### Gator Haven Rally at Brazos Bend State Park **Rally Report**





### **Tech Tip**

### If Refrigerators Could Talk

I've been asked several times lately how I like my 12volt refrigerator in our 2023 Classic. My answer is always, "We love it!" Why might you ask?

I'm no fridge expert but it is great because you don't need propane, you can turn it on before you leave home, it gets cold quickly, and we don't have to lug a cooler around any longer! I like it so much, I'm going to investigate if our 1972 Tradewind can be retrofitted for a 12V fridge! When we purchased it in December, it was one of the negatives (gas or electric) but now I've got the bug to convert it to 12V. I watched a video today and there are companies out there that convert an absorption fridge (gas and electric) to 12V or you can buy and have installed a new 12V fridge.

One thing I would recommend is that you have enough battery power to make it worthwhile, and you also have some sort of solar system to keep the battery charged. Lastly, unless you're an expert, don't do this at home folks. Make sure you take your rig to a shop that does this type of thing for a living. Do your homework and I know you will have great success!
