

Our preferred loop will be Sycamore Loop (10 electrical sites). Whiteoak Loop (3), etc. Water and sewage hookups are not available at the sites; however, there are multiple freshwater spigot stations throughout the park and the clean bathhouses offer toilets & hot showers.

Kings Mountain State Park Review submitted by Charlie Purser (BRN 28742)



We stayed at Kings Mountain State Park (KMSP) during the 2025 *Silver* in the City rally. I wanted to scout the park out as a potential PSAC rally site.

KMSP is an older park with a lot of history (see below). It seems SC is investing money in the park and modernizing things. Loop two of the campground seems to be the current focal point.

Sites 90-95 are newer and have 50 amp, as well as retaining walls, fresh gravel, etc. I would recommend those sites. They also have a new bathhouse near those 5 sites. We stayed at site #30 as we were not familiar with the park.

Only complaint I had is the dump station setup. They have two stations, and both were a mess (muddy, leaking faucets, tight entry/exit, etc.) They were built on gravel, and all the running water has created a big swampy mess. I hope they address that as it is a concern! The dumpsters and recycling bins are located in front of the dump stations.

The park has some good hiking and running areas. Based on my walkaround review, the best overall RV sites are: 71, 88, 89, 90, 91, 92 and 93.

Covered picnic table areas are plentiful and would be great for group meals, events, etc. Some are large and could accommodate 50+ people.

The park is very quiet and peaceful. The long entrance into the park provides separation from everything else. A 15-mile drive from York and very close to I-85.

Kings Mountain State Park was developed by the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC), a New Deal Program created by President Franklin D. Roosevelt. The program was designed to provide employment during the Great Depression while addressing national needs in conservation and recreation.

The CCC was instrumental in the development of many of South Carolina's State Parks. A number of buildings built by the CCC in the 1930's are still in use at this park.

- In 1934, 6,141 acres were donated by the US Government. In 1995 several land donations included: 268.5 acres donated by the Peeler Foundation; 109.9 acres donated by Carpenter, 33.27 acres donated by Van Dyke. Also in 1995, 332 acres were purchases from Whiteside.
- •A popular attraction at Kings Mountain is the Living History Farm, a replica of a mid-19th century Yeoman Farm. The farm has a house, barn, cotton gin, farm animals, blacksmith and weave shop as well as a garden. For a lower-class Yeoman Farmer, it was essential to grow their own food for the family and animals, make their own medicines from herbs and grow enough cotton to make clothes. Visitors to the Living History Farm will see a variety of heirloom species of crops and herbs in the garden, in addition to fruit trees and a small grape vineyard. (the Living History Farm is very close to KMSP Campground, on the same entry road)

Airstream Caravans are another way to travel in groups with other Airstreamers. "At a weekend rally you meet new people, on a caravan you are likely to make life-long friends" (https://airstreamclub.org/events/caravan-exploration/caravan-information-members).

Airstream caravans have a rich history, starting with Wally Byam's first caravan in 1951. Wally Byam lead the first caravan from Texas to Nicaragua. A magazine picked up the caravan story and soon 63 brave Airstreamer trailers showed up to start the trip. The route was challenging (no google maps or

GPS) and the roads often almost impassible. This was the beginning of group travel for Airstream owners, and it's been a fun tradition ever since.

1/4 - 1/2 Red Onion, chopped


1 Tomato, vine ripe, chopped
