AKA "The Silver Screen Rally"

If you love nature and adventure, you will find some amazing things to do in Lone Pine, CA. It's still somewhat of a "hidden gem town" in California! Sandwiched between the Sierra Nevada Mountains to the west and the Inyo Mountains to the east, the tiny town of Lone Pine sits nestled in the Owens Valley in eastern California.

Lone Pine is known for its spectacular setting at the base of the Sierra Nevada peaks. Here you will find the beautiful rock formations of the Alabama Hills, the exciting drive up to Whitney Portal, and the Museum of Western Film History in town. Lone Pine's western vibe is undeniably appealing!



Exploring the Alabama Hills is without a doubt one of the top things to do in Lone Pine. It's more than 18,000 acres of rugged but stunning scenery! The Alabama Hills are also the location where many movies and commercials have been filmed.



The Museum of Western Film History holds an impressive collection of American western movie memorabilia, old cameras, sci-fi figures, and other movie props, and is a mustvisit. The most important movie filmed in and around Lone Pine is director Raoul Walsh's High Sierra (1941),

starring Humphrey Bogart. We'll have two movie nights featuring both "High Sierra" and the sci-fi movie "Tremors."

Whitney Portal Road, that goes from Lone Pine to about half-way up Mount Whitney, is one of the most spectacular drives in the Eastern Sierra. At 14,505 feet tall, Mount Whitney is the highest peak in the contiguous United States. The road has been featured in a couple of movies: High Sierra and The Long, Long Trailer.

Just a 10-minute drive to the north of Lone Pine along US Highway 395 is the Manzanar National Historic Site. In 1942, in a dark chapter in US history, more than 110,000 Japanese Americans or resident aliens were ordered held in camps in remote areas for the course of WWII. Manzanar was one of ten such camps. Today you can see a short film called Remembering Manzanar, and take a self-guided tour of the exhibits.



Owens Lake, located just a few minutes south of Lone Pine, is a fabulous place to go birding if you visit in the spring or the fall. The lake had run dry because of water diversion, but in the last several years, the lake bed has been shallow-flooded to control dust, bringing back bird populations.

It is under a 2-hour drive from Lone Pine to Furnace Creek, the heart of Death Valley National Park. Or, visit the Ancient Bristlecone Pine Forest in the White Mountains to see the oldest living organisms on earth. Or go climbing at the world-famous Buttermilk Boulders. There is so much to do in and around the area that the rally will be over before you have a chance to see it all! Plan accordingly.

Registration for this rally is via the usual Jotform process. Registration opens at 9 a.m. on September 1st, 2025. At that time, you may access the NorCal Jotform Portal for the Lone Pine Rally:

PLEASE DO NOT SUBMIT MORE THAN ONE JOTFORM for any one rally as multiple jotform submissions make it difficult for the registrar and others. If you make a mistake or have new information to add, directly contact the registrar with your changes via wbccinorcal.registrar@gmail.com.

Attendees are chosen on a first-come-first-serve basis based on the time the completed Jotform is sent to the registrar. After completing and sending the Jotform, wait for an email **from the registrar either** confirming that you are registered for the rally or informing you that you are on the rally wait list.

If you are confirmed, you may either pay for the rally via Zelle to the NorCal Airstream Club or send a check for the full amount directly to the treasurer before the deadline given to you. If you are placed on the wait list, do not pay until you hear from the registrar that you are confirmed for the rally. She will update your status via email.

Zelle is currently the preferred payment method. You must access Zelle through your banking institution's app or online platform. Most banks and credit unions offer payment through Zelle. If unsure, call your banking institution for information and instructions.

If using Zelle, make sure to add your name and rally location in the "memo" or "message" area before sending payment. If you pay by check, make your checks payable to "WBCCI/NorCal" and mail directly to

CA, 94550. Your registration is incomplete and not fully confirmed until we receive BOTH your registration and payment. Please pay by the deadline provided to you in the confirmation email or you may lose your spot. If you do not hear back from the registrar on the day you register, contact her within 48 hours via:

wbccinorcal.registrar@gmail.com.

Also contact the registrar to if you have ANY changes to your registration or wish to register after the deadline, which is September 30th. Best to email her at the email above. She will contact you as soon as she can.

Refund Policy:

The cancellation policy is 24 hours before arrival date. If you need to cancel within that time frame there will be a fee of one night's stay. If it's within the rally dates of Nov. 5 - 9th the fee is \$65, if it's outside of those dates the fee is \$75 per night.

Pet Policy: Please abide by the NorCal Pet Policy. In addition, the RV Park has it's own rules.

Well-behaved owners may accompany their dogs, 2 dogs maximum please.

Dogs MUST be kept on a leash under owner supervision and may not be left unattended. Guests are responsible to "clean up" after their dog.

All dog waste must be properly disposed of in a dog receptacle.

Noisy, vicious or unruly dogs are not allowed. Boulder Creek is not responsible for, and will hold dog owners accountable for any injury or damage caused by your dog.





Next Year, the Club will hold a rally at Village RV Truckee-Tahoe (formerly Coachland RV Park). The park is centrally located off I-80 between Donner Lake, North Lake Tahoe, and Stampede Reservoir, close to Historic Truckee, the Tahoe-Truckee Bike Trail, and a myriad of hiking trails. It is 33 miles away from Reno. This is a terrific location for a rally, and a first for NorCal. September should be a great month to visit. But heads up! This is a rally where you need to make your site reservations directly with the park. That means YOU will need to CALL the park yourself and make your own site reservations starting August 25 of this year. (All Club members and affiliates were previously notified via an email blast that Registration opened beginning Monday, August 25th, 2025.) Note: If you make a reservation via the website you will not get the group rate or be able to identify yourself with the group.

What You Need to Know and Do.

- 1. First, directly access the NorCal Jotform Portal at <u>URL: https://form.jotform.com/252287759812267</u> and click on the link for the Village Camp Rally to register for this rally. If you do not complete this Jotform, you will not be registered for this rally. No money will be required to register.
- 2. **Wait** until you receive notification from the registrar that you have been confirmed for the rally. After you receive your confirmation, call the RV Park **530-625-7603** to book your site. **Identify yourself as part of the NorCal Airstream Club and that you are booking a site for the NorCal Airstream Rally September 9th 13, 2026.** You can also book dates before and after those dates, but you must identify yourself as part of the rally to get the discounted group rate. The park will hold the group sites until September 30th.
- 3. The group rate per night is \$119. The RV Park will assign you a site based on your trailer size.
- 4. Park Cancellation policy: Cancellations made 7 days before arrival will receive a full refund minus a \$25 cancellation fee plus tax. There is no refund for cancellations made after 7 days before arrival.
- 5. The RV Park's Pet Policy allows a maximum of 3 pets per site, with no dog crates or fences allowed outside. Pets are not allowed in any of the amenity areas, including the Clubhouse, pool, or Astro turf.
- 6. About 60 days out from the rally, all those registered will receive more information about the rally and any further associated costs. If for some reason you need to cancel during the year, please contact the registrar and inform her of the cancellation. wbccinorcal.registrar@gmail.com.



River Point Landing Marina and Resort is the location for the April 2026 NorCal Rally: April 8 -12, 2026. It's another new rally location for the Club, overlooking the Stockton River and offering a close vantage point to enjoy what Stockton has to offer. Check out https://www.tripadvisor.com/Attractions-g33130-Activities-Stockton_California.html

The park is requiring our group reservation six months in advance, so site **registration for this rally will open Monday, September 15, 2025**, at 9 am via the Norcal Jotform Portal: https://form.jotform.com/252277611286157

and the River Point Landing Link therein. Registration and site booking will occur in the usual manner through the NorCal Jotform process (see page 6), with subsequent notification from the registrar if you are confirmed for the rally, and timely payment via Zelle or a check sent to the Treasurer. Any further information and costs associated with

this rally will be sent to those registered 60 days in advance of the rally. There is a limit of 30 sites for this rally. Site cost is \$80 per night.

Cancellation policy: Cancel 8 or more days before arrival: Charged for 1 night; the rest will be refunded. Cancel within 7 days of arrival: No refund. No refunds for weather-related cancellations.

Pet Policy: "Please clean up after your pets. Disposal bags are located around the park. No more than 2 pets. Pets cannot be left unattended at any time and must be on a leash when not inside your RV. Aggressive pets of any breed are not permitted. The owner is responsible for any damages or injuries caused by their pets. We reserve the right to accept or reject any pets."

The Sip and Paint morning unfolded in a cheerful blend of sunshine and creativity. Novice painters, brushes in hand, captured the sweeping scenery around them, bright blooms from the table flower arrangement, or simply whatever image their imagination conjured. Laughter mingled with the rustle of paint supplies and the clink of mimosa glasses, and the air buzzed with encouragement. By the end, the tables were covered with colorful creations — each one a unique expression, and clear evidence that the morning had brought out the artist in everyone.



Next, ten of us headed to the local Pickleball venue and had a great time with lots of friendly competition. The afternoon also consisted of a private tour at the Blue Ox Millworks arranged by apprentice Mike Hammarstedt. The tour was well attended and provided an interesting peek into the history of Humboldt County. The Chips N' Dips appetizer happy hour was followed by free BBQ'd (home grown) burgers by Dean. Friday, Seafaring Airstreamers had the opportunity to climb aboard the historic Madaket and experience a relaxing voyage along the shores of Humboldt Bay. The M.V. Madaket, built in 1910 and refurbished in 1989, is the last survivor of seven original ferries that transported families and timber mill workers around Humboldt and Arcata Bays for decades. After the completion of a local bridge in 1972, which put the ferries out of business, the vessel quickly began her new life as Humboldt Bay's harbor cruise flag boat. Today, the Madaket boasts being the oldest passenger motor vessel in continuous service in the United States, the smallest licensed bar in the state, and is a California historic vessel. We were treated to an 8.5 mile cruise lasting over an hour along the Eureka Waterfront in Humboldt Bay and ventured a little way into Arcata Bay.



The ship's captain provided excellent narration including all points of interest such as the discoveries of Humboldt Bay, timber industry, wildlife, shipping, maritime history and activity, and Native American history. We spied a variety of bird species, a seal or two, and local fisherman enjoying the morning.

Friday afternoon, Dean taught one of two "Cowboy Candy" classes with the help of Sharon Paz. As a Master Food Preserver, he explained the science and deliciousness of the candied jalapeno treat.



After the class, the BYO Bourbon tasting event was held in the kitchen. Although it wasn't the same without Tom Webster, a good time was had by all, with Bob Murphy and Gary Rich filling in for Tom. Charcuterie-themed happy hour was a huge success with 4-5 lovely board put together and the BBQ was fired up again for self-service grilling. The evening ended with the nightly bonfire.



Saturday's bike ride was led by apprentice Mike Hammarstedt. It was a beautiful day in Eureka and attendees enjoyed the newly paved Eureka Waterfront Trail. Dean led his second Cowboy


