Pet Story #1: Meet Elvis

Many NTxAC members have met Elvis, the gentle Beagle who belongs to **Edward** and **Tiffany Wilson**. He attends more rallies than most of us and is a seasoned veteran of Airstream life. Here's Elvis's story in his own words:

I was 9 years old, and my brother Sparky was 14 years old when our family got our Airstream travel trailer. Other than trips to a pet store, a family member's house, or a coffee shop Sparky and I had never really travelled. We had an adjustment period learning to ride in the truck, but we LOVED being in the trailer and every destination we went to. My parents were a little embarrassed when they took the two of us around other camp dogs because Sparky woud bark and I would bay as loudly as I could at the other dogs. Sadly, in May of 2022 after about a year of traveling together, we lost my brother Sparky at the age of 15. This was a huge adjustment for my parents and me.



In November of 2022 our family went to our first North Texas Airstream Club Rally at Oakdale Park in Glen Rose, Texas. I didn't quite understand why the other dogs were playing together and often tried to "regulate" their activities. Joining the Airstream Club really opened the door to so many traveling opportunities for our family! We've now been members of the club for about 2 and a half years. During this time, I've traveled to so many cool places! Here are some of the states I've traveled to: New Mexico, Utah, Idaho, Montana, Wyoming, Colorado, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Florida, Tennessee, Arkansas, Missouri, Kansas, and Oklahoma. I discovered that I really enjoyed meeting and making new pup friends, too! I love getting to go to rally rooms or sit around the campfire with other club members as they often sneak a treat to me while we're hanging out!

During the Fall of 2023 my parents noticed I was starting to slow down and wasn't baying as much as I used to. In March of 2024 I was diagnosed with Thyroid cancer. Thankfully, there was a good prognosis, and I had my thyroid removed in April of 2024. This motivated my parents to continue to give me as many adventures as possible. My shoulder started bothering me this Spring so my parents took me to see my doctor. Unfortunately, my doctor told me I had a different type of cancer this time. It's harder for me to go on long walks, so my parents got me a really sporty pet trailer to stroll around in while we're camping. Health issues are really hard to go through, but they won't stop me from enjoying every moment I can! I love every minute of our camping adventures!

There are over 40 rigs already signed up for the Second Annual Joint Rally on Lake Murray next year in April.


O: How do I know?
