Finally, some news: the subscription trip-planner RV Life Trip Wizard is now including Harvest Host locations on its website. No more getting whiplash, going back and forth from Trip Wizard to Harvest Hosts when planning a trip! I have used RV Trip Wizard when making itineraries for longer trips and find it very convenient and informational. This new update will make it more so. Of course, you must also have a subscription to Harvest Hosts to see the locations via Trip Wizard. To access locations, you must manually connect to HH via Trip Wizard; such is not automatic. If you connect, the locations will appear like any other. Cost is \$65 a year for Trip Wizard (Harvest Hosts is separate). I only subscribe to Trip Wizard in the years I make such a trip(s) and I have found it a good value for how we travel. You may wish to check it out. You can sign up for a free 7-day trial period. https://tripwizard.rvlife.com/

The only downside is that the Airstream Courtesy Parking sites are not shown on Trip Wizard. For that you will still need to separately access the HH website/app or the ACI.org map.

Hope to see you in camp at the V6 or later on in the year. Till then: safe travels.

Grass Valley RV Resort 1462 Auburn Rd Grass Valley, California 95949

Welcome to the Grass Valley Rally-Fun in the Foothills. The rally will be at the Grass Valley RV Park, which bills itself as "Northern California's Newest Luxury RV Resort." It is situated on 20 acres, located directly across from the Nevada County Fairgrounds, within minutes of historic Downtown Grass Valley & Nevada City, and less than one mile from the intersection of HWYs 20 and 49 in the Gold Country. It features concrete pads, a swimming pool, three pickleball courts, bocce ball, a dog park, showers, restrooms and walking trails. This will be NorCal's first time rallying at this park as it just opened last August.



The Grass Valley area is famous for its gold mining. As a matter of fact, it was the richest mining district in California. While here, you can visit the Empire Mine Historic State Park. Also is the North State Power House Mining Museum. More details will be in your welcome bag.



Additionally, both Nevada City and Grass Valley have wonderful shopping areas. Average high is 76 degrees in early June.

Wednesday will start with Happy Hour at 5:00 p.m. This will be followed with a pizza/salad dinner from Pete's Pizza (\$16), a favorite among the "locals." The crust is amazing! Yes, there will be vegan pizzas too.

# Information and Registration Instructions for the June 2025 Rally @ Grass Valley

## **June Rally Cost Information**

- Parking fee per night: \$90
- Wednesday Pizza Dinner \$16 pp

- Saturday evening Backwoods BBQ \$36 pp

**Registration for this rally opens at 9 a.m. on April 1, 2025.** At that time, you may access the Jotform registration page via the Club's webpage:

PLEASE DO NOT SUBMIT MORE THAN ONE JOTFORM as multiple jotform submissions make it difficult for the registrar and others. If you make a mistake or have new information to add, contact the registrar via wbccinorcal.registrar@gmail.com.

Attendees are chosen on a first-come-first-serve basis based on the time the completed Jotform is sent to the registrar. After completing and sending the Jotform, wait for an email **from the registrar either** confirming that you are registered for the rally or informing you that you are on the rally wait list.

If you are confirmed, you may either pay for the rally via Zelle to the NorCal Airstream Club or send a check for the full amount **directly to the treasurer, Gordon Krauter,** before the deadline given to you. If you are placed on the wait list, do not pay until you hear from the registrar that you are confirmed for the rally. She will update your status via email.

Zelle is currently the preferred payment method. **Note**: as of March 31<sup>st</sup>, Zelle will discontinue its own phone app. You must access Zelle through your banking institution's app or online platform. Most banks and credit unions offer payment through Zelle. If unsure, call your banking institution for information.

If using Zelle, make sure to add your name and rally location in the "memo" or "message" area before sending payment. If you pay by check, make your checks payable to "WBCCI/NorCal" and **mail directly to Gordon Krauter**, **4672 Sarah Court, Livermore, CA 94550.** Your registration is incomplete and not fully confirmed until we receive BOTH your registration and payment.

HAS CHANGED

Please pay by the deadline provided to you in the confirmation email or you may lose your spot. If you do not hear back from the registrar on the day you register, *contact her within 48 hours* via: wbccinorcal.registrar@gmail.com.

Contact the registrar if you have ANY changes to your registration or wish to register after the deadline, which is April 30th. Best to email her at: wbccinorcal.registrar@gmail.com. She will contact you as soon as she can. Under no circumstances are members to contact the RV Park with changes or cancellations.

**Refund Policy:** The park has the following cancellation policies: If you cancel 14 or more days before your arrival date, you will receive a full refund minus a \$20 processing fee. If you cancel within 14 - 2 days prior to your date of arrival, you will pay for one night's stay. If cancelling 2 or less days before your arrival date, and/or have an early departure, there is no refund.

#### Check in starts at 1 p.m. Check out is at 11 a.m.

**Pet Policy:** If you have pets, please abide by NorCal's pet policy and common courtesy. The park requests that pets are on a leash AT ALL TIMES.

If you become sick prior to the rally, please stay home and get well. We will miss you, but your health and that of club members is of paramount importance.


