Cheree and I draw a lot of our inspiration from travel and camping related YouTube Channels we watch. Here are some of our favorites that have provided us with inspiration:



Keep Your Day Dream (@KeepYourDaydream) – Marc and Trish started this channel when their kids were teens, and have progressed through a number of campers before settling into Airstream life. Over the years they have visited most of the National Parks and many other cool destinations.

This past winter, I've noticed that some of our members are either new to snowbirding or thinking about what the life is like. Ralph and I have been wintering in Florida for the past eight years and we wanted to share some of the "good" and the "challenging" aspects of wintering south (or even west if that is your interest). Even now I remember the nervous feeling of leaving home knowing we wouldn't return for 4 months, now were old pros at heading south for the winter.

When asked how I plan, I talk about 5 categories of consideration: Why, When, Where, How Long and Safety/Emergency. And for getting ready, there are 2 primary points of planning: Home Prep and Home Watch which I'll talk about in a future article. I don't mention cost, as the costs

can range based on the "where and how long" decisions.

Why: Our primary motivation is our distain for winter and cold weather. We just wanted to get out of winter. We also discussed what living in <200 square feet would mean to our relationship and life style. It's a huge change and one where the positives of leaving frigid winter far outweigh the negatives of small space living.

When: This is a big one and we've learned over the years. Our first winter, we left mid December in a snow storm. To pack our Airstream, we needed a hairdryer and 200' long extension cord to defrost the door frozen in ice. The next year, we left in early December, watching the weather window through the ice belt. Those first two years of snowbirding, we had to winterize our rig — which did impact our stays as we headed south. And the dewinterization process always was an interesting one (one involved a muddy mess under the rig). Now we leave in November, don't winterize and if we want to come home for holidays, we'll fly home (which we've actually never done). Those considering heading west, have the tornado alley and Texas storm season to watch for. Our advice is to pick your departure date based on safe driving windows and whether you want to deal with the winterization processes.



Where: We knew we wanted to go south to Florida. We had no interest in the SW for winter – we wanted a guarantee of hot weather. We have friends who winter in Arizona and even SW Texas and they love that area. We roamed around Florida the first two winters, trying to find that perfect "75 degree" spot. And we found that for us the sweet spot is SW Florida. We love SW Florida, but the traffic can be a source of irritation!! Be flexible on where you want to winter but make a decision early in the year because making the advanced reservations for what is called "the season" is an absolute Must. We know some people who "wing it" but in SW Florida and the Keys, you cannot "wing it"





How Long: This is really a two-pronged question. First is the total length of time you will be gone — when do you want to return home. For us, it is the same consideration as when we leave — don't come home until winter is over and we do not have to winterize. But, get out of Florida before it becomes too hot and humid and the spring storm season begins. For us, we leave Florida in early April and we either come home directly — leaving our rig at a previously scheduled service appointment in Jackson Center (made almost a year in advance) or we take the slow route home through the Carolina and Tennessee mountains. We are almost always home by end of April.

The second part of How Long is how much you want to be moving during the winter – are you interested in a few weeks here and there or do you want a more permanent respite? In popular SW Florida and



keys, season is defined as January — March and many prioritize renters by length of stay — giving priority to longer term stays. Doing shorter stays will test your patience as you try to navigate the state parks, county parks and private park rules. And in Florida, residents have a one month advantage to make reservations — so it's even harder to get reservations for out of state residents. We didn't know where exactly we wanted to go and for two years, we roamed around Florida trying to find that perfect weather "home". After two years of competitive reservations processes, disappointing failures at getting the "perfect" reservation and understanding the Florida winter weather patterns, we decided to stay in one place for the winter — choosing to travel to another place in a more targeted way. We did end of buying an RV lot near Naples, but many of our fellow resort residents are seasonal renters — choosing to take targeted trips to Orlando or the keys, always knowing they have their seasonal rental open when they want to come back.

Safety/Emergency: There is a lot to pack into this category:

Where are we: We always make a travel itinerary and leave with family/friends. If we make a change to the itinerary we notify them. We have a specific check-in process, particularly when we are on the move. We allow our family to "follow us" on google maps and Apple Find me.

Travel Documents: We carry physical copies of our Living Wills/Power of Attorney with us (this isn't just about winter travel — we have it in the Airstream). We carry our passports and extra cash in our safe. On our phones, we have ICE indicators on our emergency contacts (ICE means In Case of Emergency) and we use the Apple Health emergency contact capabilities — most police and medical ERs are familiar with these tools. We usually have a 3x5 card in our truck for when we are traveling away from our campsite with the information about where to find the rig and who to call in an emergency — you never know where an accident will happen.

Medical: We have all our medical contacts in our phones as well as on our computer. We have our medicine lists in phone apps that can easily be accessed by emergency personnel. We are blessed to not have to camp around medical centers, but we try to know where the nearest ER or UC is to our campground. Our PCPs both do virtual visits so that give us some peace of mind. And we have a medical travel evacuation policy.

Intuition: This is about the feeling that a place may not be safe. If you don't feel safe, then don't stay. This has happened to us maybe 2-3 times in our 8 years of travel. Trust your intuition.

We love our Snowbirding life and are happy to have finally found our winter home where we have made friends that make the winter more fun. While we do miss family and friends, they can always connect with us on facetime or even come for a visit. We do NOT miss Michigan winters...
