From Matt's Cocktail Bar: Swedish Punsch



Corpse Reviver No 2A

In the early 18OOs, bartenders would offer their customers hangover cures. Each bartender would craft their own concoction and claim it would eliminate all residual negative side effects of the night before and would even, in rare circumstances, revive the dead. And the Corpse Reviver was born.

Now, unlike the Old Fashioned and many other countless classics, there was no official template for the Corpse Reviver. It could be literally anything but over the years some recipes gained notoriety and to distinguish one recipe from another, bartenders started assigning numbers.

Over time, one clear winner emerged and most modern Corpse Revivers follow the "equal parts" pattern of the Corpse Reviver No. 2:

O.75 oz gin

O.75 oz Cocchi Americano (or Lillet Blanc)

O.75 oz Triple sec

O.75 oz lemon juice (freshly squeezed)

Shake with ice and double strain into a chilled coupe that has been spritzed with Absinthe

However, if you want to branch out from the standard No. 2 build and want to try a riff published in the 1956 book "The Official Mixers Manual," grab a bottle of Kronan Swedish Punsch and head to the bar to make a Corpse Reviver No. 2A.

Swedish Punsch is a Scandinavian liqueur comprised of a base spirit (usually arrack or rum) mixed with tea, lemon, spices, sugar, and water. Punsch offers a complex herbal sweetness to cocktails, is readily available, and is an inexpensive addition to your bar. The Corpse Reviver No. 2A is almost the same build as the No. 2 and provides a more complex and sweeter result than the original:

O.75 oz gin

O.75 oz Kronan Swedish Punsch

O.75 oz Triple sec

O.75 oz lemon juice (freshly squeezed)

Shake with ice and double strain into a chilled coupe that has been spritzed with Absinthe

Swedish Punsch is versatile and is commonly used in a cocktail called the Doctor featuring rum & lime. I've even replaced the sweetener in an Old Fashioned and added some into a Mai Tai with great success. Grab a bottle and explore Punsch!

Getting to Know Your Regional Representatives

Meet Doug & Carol Whiteside - Region 10 Representatives





Please tell us something about yourselves.

Hello! We are Carol and Doug Whiteside from Calgary, Alberta, Canada. Carol and I met at the University of Saskatchewan in Saskatoon. Growing up on the prairies, we had a very limited view of the world but a desire to learn more about its wonders. Upon graduation, we married and travelled through New Zealand, Australia and Southeast Asia. The statement" Ignorance is Bliss" certainly applied as we, two trusting and ill-informed explorers, backpacked on a shoestring budget with little or, at times, no contact with our friends and family back home. How times have changed! Although extremely challenging and "educational," we thoroughly enjoyed ourselves, and the travel lure was set. Upon returning home, our travel options became much less expansive as we settled into buying a house and raising our six children. Travel remained an integral part of our lives, and we spent numerous holidays towing a tent trailer with an eight-passenger station wagon across western Canada and the USA. We started our North American travels in a 13-foot "Boler" style travel trailer. After one long-distance trip, we realized (with a lot of Scotch) it was no fun being cramped in a cold, sometimes damp, tiny trailer with no bathroom, watching the rain and snow come down. We needed better accommodation.

When not travelling, we visit our six children and five grandchildren, ski, hike and volunteer with our church and community. Carol also spends her time quilting, baking and gardening while I spend my extra time renovating our children's homes and fly fishing.

How did you become a member of the Airstream Club International and Grapes & Grains?

We discovered the Club by looking into the BRNs (Big Red Numbers), and through the BRNs, we have found a community on wheels and a travel support network. We have attended five rallies, including the Region IO Rally and Sedalia 2O24 International Rally, and

participated in our first Caravan, Grapes and Grain's "Sipping across Missouri." The Caravan was perfect! It opened our eyes to new ways of vacationing and a new way of creating community.

We are members of the Alberta Saskatchewan Local Club and associate members with Oregon and Montana. We are also members of the Grapes and Grains Intraclub. We have enjoyed our experiences with all the clubs. The Grapes and Grains Intra-club has, though, a few unique characteristics. First, its focus on "Grapes and Grains." Sharing food and alcohol is a great way to meet others, share experiences, and develop friendships. Because Grapes and Grains is not regionally focused, it has also allowed us to meet people from across North America, and while we live in a beautiful place with many wonderful places to see, it is the people we meet who truly make travel special.
