

Hello Region 9!

I wanted to share a little about myself for those who don't know me. I'm a second generation Airstreamer, my parents Johnny & Wilda Wadle bought their first Airstream in 1976 and became members of the West Texas Unit of WBCCI in 1977. They traveled all over the good ol' USA and Canada until they were no longer able due to health reasons in 2009. My brother Lonny Wadle joined the club in 2004. My parents' BRN was 1308, mine was 13081 and my brothers was 13082.

My late husband Harvey Knezek and I bought a 1976 Airstream from my aunt and uncle in July of 1998 and joined the Texas Tropical Trail Unit in August. I served as 1st VP in 1999 and President in 2000. Unfortunately, the TTTU lost members and disbanded in 2007, when we joined the Texas Alamo Unit. I served as 2nd VP 2008, 1st VP 2009 and then President in 2010. Harvey passed away in October 2010, and this club got me through some very dark days.

I served as Region 9 2nd VP in 2011, 1st VP for 5 days in 2012, and President 2012-2014, Membership Chair 2018. I also served as the International Recording Secretary for President Tye Mott in 2022.

I married Gary Shelton April 4, 2015, and we loaded the Airstream to spend our honeymoon traveling Route 66! We spent 50 days on the road from Chicago to LA ending up in Quanah, at the first Texas for the Texas Country Air Rally for the last 7 days. We have attended seven International Rallies beginning in 2016.

I am honored that Tracy Elkins, Anna Brandon and Tim Ebbers have asked me to be the Region 9 Historian! I love this club and want to make sure that its wonderful history isn't lost. I am looking forward to gathering some really great stories and paraphernalia you are willing to share.



Maintenance Alert

During the Big Easy Caravan, the Caravan leader had a never lube bearing fail on his 30' Classic Trailer as we pulled into the RV park in New Orleans. Shortly before the caravan, the brakes were replaced on this trailer by a mechanic and it appeared that when the wheel hubs were reinstalled, the axle nut was significantly over torqued above the Dexter torque spec of 150 ft-lbs with a +/- 5 ft-lbs tolerance. When you have a bearing failure, the challenge is finding the correct replacement hub and bearing for your trailer as there are 3 axle shaft diameters depending upon the size of you trailer and they generally are only available from Dexter. Our leader was fortunate to find the necessary parts at Foley's Airstream in Alabama.

I'm raising this issue because I've been on four caravans since we bought our current trailer with never lube bearings and this is the second time we had to pull a hub. On our first caravan, we have a total failure of the right front brake. Fortunately, Vernon had the tools to pull the hub so we could remove the brake backing plate and reinstall the hub. We drove with three brakes without issue until we could get parts from Dexter. I know several other Airstreamers who had similar brake failures with Dexter breaks.

Recommendations.

- 1. When you have work done on your trailer requiring the brake hubs to be pulled, make sure the axle nuts are installed with a torque wrench to achieve the required 150 ft-lbs of torque.
- 2. Inspect your wheel bearing regularly.
 - a. Do a visual inspection looking for excessive amount of grease coming out of the bearing.
 - b. When you stop on the road, check to make sure one hub is not getting significantly hotter than the others.
 - c. Once a year jack up the trailer and check each wheel to make sure there is not an excessive amount of play. When in doubt, get the hubs checked by knowledgeable tech.
- 3. Consider carrying the tools required to pull the hub. This is particularly important on long caravans in remote areas.
 - a. The axle nut requires 1 7/16" socket and a large break over bar to remove. NAPA has this socket with a ½" drive that works with most torque wrenches.
 - b. A torque wrench that has a 200 ft-lb or larger capacity, so you can accurately torque the nut.

Thanks Tom for this valuable information! Let's all be safe on the road.


