News of Note ~ Central Indiana Club Rally Fund Raises for Texas Flood Victims

Editor's Note—This article also appeared in the CIAC newsletter, but was such fantastic news we are posting in this edition also.

From Kristy Boyer

While attending our sun and fun-filled beached theme rally at Indiana Dunes this July, our hearts and minds continued to be with those impacted and lost during the July 4th devasting floods in



Kerrville, Texas, particularly the young girls at Camp Mystic and the Airstream couple who courageously helped notify and save others during their final moments.

We hosted an impromptu raffle of prizes donated by the Price, Boyer, and Martin families. 16 Airstream families, including 2 that just happened to be camping at the park from other areas, got involved and generously donated funds for the raffle. In all, we collected \$450 for flood relief. Kristy Boyer, who works for Indianapolis-based Eli Lilly, submitted the funds for a corporate 1:1 match, increasing our total donation to \$900.

Background on why Team Lilly got involved...

The devastation caused by the recent massive flooding in Central Texas is heart-



breaking. More than 1.8 trillion gallons of water fell over this area, equivalent to multiple months' rain in hours.

While all TEAM Lilly colleagues in the Kerrville area and adjacent counties have been accounted for and are safe, the death toll has surpassed 100, with dozens more residents still missing, and thousands of people left without shelter, power and basic needs.

How Lilly is helping

The Lilly Foundation will donate \$50,000 to the **Center for Disaster Philan-thropy** to support charitable efforts. This support will help communities impacted by the flooding in Central Texas.

The most unique way we can help during times of crisis is through our medicines.

The most unique way we can help during times of crisis is through our medicines. Lilly **has donated insulin and other medicines** to Direct Relief that are **prepositioned at Direct Relief's ware-house for disaster relief needs** as they arise. This allows Direct Relief to provide medicines that are urgently needed following disasters.

Following a disaster, once product needs have been assessed, **Lilly may donate medicines specifically requested by trusted relief organizations** with whom we have prior experience and who are actively collaborating with local hospitals and clinics to evaluate and prioritize needs in affected communities.

Information about product replacements for insulin or other medicines damaged or destroyed by the disaster <u>can be found on our website</u>, along with access to <u>Healthcare Ready's Rx Open portal</u>, showing open pharmacies across the U.S.


