Tanglewood has changed their reservation policy from previous years, affecting our ability to individually secure sites for the rally in 2026, but thanks to some quick action and assistance from our members, our club now has all 44 sites reserved for 2026! We will be sending an email out in the coming weeks to explain the details of how the reservations will work within the club so stay tuned for more information with no need to contact Tanglewood to reserve a site for next year! Just another reminder to please register on our website's Jotform for each rally you plan to attend once you get your site reserved. This allows the club and rally hosts to provide better communication with you, giving details about the rallies you will attend.

We look forward to seeing everyone as the year progresses as we create new memories and make new friends!



Joining Tanglewood in 2026?

As many of you know, it is becoming more and more difficult to reserve a block of sites for our rallies. At this year's Tanglewood rally, we discovered that a recent change of the campground's policy meant that they no longer hold blocks of sites for any length of time. Given the popularity of this campground, not only with our club but with the general population, we decided to be proactive and reserved the entire campground through the club for our 2026 rally! Fortunately, their cancellation policy is very good and there will be no ultimate financial liability for the club.

This full campground reservation means there is no rush for rally attendees to reserve a site through Tanglewood since our club now has all their sites secured for the rally. But what this does mean is that the club will be responsible for reserving the individual sites through our Jotform registration. When registering for this rally you will be not only registering for the rally, but you will also be reserving and paying for your site on our Jotform. The available sites will be listed on the Jotform and will be removed as they are assigned. Just as with other campgrounds we utilize, the sites will be reserved on a first come, first served basis once the Jotform goes live. With that in mind, we will send an email out to our members a few days before the Jotform will go live to give everyone a heads up of the day and exact time the Jotform will be activated.

Once registered with a site, you will be able to cancel with a full refund up to four weeks before your scheduled arrival. This will give the club two weeks to fill that slot without the risk of losing the payment with Tanglewood (we can cancel within two weeks of arrival and receive a full refund from Tanglewood). Given the popularity of this rally and typical wait list, we don't anticipate returning any sites!





CAC's 1st US Island Activation for Ham Operators Contributed by Marcia Thompson

ACI has an intra-club for amateur (ham) radio operators, and Carolinas Airstream Club has quite a few active hams at various levels of activity and license levels within their portion of the intra-club, which is called WB4CAC. For several years now, the Carolinas Airstream Club has had their season-opener rally at James Island County Park in Charleston, SC.

WB4CAC member NC4MT Marcia Thompson, with plans to attend this year's James Island rally, kept hearing about "activating" islands in her ham radio community, so she decided to research what that meant and if it applied to James Island, SC.

She began to learn! James Island County Park is *not* a state or federal park, so it does not qualify for ham POTA status (Parks on the Air, which does not recognize county parks). James Island *is* a 5-square-mile island, but this does *not* qualify it for IOTA status (Islands on the Air). So, having learned what the island is *not*, the question remains, what *is* it? Marcia was left with yet *another* rabbit hole to be explored!

Marcia's fellow ham operator YL Angela N3ARB has activated several islands in the US so Marcia got the scoop about how to proceed. She learned that James Island is a *US Island* (State, Territory, and Protectorates Islands) managed by usislands.org. After exploring that, she discovered that James Island has already been qualified a US Island by N4AH/P and thus was already assigned a number, SC005S, which meant that it could be "activated," which is exactly what happened on March 22, 2025!


Since James Island had already been qualified as a US Island by usislands.org, there were no minimum or maximum quantity of contacts required. So, Marcia registered our WB4CAC plans for SC005S on the usislands.org website to add it to their calendar.

While several more hams were camping at James Island County Park, four brave souls made 51 SSB contacts and 1 CW contact on 3 bands (40, 20, 15) and two modes (SSB and CW). Marcia spotted their activity with HamAlert. Our operators were Phil Drake K4UOK, George Lamb N4ROT, Bruce Thompson AD4ET, and Marcia Thompson NC4MT. We only operated for 4 hours on Saturday afternoon 1:00-4:00 p.m. local time. Band conditions were excellent on 20m but were less than favorable on the rest. Antennas included a Zero Five vertically mounted on the front fork of an Airstream, a Ham Stick vertically mounted on top of an Airstream, and a Tarheel screwdriver vertically mounted on a Lift and Lay on top of an Airstream. Rigs were Yaesu FT-897, a Yaesu FT-891 (with a Putikeeg straight key), and a Kenwood TS-440S - all running 100w or less.

Overall, it was a successful first Island activation for WB4CAC as we begin celebrating our 65th year as the 21st club in WBCCI!

Significant progress has been made to archive the Carolinas Airstream Club's historical photo albums/scrapbooks that date from the inception of the club in the 1960s to 2002. Throughout the past few decades, the albums were held by various members, the most recent of whom was John Carriker. At the 2024 International Airstream Rally, John shared the albums with CAC member Tabb Adams, who was blown away by the artifacts that the club had and that they had been saved for so many years. John stated, "When our club was first formed in 1960, our then members knew of the importance of documenting our rallies and events through pictures so that members unable to attend a particular rally would still have a visual source to refer to and see the various events that went on at that event. This was done till the last photo album was made in 2002 when we switched to a digital format."

At the 2024 International Rally, Tabb met with David Gulley, the First Vice President for Region 6, to discuss what could be done to preserve the albums. David, who works closely with ACI's Historian Joe Peplinski, said that he was starting a preservation project to scan and digitize all the historical photos—Blue Beret's along with many historical documents from the ACI/WBCCI. He invited Tabb and Ruth Adams to help with the digitizing project of the club albums. But before anything could begin, the photo albums needed some stabilization so that they could be shipped to Little Rock, Arkansas, to David's scanning business location. This is where Norma Thrower comes in, a retired archivist for the National Park Service. She offered to stabilize and scan some of the albums before they traveled out to Arkansas.

Later in 2024 at CAC's Ocean Lakes rally, the Carolinas Airstream Club albums were displayed for club members to view. Side note: the photos of album pages and the links to the albums that we've been sharing in our 2025 Tarheel Traveler newsletters are photos that Terry Sheally took of the album pages at the 2024 Ocean Lakes rally—the very same photo albums that Norma and Tabb carefully worked with!

PRESERVING OUR CLUB'S HISTORY, CONTINUED

Prior to the albums going to Little Rock, Arkansas, for permanent archival storage, Norma Thrower brought them home to complete preservation work on them. The books contain a treasure trove of CAC's history. Many of the pages had masking tape, piles of newsletter materials stapled together, and other issues that needed attention. Staples, masking tape, and scotch tape were removed, and items were reattached using archival adhesive tabs or envelopes. Norma scanned all newsletters, reports, directories, loose photos, etc. She also photographed an assortment of photographs, most notably 80 Who's Who—individual photographs of past members with their Airstreams. After the preservation work was completed, the albums were packed and carefully shipped to Little Rock, Arkansas, for additional scanning of entire pages of the books.

Tabb and Ruth Adams arrived in Little Rock in early April 2025 to start the scanning process, leading them to the next step of adding the scans to the digital archives that David Gulley is building for ACI/WBCCI. They arrived at David Gulley's business, Standard Business Systems, and were greeted by David and ACI Region 6 Membership Chair Martis Tipton, who also works for David. Martis oversees developing the system to scan the albums, and Ruth and Tabb were designated to be local club test subjects to test the system. The scanning process was very easy with the use of a tall iPad stand that held an iPad that was used to take each picture and then convert it into a PDF. It only took about 3 hours to scan all the albums as they didn't need to be taken apart; we simply flipped to each page to scan each one. Each scan was digitized and stored on their file storage system. When Tabb and Ruth were finished, they assumed their visit was done but boy were they in for a surprise! David has one of the largest collections of vintage Airstreams under roof—140 in total. To their great surprise, David gave Ruth and Tabb a private tour of his collection! They saw Airstreams ranging from the first prototype that Wally Byam had built, to two Airstreams that went on the Around the World Caravan, and one of the 33-foot Airstreams specifically built for the railroads. In total, it took 4 hours for Ruth and Tabb to tour Davids's collection. They were both blown away by the quality and quantity of vintage Airstreams in David's private museum. The albums are still in Little Rock and being secured in David's fireproof vault for the time being along with other archives from ACI/WBCCI. The plan is for ACI to have its own vault at Jackson Center along with an Airstream club museum in the old office building.



Keith and Valerie Cooke both come from a long tradition of camping. Keith's parents owned a variety of SOB (some other brand) campers and motorhomes and took countless trips across the US in those rigs. Later, as Keith's first family grew, they often camped at Disney's Fort Wilderness in their pop-up trailer—they were annual pass holders and loved every trip. Valerie's upbringing was more rugged, camping in tents throughout the wilderness of the Pacific Northwest. When their blended families came together, Val shared her dream of someday owning an Airstream. As retirement neared, they made that dream a goal: buy an Airstream and visit every US National Park.

Their dream became reality after purchasing a 2022 Basecamp in April of 2022. They named their trailer 5 O'Clock in honor of Valerie's love for Jimmy Buffett. "It's 5 O'clock Somewhere" is always on their travel playlist, so the name just felt right.

They are currently at 25 parks and counting. One of their favorite adventures was Virgin Islands National Park, although they couldn't take 5 O'Clock—that would've been quite the boat ride! Glacier National Park also holds a special place in their hearts, as it's where they were married, right next to a glacial lake.

Becoming part of ACI and CAC felt like a natural extension of Airstream ownership. Keith and Val wanted to connect with fellow travelers, learn from experienced members, and see what caravanning was all about. A personal dream of Keith's is to follow the Oregon Trail on the Nuts to Ruts Caravan as one of his ancestors was a Methodist missionary and a founding figure of the trail. They stay very active, especially when it comes to rallies. Valerie is currently chairing the CAC Anniversary Cookbook project, and they will be co-hosting the Cool Breeze Rally this June. One of the biggest lessons they learned came on their very first trip in their Basecamp when they did not properly chock the wheels before unhitching. The trailer slid forward and dropped off the blocks with a big thud. Thankfully, no damage, just a bruised ego! A 5-ton bottle jack and a bit of teamwork got them back on track. It was a humbling reminder of the importance of a solid checklist, especially when unhitching.

Keith and Val are both passionate about paddling and love taking their Hornbeck canoes out on the water whenever they can. Valerie enjoys cross-stitch and needlepoint and always has a project in hand, whether on the road or relaxing in the trailer. Keith is an avid reader—books, newspapers, technical journals—you name it—and his career in commercial nuclear power kept him up to date on political and scientific trends, and he still reads multiple newspapers daily.

One interesting fact...Valerie is a huge college football fan, and as such, their fall activities are scheduled around ESPN College Game Day and a full lineup of Saturday games.
