Easy Apple Dumplings

Ingredients:

- 2 large Granny Smith apples, peeled and cored
- 2 (10 oz.) cans refrigerated crescent roll dough
- 1 cup butter
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups white sugar
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 (12 fl. oz.) can or bottle Sprite (or other soda)

Directions:

- 1) Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F.
- 2) Grease a 9x13-inch baking dish.

- Cut each apple into eight equal wedges; set aside.
- Separate crescent roll dough into triangles. Roll each apple wedge in crescent roll dough starting at the smallest end. Pinch to seal and place in the prepared baking dish.
- 5) Melt butter in a small saucepan over low heat. Stir sugar and cinnamon into melted butter until combined. Pour over apple dumplings, followed by soda.
- 6) Bake in the preheated oven until golden brown, 35 to 45 minutes.
- 7) **ENJOY!!!**
