International Rally Bulletin Boards Remembered

ver the years many Airstream Club traditions have been formed and then lost to time. Who remembers the gopher holes, teen queens or the International Rally bulletin boards? This year, for our international club's 70th anniversary, the historical committee is reaching out to members across the country to identify, collect, display and preserve both memories and artifacts. What a great way to celebrate our international club's 70th anniversary.

Airstream, Inc. has had wonderful interest in their new Heritage Center displaying Airstream products but fails to tell the history, and passion of the club and its members. Our club leadership team has established a blueprint for the seeds of the Airstream Club Historical Center and Library proposed to be housed in a portion of the old headquarters building adjacent to the new club headquarters facility in Jackson Center, OH.

As a long time club member and collector of Airstream Club memorabilia, I donated 5 International Rally bulletin boards to the International Club that I had made and preserved as a member of the Cape Cod Massachusetts (Unit) Airstream Club during the 1990's and 2000's. At the Travelers Rest Airstream Luncheon with over 100 Airstreamers in attendance I presented them to Jenny Schnettler from the executive council of the Airstream Club.


So, what were the International Rally bulletin boards? Long before cell phones, social media, or other electronic communications all local clubs, called "Units" in those days, posted written messages on a bulletin board designated for each local club. These boards were used to communicate to other unit members upcoming unit and region events, individual club member locations or even a great dinning location in town.


With time these simple message boards became works of creative art and a source of pride for the local units. Each board was designed by local unit members and was large (2 feet wide and 4 feet high). Then at the rally they were displayed on racks constructed by the rally carpentry team just outside the main entertainment hall and exhibition rooms. The boards were to depict either the rally theme or the geographical location that the unit represented. The judging of the bulletin boards was a highly anticipated event

There were over 100 of these artistic boards at most International Rallies so it was truly a spectacle to see and enjoy. These boards also served as a congregating spot for local club members before and after rally events. Another wonderful piece of history lost to time. ~






