For decades I'd heard about <u>Dead Horse Point</u> and hoped one day to see this place which inspires rapturous testimonials about the views, the beauty and the grandeur which many travelers will swear on a stack of red rock shale rivals The Grand Canyon.

If canyons had a beauty contest, I'd be a terrible judge. They're all winners to me. But if you're looking to avoid crowds, Dead Horse Point is a good bet.

Be warned, there are at least two campgrounds named Dead Horse in the United States. Do not confuse dreamy <u>Dead Horse Ranch</u> in Cottonwood Arizona (<u>where we stayed for twoweeks in May</u>) with Dead Horse Point in Utah. Our friends, Cyndy and Lee – long-term camp hosts at Dead Horse Ranch – have suffered the anguish of breaking the news to confused arrivals that their campsite reservation is hundreds of miles away.

Dead Horse Point State Park is a International <u>Dark Sky Park</u> and is a great place to stargaze. My friend, Morgan visited there during dark nights and watched a meteor shower which lasted from dark till past dawn.

Coming in late summer, 2024: The Airstream Club International Courtesy Parking powered by Harvest Hosts.



We will be utilizing the Harvest Hosts reservations tool to operate our Courtesy Parking reservations. The same technologies that power the Harvest Hosts platform will:

- · Provide you, as the host, tools to manage your Courtesy Parking listing;
- · Provide a listing with property details, amenities and photos;
- · Provide a calendar so you can block out times your location is not available;
- · Provide tools to make it easier to communicate with the guest; and
- · Add a layer of security: your address will not be shown until you approve the guest

We will continue to provide you with information — via recorded webinars and further instructional emails — about the improvements that are underway along with help throughout the onboarding process.


