Join us for a river cruise (minus our Airstreams) next July departing from Lyon, France. More details about this cruise are at https://airstreamclub.org/silver-river-2026



A Loss in the Airstream Family

On July 4 this past Summer the Texas Hill Country suffered devastating floods that took the lives of over 100 people. Among those lost were fellow Airstreamers Jeff and Tanya Ramsey of Lewisville, TX.

The Ramseys warned family members to evacuate the HTR campground where they were staying and left heartfelt voicemails to their children in the few moments before their Airstream trailer was swept away around 4:30 a.m.

"He left us a message saying he was not going to make it and that he loved us so much, telling us goodbye," the couple's son, Jake, told the *New York Post*. "He said, 'Buddy. I love you so much. It doesn't look like we are going to make it. Tell Rachey I love her."

Tanya's body was found by rescuers days after the flood. The couple's dog, Chloe, was found at an animal shelter a few days later and returned to family.

Tanya was described as "deeply loved" and "perfect." She had recently beaten breast cancer. At the date of this writing, Jeff's body is still missing.

Jeff called Tanya's brother and mother to warn them of the impending danger. The two, who were camping nearby, survived the floods. "He rescued them because they would have slept in and they would have washed away. That cabin was destroyed, completely underwater. He saved their lives," Jake Ramsey said.

Jeff worked with the Adaptive

Training Foundation, which helps train amputees or people in wheelchairs, while Tanya managed a wig shop in Dallas. While the Ramseys weren't members of the North Texas Airstream Club, they were members of our larger family, the Airstream community. They enjoyed the same love of adventure and travel as us, and valued friendships made with other fellow Airstreamers.

Please take a moment and send a thought or prayer toward the families of this couple.

This is a tragic reminder that ALL of us need to be prepared for emergencies when traveling. LISTEN to the forecast and take it seriously. Keep a weather radio in your Airstream. If the forecast doesn't sound good but you're enjoying a beautiful evening the day before, keep your weather radio near you. Have an evacuation plan or know how and where to exit, with or without your trailer, as you arrive

Let's honor the Ramseys and be good camping neighbors as well. If danger is near take the time to alert your fellow campers, if possible. After all, WE ARE FAMILY.

Pet Story #2: Rolling With the Pack: Airstream Life with Piper, Lollie, and Mr. Stockings

One of the greatest joys of our Airstream travel is sharing our adventures with our furry companions. For us, that means life on the road with our three dogs: Piper, our wise and loyal 11-year-old mixed breed; Lollie, a spunky 1-year-old Russell Terrier; and, our newest co-pilot, a 4-month-old bundle of energy named Mr. Stockings.

To say they love traveling is an understatement. The moment we start loading the Airstream, they stick to us like Velcro - tails wagging, eyes gleaming - because they know adventure is on the horizon, and there's no way they're getting left behind!

One of our favorite parts of traveling with our dogs is watching them explore new campgrounds. They live for sniffing new trails, greeting fellow campers, and making fast friends with other dogs. The socialization has been especially great for Mr. Stockings, who's learning the ropes from his older siblings.





We always prioritize pet-friendly campgrounds and appreciate when sites include walking trails or off-leash areas. Many fellow Airstreamers are dog lovers, too which often leads to shared stories, laughs, and travel tips around the campfire.

Years of pet travel have taught us the value of being prepared. We carry a folder with each dog's up-to-date rabies certificate and health records, which can be lifesavers during an unexpected emergency vet visit in a new town.

A vital part of our setup is our pet temperature monitor inside the Airstream. It connects via Starlink Wi-Fi and sends us alerts if the

interior temperature goes outside our preset thresholds. That peace of mind – knowing the pups are safe even when we're steps away – is priceless.

The most challenging part of traveling with three dogs, especially in the hot southern Summer, is managing the heat during checkin. Many campgrounds don't allow check-in until after 1:00 or even 3:00 pm, and by then, the temps can easily be over 100 degrees. During setup we leave the dogs crated in the truck with the engine running and A/C blasting until the trailer cools down enough for them to come inside comfortably.

As for sleeping arrangements, well... it's a bit of a circus! We have twin beds in our Airstream, and each of the little ones claims their own human bed – usually with us. Piper, our senior girl, is a bit more independent and alternates between snoozing on the sofa or stretching out on the shared dog bed we keep between our twins.





And if you're wondering who needs the most attention on the road? No surprise – it's the puppy. Mr.Stockings is the only male in the crew, and he's hands down the most needy. Typical... right?

Traveling with our dogs requires a bit more planning, but the rewards are endless. We've learned to book ahead at pet-friendly parks, scout emergency vet options just in case, and always carry extra poop bags, wipes, and dog food since some brands can be hard to find in smaller towns. But above all, we've learned that the best travel companions are the ones who are just happy to be by your side, no matter the destination. Whether it's hiking along a lakeshore, greeting neighbors at the campground, or napping under the awning while we sip morning coffee, Piper, Lollie, and Mr. Stockings remind us that life is simply better when it's shared with wagging tails and muddy paws.

Co-Editor David's Travelogue

September 2025: National Parks

Almost without fail, whenever we talk about our travels with non-Airstreaming, non-RVing family, friends, and acquaintances, we are asked which national parks we've been to. They inevitably inquire about the best-known, most visited ones—Arches, Bryce Canyon, Yosemite, Yellowstone, Grand Canyon, Grand Teton, Glacier, Zion, sometimes Acadia.

Although we've had our chances to visit some of these biggies, quite frankly, I've always felt that they are not good places for opportunistic travelers to go. You need to have a plan if you hope to avoid large, often oblivious crowds, inconsiderate and ignorant checklist-tickers, inexperienced RV renters, and crawling traffic. We have never had a plan. We always seem to be passing near these smack in the middle of the high season—just the wrong time to linger and enjoy.

Despite that, our list of National Parks, though small, is growing. Since we started Airstreaming, we've seen Yosemite (from the quieter, lesser-known, eastern entrance), Wind Cave, and Big Bend. And now, since I've debuted this travelogue, we've doubled that list. Here are some photos and comments from our latest three.

White Sands

This is a fascinating desert of powdered gypsum in Alamogordo, NM. There is a lollipop-shaped loop you can drive, but there are some "trails" you can hike which give you a better sense of the size and uniqueness of the place. Given the shifting sands, there are stakes pounded into the dunes and you walk from stake to stake. You could easily become disoriented if you lose sight of the stakes.

Great Basin

Did you know that there's a 13,000 foot mountain (Wheeler Peak) in southeastern Nevada? We didn't ... until we went to Great Basin National Park in Baker, NV. We were able to camp inside the park in our 30-ft Classic, but it was a slow and punishing journey up 3 miles of washboard dirt roads. What's more, the site was difficult to negotiate and very uneven. Not being enthusiastic spelunkers, we skipped the Lehman Caves and opted instead for the 10,000 foot elevation Alpine Lakes hike (yes, alpine lakes in Nevada; it's not just Vegas, baby). We were richly rewarded with two lakes, ancient bristlecone pines, and nice views of Wheeler Peak. The drive up to the trailhead was pretty spectacular, too.

Glacier

Finally, a big-name park. Set in northwestern Montana, Glacier offers several entrances, a spectacular drive (Going-to-the-Sun Road), miles and miles of rugged trails, numerous waterfalls and other natural, mountainous features, plus abundant wild-life. The bear warnings are as ever-present as the rattlesnake warnings in Texas state parks. Glacier abuts Canada's Waterton Lakes National Park. Together, they make up the Waterton-Glacier International Peace Park, a World Heritage Site. We camped at an RV park near the Two Medicine entrance at the southeastern edge of the park and completed a counter-clockwise navigation of the park.
