monsoon

rain, thunder and lightning storms, mostly at night. In truth, this would not have been terribly uncomfortable, but we were traveling with a dog who is highly sensitive to and terrified of thunder and lightning. Being in a trailer made it worse. The rains kept the scenery green and pretty, but dealing with a terrified dog was no fun as nothing seemed to help. I would not put another animal through that. We were told that several other dogs on the trip did not deal well with the weather. Just something to consider if you plan to visit Texas during the Spring. It may be cooler, and the wildflower bloom lovely, but there is a trade-off., If your dog is not from Texas.


