Tribute to Jackie

Twenty-one months ago, my wife, Jackie and I were told that she had 20-21 months to live. Jackie was diagnosed with idiopathic pulmonary fibrosis and there was no cure. This wasn't her first health threat. She was a cancer survivor



but at that moment our lives shifted. We were told she will be made as comfortable as possible with medications and her oxygen tank would soon be her permanent companion. We set out to live the rest of her days the best we could and we did just that. On Sunday, March 9, 2025 in the late afternoon, my wife died peacefully at Munson Hospice House. Some know the Jackie with the scooter, the nasal cannula and oxygen tank by her side. Through no fault of her own, that was terminally-ill Jackie. I want to share with you the Jackie I know and love.

Jackie was born in Cleveland. OH and lived in Lakewood. OH. She started her first year of college in Spain but came back soon after starting because her father died unexpectedly. College postponed, she helped to support her family by working at Ohio Bell. She worked her way through the company and transferred to Nevada working in the billing department, then transferred to Pacific Bell in San Francisco. She became the Senior Project Manager while simultaneously getting her degree [BS] in 3 instead of 4 years at the University of San Francisco. She was amazing at her job and knew how to manage and talk to people. She was so smart. She became a contractor for IBM but then went back to SBC Global doing the same job as Pacific Bell but for 3X the salary. They gave her an offer she couldn't refuse and she was good at it and loved it. She officially retired in 2007.

Jackie was my next door neighbor when I first met her. She was divorced and a career woman, looking so professional in her business suits I recall. Couple of years after my divorce, we reconnected and began dating. After 3 years of dating, on October, 19, 1991, we married and shared our lives together in California for 24 years. We moved to Michigan in December of 2015. As I look back at our lives, what brought us together and kept us together was a love for adventure. It was not unusual for us to spontaneously hop in the car and do something fun. We always had a travel bag in the car ready at a moment's notice.




Tribute to Jackie

Jackie had many gifts outside of her professional career. She became a master gardener which enabled her to do all the gardening around the new home that we built together in California. She was a beautiful painter and an avid bird watcher. A lifelong learner, she taught herself how to cane chairs and had a little side hustle caning chairs because she spoke with "authority" and she could do anything she put her mind to. She was one of the founding members of the "Dominicans" at St. Dominic Catholic Church in the town of Benicia, CA. She loved hiking and hiked the Grand Canyon down and back with a heavy backpack. She was an active, healthy, 4'11" tall dynamo and a force to be reckoned with.



Once we bought our first Airstream (which is another good story I won't go into), she was a die-hard Airstreamer. She was all in with both feet! She was the President of NorCal Airstream in Region 12 and served the club in various ways. She didn't miss a beat when we moved to Michigan and we became members of the Michigan Airstream Club. At the time of her death, she was the Past-President and had worked her way up the Executive Board volunteering her time and talent. Her favorite part of the club was keeping the club focused and heading in a positive direction. She loved to talk to members and sincerely ask



questions and listen. She loved her MAC family and that family loved her too. People have told me that meeting Jackie was the reason they joined MAC. That means so much to me and I get it.

Jackie is survived by me and while she never had children herself, she was the loving mother of my four children and our 13 grandchildren. She was their "Nana Jackie". She made an positive impact on them and she will be dearly missed. I can honestly say that Jackie made me a better person too. She taught me so much and I would not have gotten this far in life without her support. All of it, I owe to Jackie. Yes, Jackie is survived by her family but she is survived by all the friends she knew, including all of you. You are her family too and I am grateful to have you. I am officially stepping down from my position on the MAC executive board but not stepping out. I just need a bit of time to settle into life without Jackie and determine my next steps. Airstreamers Serving Veterans: "Airstreams Return to Cadillac II" Rally by Pegeen Smith

On June 29, 1966, the 9th International Rally was held in the small town of Cadillac, Michigan. A whopping 2828 Airstreams gathered for a week just south of the Wexford County Airport and was said to be one of the largest rallies of that era.

Last summer, we celebrated that rich history with a fun-filled rally which centered around giving back to Veterans Serving Veterans. Inc., a non-profit dedicated to supporting local veterans and bringing the community together. All of the campground fees collected provided the materials to construct a split-rail fence and Airstream volunteers provided the man/woman power. Michigan Airstream Club donated a brick and several attendees donated towards a second brick. This service project was highlighted in the 2024 Fall Edition of the Blue Beret! The good news is that we are planning another rally in the same location and we welcome more to come join us.

Product Review by Sharon Bryant

Last winter while in Tucson my Blacken Decker Dustbuster stopped working. Wasn't that great anyway. Went to Costco and purchased another compact vacuum cleaner to carry in the Airstream. Seemed to work fairly well until it stopped working. So, back on the internet to look for top rated, small, lightweight vacuum.

After reading reviews for several vacuum cleaners. I decided on Fanttik V8. I have found this vacuum cleaner to be much better than the last two. The Fanttik has superior suction power and weighing only 1.1 pounds. Diameter is small enough to get into tight spots and most of the attachments are useful. Holds a charge exceptionally well.

Forever Trailer By Dale Schneider, BRN 6664

Right from the beginning we liked our trailer enough to say that it was a keeper. Based on that, our approach has been Wally Byam's philosophy to not make changes, only improvements. We asked ourselves "is it a want, or a need, or both?" Sometimes it was a necessary repair, sometime an update to tired furnishings or outdated or missing electronics. Sometimes things get just get old. Sometimes it was a "nice to have." We also consider if we had to sell our trailer, could we put that item or feature back to original for the new owner?

In 2013 when our trailer was built, Airstream USB charging ports were not factory-installed equipment. Tired of charging in the truck or only when plugged in, we had 3 installed. A want and a need.

So here we go. Our glass shower door failed 3 times and finally was not repairable and had to be replaced. Research led us to the Nautilus retractable cassette door OEM equipment used by Airstream in certain models with all-in-one [non-split bath] bathrooms like the Flying Cloud 26U. High function and quality.

We did a preemptive install of the new Maxim 3-layer, hurricane-rated skylight. Ours was 12 years old ,brittle and yellowed. A new skylight shade has been purchased to replace the worn one, will be installed this spring.

My wife hated that she could not see who was at the door if someone knocked, a safety issue for her. Last year we had that frosted window in the door replaced with a tinted, clear glass window. A want and an improvement [Note: there are only a couple of shops that do this and it is not the factory service center.]

Some smaller things were a door handle reinforcement hack along with the lock out prevention device and better stainless steel striker bolt both from NoLox Solutions. We added a pull handle above the stock door handle on the inside for easier closing. LED strip lights were added to the outdoor storage compartments for ease in finding stuff that stuff that is way back there.

Upgraded propane tank lines to braided stainless steel lines [rubber propane tank lines do get bulges and fail] and a Gas-Stop device which shuts off propane flow if a sudden, high flow is detected. Will install two tether cables this spring [reduces possibility of damage to the propane tank cover in high winds.]

In 2013, the OEM batteries were flooded-cell lead acid. Those were upgraded when they were aged out at 5 years old to 2 AGM batteries and we added 400w of solar to the roof along with the associated necessary electronics for solar. Two years ago, when those aged out, we upgraded to 3 Battleborn lithium batteries. We now have 4x the battery capacity we started with. Our original 4 solar panels aged out and in 2024, those were replaced with more efficient panels.

Our dinette cushions had gotten soft so the foam in the seats was replaced with firmer foam. The vulnerable plastic fresh tank drain was preemptively replaced with a brass drain that drains much faster and is easier to use. [Our drain is behind a tire and hard to reach.]

Much like our home, to keep up the condition, every year there are regular annual maintenance items like check the brake and bearings and tires. Additionally, we target projects that either need attention or upgrades we want to do.

This approach has served us well coming up on 9 years of Airstreaming with a now 12-year-old trailer. Only 13 more years to go till she's vintage.

Favorite Bicycle-Friendly Campsites By Sarah Smith, BRN 26310

When people learn my husband John and I are avid camping weekend-warriors, it's almost guaranteed the next question I get is "where do you like to camp?" For me, that's a hard question to answer because it depends what's on the agenda for the trip. And the season or weather forecast. And how much time we have to get to our destination and back!

However, one thing I'm guaranteed to always seek out in a campground is that it's located directly on or nearby a bike trail. Bonus points if you can depart right from the campground on your bike, double-bonus points if it's a scenic ride, and triple-bonus points if the trail somewhere intersects a cute café or local watering hole.

In my opinion, the quintessential campground for these adventures is Keith J. Charters Traverse City State Park, and I'm fortunate to have one trip planned in early summer before it closes down for updates through the 2026 camping season. From the Traverse City State Parks TART Trail, you can go as far out as Suttons Bay, but also connect and loop around beautiful Boardman Lake, get safely downtown, and enjoy all that TC has to offer on two-wheels. My dream weekend!

But where else do we like to camp that scores all of the points? How will I make it through next year without visiting my beloved campsite 56 in Traverse? Let me share you a few places that may not be on your radar that hit the marks of great. bikeable parks, that you may not have [yet!] visited:

1. <u>John Gurney Park and Campground</u>. Hart, Michigan. This is a small, city-owned park with a handful of sites for transient campers and mostly seasonal sites. It's a perfect place to make a home base for trips to Ludington, Silver Lake, and Pentwater, and you can take your bike from the park easily to the 22-mile paved Hart-Montague Trail. I'd recommend taking the bike trail to the local's favorite Brown Bear restaurant's Shelby location for some refreshment



your way back to John Gurney. Hart Brewing is also bikeable, or you can walk to the bakery or a small handful of other places in Hart right from the campground. Bring your kayaks, too, as there is a launch and small beach at the campground to Hart Lake, that also accesses the Pentwater River. Aim for pie-shaped campsites in the 50-section for nice view of the lake but bring your extension cords. It's a little tight in this campground, but a nice spot for a long weekend of exploring the area. Other amenities include a pickleball court and short wooded walking trail. There are also lots of Jeep-enthusiasts, who make for quiet neighbors if you find yourself at the park during the prime dune-riding hours.

2. Betsie River Campsite. Frankfort, Michigan. This unique, privately-owned campground has been an annual Memorial Day weekend trip for us for many years. The eclectic owners also operate a cozy café on site, and their camp store is among the best I've over-spent at! The park is directly on the Betsie Valley Trail and "turning left" out of the

30-amp tops, and we always reserve the pull-throughs for extra space. Stormcloud Brewing in Frankfort is on the bikeroute itinerary when visiting Bestie River Campsite. The city of Beulah also recently opened their city-owned park to recreational (and not just seasonal-site) campers, and that is on our bucket list for this summer because we love that small town.

3. <u>VanBuren State Park</u>, South Haven, Michigan. We ended up at VanBuren State Park for the July 4th holiday last year



by a stroke of luck. I've had great success with the DNR/Michigan state park's campground system "Notify Me" feature and snagged what must have been a cancellation. My advice: don't be afraid to get yourself on multiple park cancellation lists, be flexible, and just take whatever site you can get. It's part of the adventure, right? VanBuren State Park is right on Lake Michigan with a lovely sandy swimming beach, but most importantly also on the VanBuren Trail State Park. The 4-ish mile trail will take you directly into "downtown" South Haven, which is a lively little town for dining, shopping, and people watching.

4. <u>Indian River RV Resort</u>. Indian River, Michigan. If you're feeling fancy, consider a trip to the campground that was voted the 2023 Campspot award for Best Campground in America. There are no bad sites, but the really pricy ones are truly glorious. The



dog park, pool, walking trail and stores are all worth the [steep] price of admission, but my favorite part was the bike trailhead, just outside the campground. We powered our way on bike the beautiful 20+ miles to Cheboygan with our SEMAC friends Jason and Carly. Nearby, you can also have find more fun by renting a pontoon on Burt Lake or the nearby chains

of lakes. This notable park is worth a week's vacation time and could be the highlight of your summer travels.

Other more popular bikeable-adventure right-from-the-campground parks we love include Magnus Park (city-owned) or the State Park in Petoskey, D.H. Day in

Glen Arbor (rustic, national-park maintained). Young State Park (Boyne City) or Holland State Park. All of the parks offer a reprieve from having to drive your oversized tow-vehicle into town for a meal or beer, plus a little fresh air along the bike route.

Seeds of Change Quinoa or grain of choice. Microwavable pouch

Chickpeas - Microwaveable pouch

Chopped Kale

Avocado

Hardboiled egg

Directions

Oven roast or microwave potatoes. Cut in half, store in refrigerator until ready to use.

Drain chickpeas, toss in frypan with 1 Tbsp olive oil to toast. Add kale and sweet potato, cut side down, until warm/light brown.

Microwave quinoa according to package direction.
