Keep the pictures coming in for "Where is the Riveted Peach?" We have had some really good pictures from all over the place.

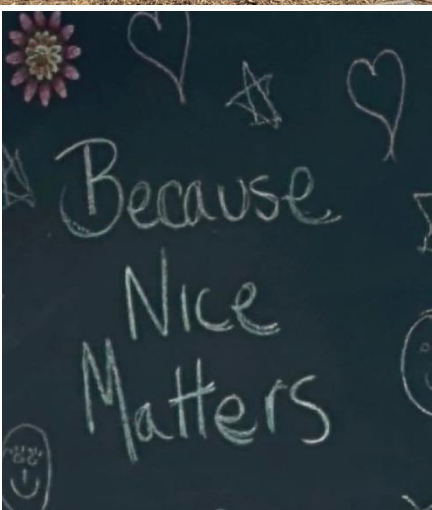
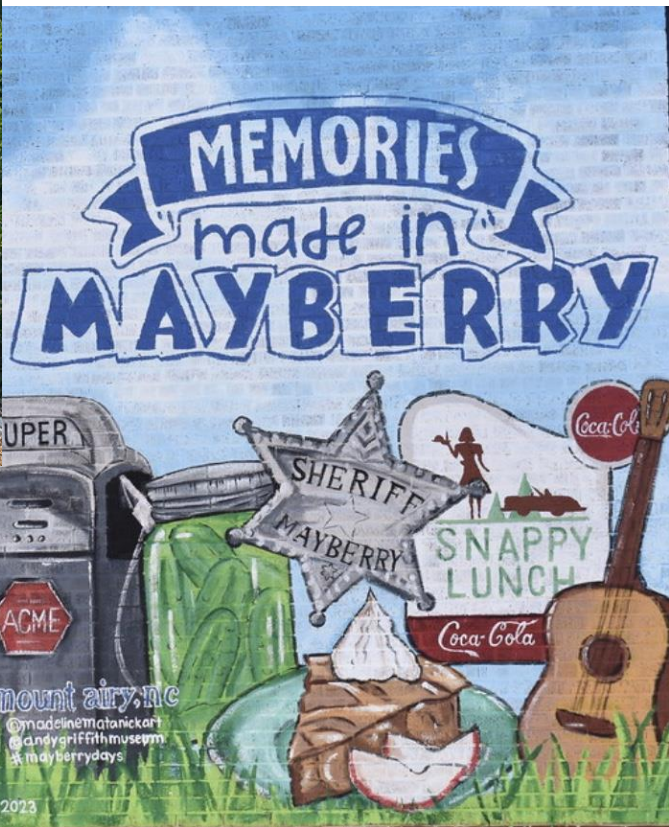

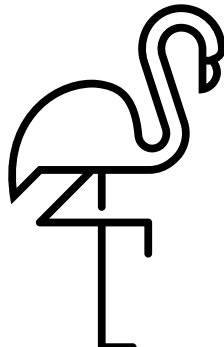

Driveway to Driveway: A Journey Fueled by Love, Miles, and Meaning

On June 20, 2025, we rolled out of our driveway in Oviedo, Florida, with a full tank, two open hearts, and one simple goal: be in Silverdale, Washington by July 6 to report for a work assignment at Bangor Naval Station. Everything in between that was up to us. Yes, we travel together and work together. Thirty-three days, nearly 9,000 miles, and 15 unforgettable overnight stops later, we pulled back into that same driveway—not just older in mileage, but richer in memories, deeper in love, and more grateful than ever for the road that led us there. This wasn’t just a road trip. It was a love story in motion. A celebration of living in the moment, sharing the journey, and choosing presence over pace.

The Road Out West

We began our adventure with a one-night stop just outside Atlanta at Harvest Moon Campground (June 20–21). It wasn’t glamorous, but it was perfect. A quiet place to rest, reset, and toast to the journey ahead. From there, we traveled to Lexington, KY, spending the night at Bespoken Spirits (June 21–22), a Harvest Host that kicked off our Bourbon Trail journey with great pours and warm hospitality. We then settled in at Elkhorn Campground in Frankfort, KY (June 22–26), giving us several days to dive deep into the Bourbon Trail. Distillery by distillery, sip by sip, we weren’t just tasting bourbon—we were tasting life.

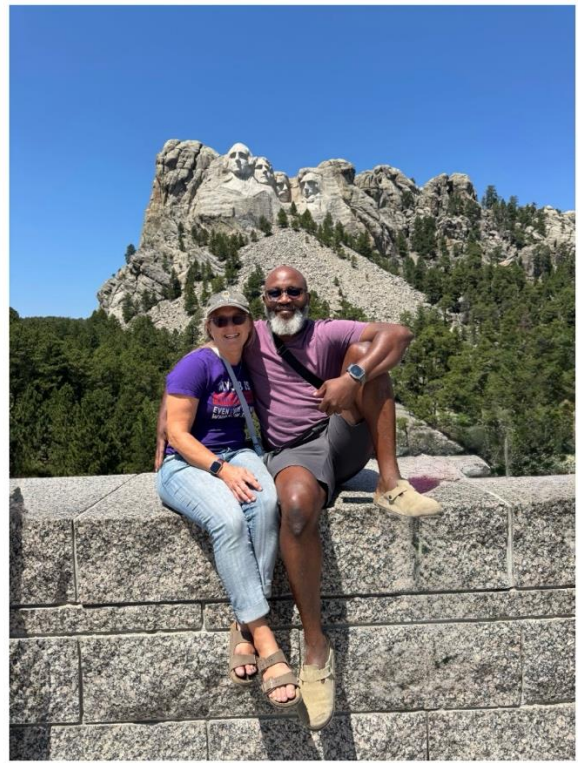

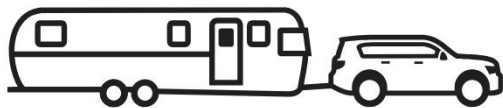

The Final Stretch

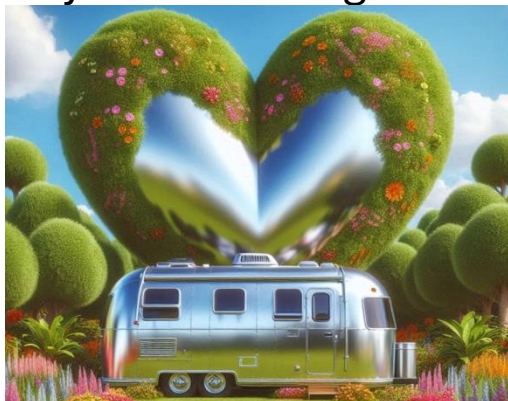

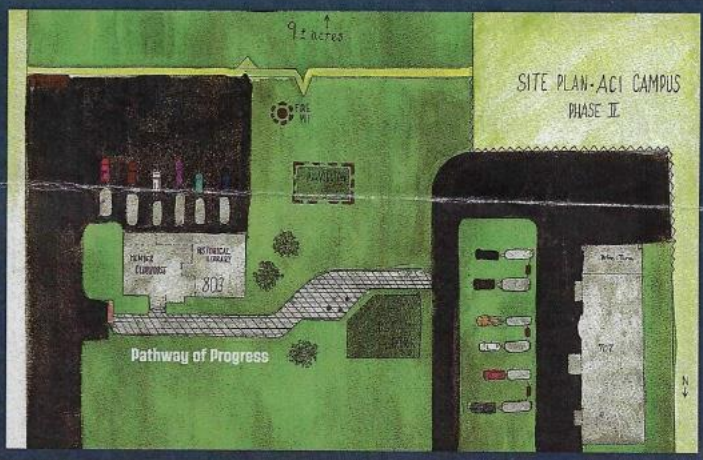

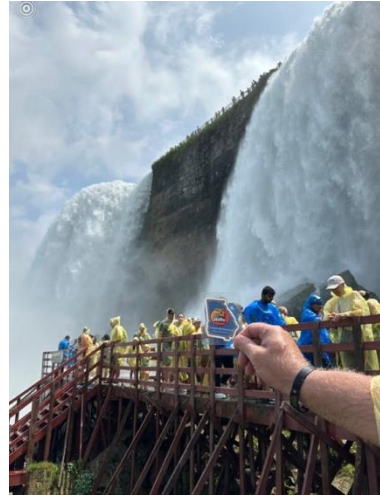

OLD-FASHIONED CHURN PEACH ICE CREAM

COURSE: DESSERT, DESSERT & SWEETS RECIPES

This old-fashioned churn peach ice cream recipe uses an ice cream machine, creating creamy and rich home made ice cream.

EQUIPMENT

- Automatic Ice Cream Maker
- Bags of Ice
- Rock Salt
- Freezer-safe container with tight-fitting lid

INGREDIENTS

- 1 pound peaches sliced with pit removed
- $\frac{3}{4}$ cup sugar
- 2 cups whipping cream
- 1 cup milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon salt

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Place peaches and sugar in a blender and pulse until thoroughly mixed. Let stand for ten minutes.
2. Add cream, milk, vanilla, and salt to blender. Blend until smooth and thickened slightly – just under 30 seconds.
3. Pour into churn-based automatic (preferably) ice cream machine and churn – following the manufacturer's instructions until thick.
4. Transfer to a freezer-safe container with a tight-fitting lid. Freeze immediately for up to two hours and up to one month.
