The Big Silver Car Carrier: Willy's Scary Adventure

What started out as a stressful trip to the vet for a dental cleaning, became a very scary journey in Willy's life, and for his human staff, too. Willy was a feral kitten adopted by Larry, and named after the killer whale in the "Free Willy" movie. But like any movie, that's only make-believe. After taking him to the vet to treat a very serious leg wound, there was nothing "free" about this kitten anymore. Willy quickly adapted to being leash trained and slowly acquired house manners. Willy is now thirteen years old and lives with his cell mate Sable in the garage, his kingdom plus all of the outdoors.

Shortly after the dental procedure began, the vet called to say that they discovered a large growth in the back of Willy's mouth, which in her experience was most likely cancerous, inoperable due to the location. She spoke of palliative care - we were stunned.



After a day of thinking, then some research on the internet, we left a message for our regular vet to call and enlighten us. They considered this tumor is inoperable because of its proximity to the larynx and would require overnight care not available in Bismarck. Fargo has a 24-hour Emergency Vet Hospital, highly recommended. Our vet arranged a referral for a consultation on April 15 (yep, Tax Day), with surgery tentatively scheduled for the next day.

Now the logistics of traveling with a sick, medicated cat. The Big Silver Cat Carrier. This would certainly be the earliest we ever de-winterized, but staying overnight in a hotel did not appeal. Willy was never a good traveler, howling all the way to the vet and home. The West Fargo Fairgrounds, close to the Vet Hospital, may or may not be open. Wanda and Rolly kindly agreed to let us park at their farm if the fairground was not an option – Thank you Wanda and Rolly for easing one stress.

We thought long and hard about how to "cat-proof" the Airstream. There are a lot of crevices that a frightened and determined cat could squeeze through, some which could require de-riveting to extricate the varmint. A large dog kennel and pillows stuffed into the crevices would have to do. Willy settled down after the first fifty miles, sort of. The surgeon inspired confidence, though not giving any false hopes. We decided that, while the surgery might kill Willy, we knew the tumor definitely would. The people at the Vet Hospital were so kind and helpful. We got updates during the surgery, which he survived with flying colors! In the meantime, were able to visit with some old friends and unload some club stuff on President Jeff. The hospital staff even sent a photo at 2 am of Willy watching goldfish swim across an iPad screen.

We decided to stay an extra day after Willy was released to make sure he was travel-ready. In the Airstream, Willy really liked going from window to window to look out...continuing through the night, digging into everything. About 4 am, he managed to tunnel down into the sofa, so that had to come apart. The humor was lost on his human staff, so it was cat jail time.

The trip home was long – that rear seat is not so good on an old lady's back. All in all, Willy's traveling and Airstream time went better than envisioned, but not likely to ever be repeated. He is doing OK now. Pathology determined squamous cell carcinoma, so it will likely return someday and will be his demise.But we have his companionship for a little while longer. Willy takes care of us and we take care of him, that's how it work.
