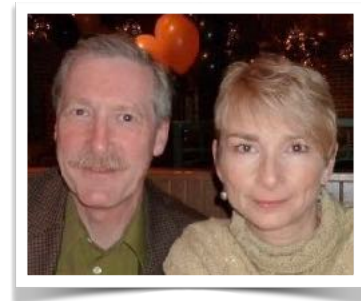

is by far the nicest campground I can remember staying at (other than Breckinridge CO).

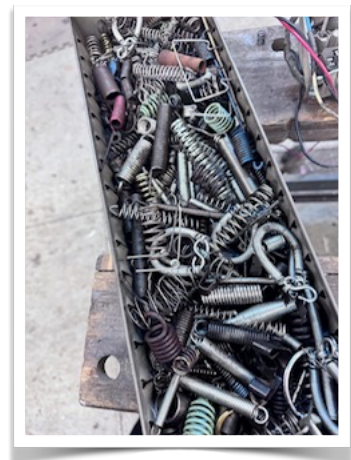
So why you ask am I going down memory lane....

Pearl has been the Wisc -Up and Region 7 President and has led many caravans with her husband Fred Adams. Happy Birthday Pearl we wish you many more!

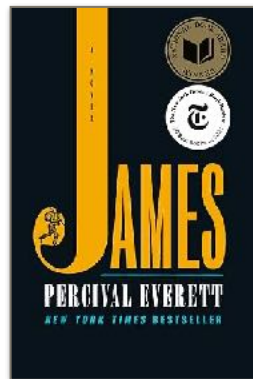

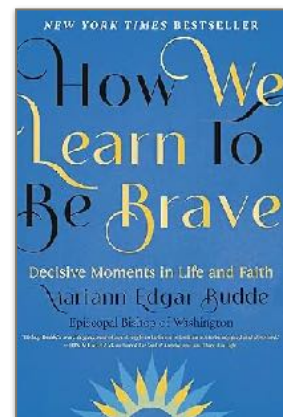
Two books to recommend, both I finished this week.

The rear end of my 2019 28' FC Airstream in Marquette, MI last week. 20.4" of snow in 24 hours set a record.

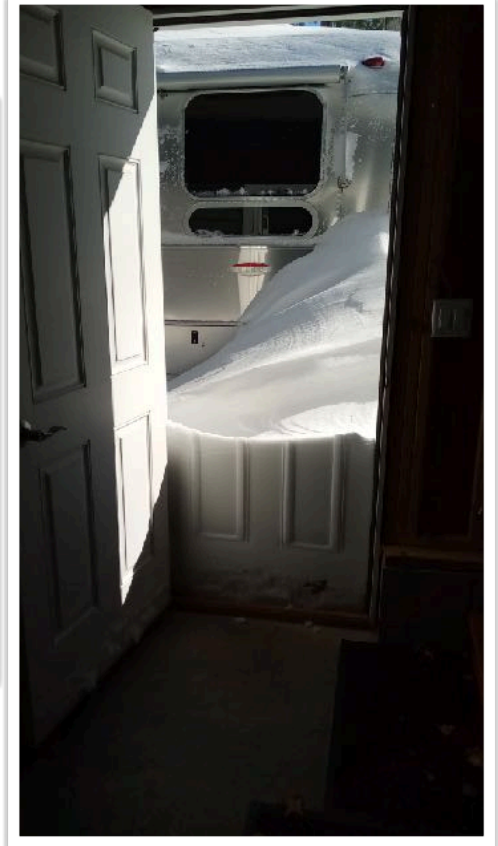

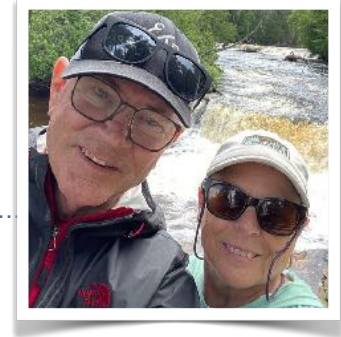




# Our Members' Travels

## Wintering In Arizona

Having grown weary of Wisconsin winters, we packed it up to head southwest to Tucson, AZ in early January. Winter storms caused us to rethink the route. We decided to head south as far as possible before turning west. This got us to Dallas just in time for the massive ice storm that brought the city to its knees for a day. We took the Ice Day as a down day and got the trailer de-winterized before continuing on.

After spending a few days with friends from Green Bay in Las Cruces, NM, we began the final leg of our journey enroute to Casa Grande, AZ. The city is about 50 miles south of Phoenix and 50 miles north of Tucson.

The Palm Creek RV Resort & Residences is our winter residence from January 15th until the third week of April. We discovered the park last year when, while passing nearby, we remembered that fellow Wisc-Up'ers Kelly and Pam Meer were wintering there. We called them and were told there was a nice site next door to theirs that was available. We booked it for two weeks last year and for a little over 3 months this year. And like last year, the Meers are our neighbors again this year.

There is a lot to do both on-site and within a 50-mile radius. The site itself has golf, pickleball, tennis, swimming pools, a bistro, and more. Mary has been taking up silversmithing, some pottery, and woodworking. She has facilities to master. We routinely play couples golf with the Meers.. Mike has a BMW motorcycle out here and takes long bike trips. Kelly Meer diagnosed the problem with our Zip Dee awning and saved us about \$2000 in repair costs once we ordered the parts and did the installation. And the Meers have introduced us to the many folks they have met during their past year's stay at the Park.

The weather in Casa Grande is grand. It is also very dry. We have had only 1/3 of one inch of rain since we arrived here. The skies are bright blue and sunny every day with highs in the mid-70s and lows to the mid 40's.

Two things that surprised us were 1) the total absence of bugs and 2) that there is never any morning dew. Or any other dew.

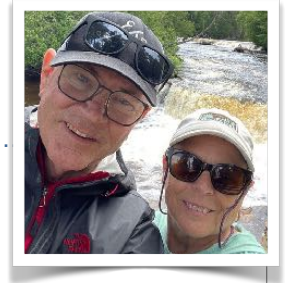
It has been a great winter for us. If it appeals to you too there is still space available next year. We will be glad to fill you in on the details.

PS: Just east of Tucson we came across a spectacular State of AZ campground we want to recommend highly to you. Kartchner Caverns <https://azstateparks.com/Kartchner>  
In addition to large, private, scenic sites there is a cave system that was only recently discovered. (1980's). It was kept secret for many years so as to prevent damage and vandalism until such time as it could be adequately protected from public intrusion of any kind. The geologic formations you can now observe are unlike anything anywhere else in the world. The Kartchner family was aware of the need to protect and preserve the site but knew they needed help. The governor of Arizona at the time was an expert geologist and also recognized the value of the site. The family turned the property over to the State to develop, protect and ultimately make available to the public. Interestingly, the two amateur spelunkers who discovered the caves while hiking around the area during their college days are still alive and occasionally lead tours themselves.

And don't forget to ask us about the Biosphere 2 which you can also visit while in the Area. Or the Titan II missile site / museum where you can descend into the missile silo, observe the 100 foot tall ICBM including the nuclear warhead in its silo, and participate in a 1960's era launch sequence from the intact launch control center.

# Repairs, Restorations & Cool Airstream Things

## How to Choose Toilet Paper for your RV

Ok, so I have a little bit of passion about this topic. RV toilet paper is pricey. Plus, I don't like having to go somewhere "special" to get toilet paper besides the grocery store. We are of the "flusher" philosophy regarding toilet paper. Some people garbage can it. I respect that, but I don't do it. You do have to be careful what you flush down into your black tank, though. Definitely don't flush those personal wipes that are advertised as flushable. They will flush, but they don't break apart. Anything that doesn't break apart in your tank can clog it. Not all toilet paper is made the same, either. Some papers dissolve better than others. I always test my potential trailer toilet paper prior to use in the trailer. I have discovered that even if I use the same brand year to year, I should test it annually. Why? Because manufacturers change formulations from time to time, and once it really tripped us up. We couldn't figure out why suddenly we were having issues draining our black tank. After struggling with it for a little while, I had an epiphany and tested the toilet paper I had been using for several years. Lo and behold, it didn't break apart anymore. And, that turned out to be our problem.

So, how do you test toilet paper for breakapartability? This is what I do (my mom taught me this). I take a quart jar, fill about 2/3 full of water, add about 3 squares of the toilet paper I'm testing, let it sit a minute or so, then shake it. If it turns into flakes of toilet paper in the jar, it's good for my black tank. If it stays intact, not so good. Oh, and don't go by "septic safe". I've seen some of those not break apart at all. So, I'm sure you're asking what do I use? Fiora.



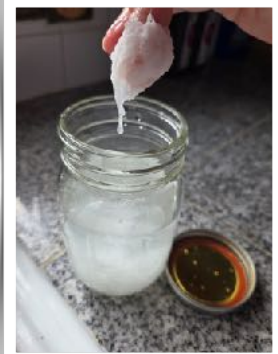
This is my first example. Doesn't look bad in the jar, but as you can see from the next picture below, it didn't break apart.

# Region 7 President Ramblings

## Region 7 Rally Report

Since the last IBT Meeting on January 23rd, we had an electronic vote to pass a resolution that extends the next Executive Council term of office to 29 months instead of the usual 24 months. This was done to align the Executive Council terms to a calendar year. The ACI Constitution states that Executive Council terms need to align with the Financial Calendar. Since the ACI Financial Calendar was changed from August – July 31 to January 1 – December 31, the Executive Council terms needed to be adjusted. This is a one-time adjustment for the next Executive Council, which will be elected by the ACI Membership this year. So, the newly elected Executive Council members will serve from August 1, 2025, thru December 31, 2027. Future Executive Council terms will be from January to December 31 of the following year (Jan 1, 2028 – Dec 31, 2029 for example).

This does not affect the Region Presidents. The Region 7 President term of office remains Aug 1st – July 31st of the following year (2-year term).

Speaking of the Executive Council, applications for candidacy are now open. If you want to run for the ACI Executive Council, please go to the link below:

If you don't know, there are 9 elected members of the Executive Council. Once the 9 members are elected, the entire IBT elects the ACI President and Vice President from the 9 elected members. The IBT consists of the 9 Executive Council members plus the 12 Region Presidents.

The next IBT Meeting is scheduled for April 17, 2025. Watch your email for information on the IBT Meeting and how to watch it live if you want to.
