

A Festival for Swamp Cabbage

Labelle Florida's 59th Annual Swamp Cabbage Festival was last weekend. Joel and I were excited to go and to try some new foods. Swamp Cabbage is hearts of palm, more precisely, hearts from the Sabal palm tree, which is Florida's state tree. At the festival locals were using it to make soups, stews, and fritters. We tried the fritters. They were deep fried into balls about the size of golf balls. There were many venders and organizations there, each making their own special recipe for the fritters. The group we bought from had them seasoned like a crab cake, with the nutty earthy flavor of the swamp cabbage pieces in the dough. There were also sauces available so you could dip into them. They were definitely a fun treat.

Since we had already indulged in fried food, we decided to go ahead and eat more fried food by trying frybread. Iona's Frybread specializes in authentic Miccosukee / Seminole dishes. They were making the frybread from scratch, mixing the ingredients by hand and cooking the dough in large pots of oil, fresh as each order was placed. You could order just the bread, or have it made into sandwiches like tacos and burgers. The line was long, the wait was longer. I'm glad we didn't know that would take 45 minutes to get our little loaf of bread, because we wouldn't have ordered it. It was so good!

Off to the armadillo races....it turns out the armadillos weren't very fast. In fact, they needed a lot of encouragement to move at all. But it was interesting to watch. (for a minute or two.) The races were under a tent set up by the local Kiwanis club, with a racetrack and even a small set of bleachers for the spectators. You could purchase a ticket before each race, and if your ticket had the number of the corresponding winning armadillo, you got a prize.

Here's a few things I learned about Armadillos:

- They come in litters of four. Identical quadruplets
- When startled or scared they can jump four feet high
- They are good swimmers and can hold their breath up to six minutes
- They are the only mammals other than Humans that carry the bacteria that causes leprosy (twenty percent carry it.) So, you don't want to handle them or eat them.
- Even though it was not apparent at the Labelle races, armadillos can run up to 30 miles per hour when being hunted

This little town really had a great weekend full of events.

A 5-k run, a parade, a car show, cooking competitions, even an air show!

The next festival we have plans to attend is the Immokalee Cattle Drive and Jamboree.


