
Our Members' Travels Spring Camping in Colorado 2025

We had a great time, and headed home on Friday.








What the Club Means to Me

You see, I'd a minor health problem upon our return from the International Rally in Wyoming. It felt minor to me, but the doc's wanted me confined to the hospital while they



determined how to fix my heart. In the end, I didn't leave the hospital until they had completed a triple bypass and our fall camping got canceled. Anyway, in early spring we took a trip to South Carolina to join our friends from the North Carolina Club for a campout. When we got home from that trip, we were able to go on a couple of trips to our favorite State Park, Wyalusing.



On the 15th, we were looking forward to ten days at our second favorite State Park, Parrot. Like Wyalusing, it is on the Mississippi River, and like Wyalusing, it makes for a great spring birding trip. Our two kittens were beginning to adjust to spending time in the Airstream, and Ruby was eager to go whenever we packed for a trip. In the morning, I walked into the bathroom, pee'd and as I turned to go to back to the bedroom and get dressed, I fell flat and couldn't move. Lynne thought I was playing some sort of weird trick, until I convinced her that I couldn't even use my arms to roll over. In practical terms, it causes the signals from your brain to not follow the proper pathways. Like taking an electrical wire and pulling off the

plastic coating, the current goes wherever it can. Fortunately, my initial bout wasn't devastating, and in a week, I began to recover some use of my legs. Unfortunately, I had a second attack and that left me paralyzed to the point of not being able to move anything but my head. Six months later I was finally released from the hospital. Lynne had come to visit me every day and I received excellent care from the staff at the VA hospital in Madison. When I was released, I could walk a very short distance with a walker, but not much else.

Throughout this ordeal, one of the things most missed was traveling in our Airstream.
We'd remained signed up for the Polar Bear caravan, but I recently admitted that I remain too limited to join that adventure.
We hope that before the end of this year we will be able to join you at one of the club functions and also hope we can restart our camping adventures. There are many things



that are important in our lives, but the joy of using our Airstream and joining the club functions is high on the list of things that we have missed. Please take heed of this simple reminder, "Don't take your Airstream adventures for granted, you never know when life will throw you a curve".

Flamingos and Flamingo References Now Forbidden in WISC-UP

early and plan on it taking the whole evening, but a very pleasant place to spend that evening. Oh, and we also ran into an old friend of Ed's - the badger!
















Repairs, Restorations, Upgrades & Cool Airstream Things
