My final goal was to have people understand what is so important to be a part of a club and why it's so important to participate in something different, like fund-raisers, socializing, and traveling.

PLANNING:

In order for me to execute this project successfully, I had to go more into depth and find out the background behind Airstream and how it came to be, and how much growth it had throughout the years.

I had to search for everything I put on the board, starting off with Wally Byam and his journey to create Airstream. I also researched his family and how they supported and helped him through this process to create something that everyone with an airstream can enjoy.

A few of Wally's cousins, like Helen and her son Dale (PeeWee) Schwamborn continued to carry on his legacy and spread and grow the Airstream community, Helen organized caravans and helped anyone who needed it until her death.

Meanwhile PeeWee is the only living relative that Wally has left. He is in his old age, but he loves to talk about his experiences with Wally and the caravans. PeeWee was a scout, so before the Caravans happened, he would travel ahead first to make sure it was safe and to tell everyone the directions. Luckily, I already knew about PeeWee because he still comes to the International Rallies that happen once a year for one week during the summer. We still carry out Wally's annual Airstream traditions.

For this project I leaned on my parents a lot to help me. I asked them to help because my dad is the president of our local club the CIAC (Central Indiana Airstream Club), and he is the 3rd Vice President of the Vintage Airstream Club. Also, my mother is the 2nd Vice President of the Region 5 Airstream club, which includes Illinois, Indiana, and Kentucky. I confided in them because they have a lot of knowledge about the club and the people in it.

I also confided in the president of Airstream International Club, Eric McHenry, and his wife Laverne McHenry. They helped a tremendous amount. At the 67th Annual Airstream Rally in Missouri, At the opening ceremony where there were 3000+ attendees, Eric invited me to come onto the stage where all the important

Did you know - a gallon size bag of pop tabs weighs roughly 2.5 lbs?

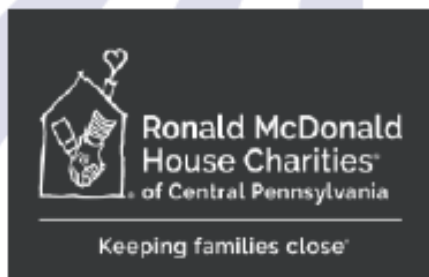

This Rally will highlight much of the best that Indianapolis has to offer, including a day of racing at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway for the IndyCar Sonsio Grand Prix, visits to downtown Indianapolis and the town of Speedway, fun themed dinners and much more.
