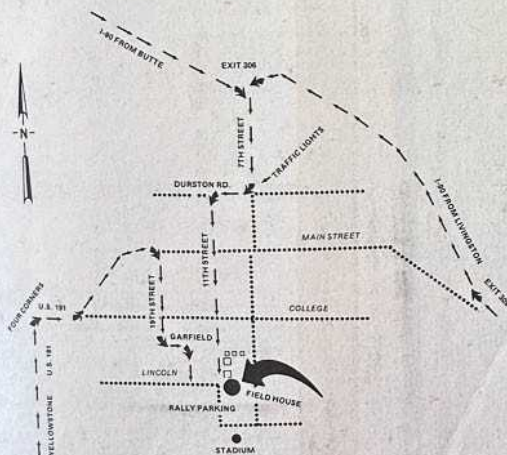

do, the \$50 is refunded, Black-  
wood said. Although any car  
entered in this class can be  
claimed, Blackwood said, only a  
few are claimed each year. The  
main advantage to this class, he  
said, is that it allows a driver to  
get started in stock car racing  
without have to put a lot of money  
into a vehicle.

The second division is the  
"stock" class. There are engine  
size and other restrictions in this  
class, Blackwood said. "It's a  
little more expensive than the  
claim class, but no one can claim  
the car. It has proven to be a very  
popular class."

The final class is the "super

stock." There are further  
restrictions on car quality in this  
division, Blackwood said, but  
"more flexibility as to what they  
can do with building engines and  
suspension." This class is "more  
expensive than the other two but  
very, very representative of what  
you see on television" national  
stock car races, he said.

"We have at least one best race  
per class" each Friday night,  
Blackwood said. In addition,  
there is a trophy dash and a main  
event from each class every  
Friday, he said.

The best race is 12 laps; the  
trophy dash, six laps and the  
main event usually is about 30  
laps, he said.

The top qualifiers out of each  
heat are entered in the trophy  
dash, he said.

The Hub of the Valley Speed-  
way has covered grandstands,  
with a capacity of 800, and a full  
caterer including, beer,  
sandwiches and soft-drinks, he  
said.

Parking at the race track has  
been improved this year to ac-  
commodate more people, he said.

Blackwood said more people  
are expected to attend the races  
this year because race tracks in  
Butte and Billings will not be  
operating because they were  
unable to renew their property

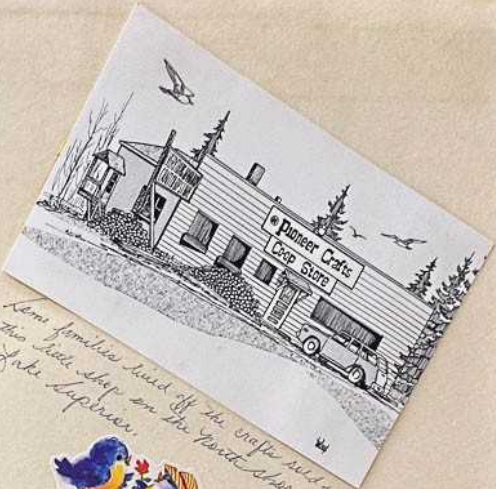
