From the Editor

Greeting Airstreamers! The big news from the Editor's Corner is that there will be a new Poppy Editor next year. Give a big round of applause for Damien Scaërou who has agreed to take on the task of keeping you informed through this publication. At Clio he was given the position's flag to make it official.

There is certainly a learning curve to being Poppy Editor and it may take a bit of time for him to get up to speed, but we hope he will be ready for his debut next year. I ask that you be patient with him as he learns the ropes, and that you



are as supportive of him as you have been to me. In the meantime I remain as Poppy Editor through this year.

A lot has been going on behind the scenes since I last wrote. First VP Tom Webster has been busy fashioning a Constitutional Amendment changing the make-up of our Executive Board from four Trustees to two. It needs 2/3rds of those voting to pass. If not attending the Meeting, you will be able to vote electronically. Please see the Notice of the Special Meeting to Amend the Constitution on page 3 for further details and instructions. Electronic voting will start via an email containing the ballot sent to all Regular Members starting September 27th. Regular Members: keep a look out for that.

Second, the December Rally team of Team Matteo, Lora and Tom Broad, Fitzgerald/Doornik, along with apprentices The Roblees has been hard at work planning for the annual Christmas Rally, typically our largest and most complicated rally to put on. Their summary and cost information is on pages 7 and 8 Registration opens 9 a.m. October 1st.

Third, as RV Parks change their requirements for groups such as ours, so too must the Club adapt to the changing environment. The Rally Chair and other Committee Chairs have been meeting to discuss the best way to handle this "brave new world," and to get pertinent information to you in a timely manner via the Poppy or otherwise so that you know what is happening, while keeping the stress and strain on those involved in rally registration to a minimum, no matter who they might be.

One given is that every RV park or rally venue has different requirements for groups wishing to use their sites. As a result, every rally registration will be different. Some will follow the legacy format of rally registration opening two months in advance, others will open registration six months or even a year in advance; some will be self-registration, some not; some are difficult to work with, others quite helpful. The Rally Chair is trying to disseminate information on each individual rallies, but again, while she has confirmed the amount of sites for each rally location, she does not know the particulars from every venue at the moment. Please be patient as the Rally Chair tries to juggle all the balls in the air, and we attempt to deal with the consequences of the changing environment to the Club and its volunteers while keeping what makes NorCal rallies unique. The Chairs hope to be able to streamline the registration process as we move forward, but that currently is a work in progress. Continued page 4

The Fine Print

New info shown in green. Dates are arrival and departure for planned rally, although you can often request early arrival or Monday departure. Sign-ups are accomplished by submitting a completed Registration Jotform and payment to the Club Registrar. If a rally is full, there is a wait list. "Buddy" events allow you to invite a non-member even if they don't own an Airstream. Events lacking hosts or the minimum number of campers may be be cancelled.

Notice of Proposed Constitutional Amendment

At the beginning of 2025, a suggestion was brought to the Board that we consider reducing the size of the Board by two Trustee positions. The thought was that the Board was too large and that our built-in development track towards becoming President was too long, discouraging people from serving. As First VP, I headed a small committee to investigate the viability of such a change. After interviewing several current and past officers of the Club, it was decided to create a plan to reduce the Board size from 4 Trustees to 2 Trustees. I then moved forward and drafted a proposed Constitutional amendment to Article V, Sec. 1, which was presented to the Board at the Clio Rally Executive Board Meeting. The Board agreed to present the Constitutional Amendment to the Regular Membership for a vote.

Consequently, there will be a Special Meeting for the sole purpose of voting on the proposed Constitutional Amendment at the Tahoe Valley Campground, 1175 Melba Dr, South Lake Tahoe, Ca at 5:30 p.m. on Thursday, October 9th behind sites 235/236 (e.g. during the Tahoe Valley Rally).

The Current Language for Article V - Section 1: Officers and Their Election:

"The officers of the Club shall be Regular Members and shall consist of a President, a First Vice President, a Second Vice President, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, and four Trustees."

Proposed Constitutional Amendment for Article V – Sec. 1:

"Commencing in 2026, the officers of the Club shall be Regular Members and shall consist of a President, a First Vice President, a Second Vice President, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, and two Trustees.

All Regular members will have the opportunity to vote electronically before or in person at the meeting. (Affiliates are ineligible to vote.) A vote will be either in favor of or opposed to the above proposed amendment of Article V - Sec 1. If this amendment is passed by 2/3rds of those voting, assuming a quorum, the roster of officers will include three Trustees in 2026, then two Trustees in 2027. The current Trustees will continue serving per the Constitution and subsequent elections.

Electronic voting will start via an email blast sent to all Regular Members on September 27 and will end on October 6. Any electronic ballots sent in after that date will be invalid. Those not voting electronically will have the option to vote in person at the meeting in Tahoe. All votes will be tabulated at the special meeting in Tahoe and the results announced.

https://blog.airstreamclub.org/financedirectors-report/ The information presented is very enlightening, not only because the Club has a balanced budget for the first time in more than eight years, and has paid down its debt while increasing its reserves, but that it is including credit card fees in the costs passed on to the members, which has enabled the Club to save \$150,000. Personally, I could go on and on about the bain of credit card fees (that are used to provide loyalty points to card users, thus encouraging more use of credit cards, generating more fees that continue to increase at the consumer's expense, but that cat is long out of the bag and companies and vendors are left to deal with it. As fees and costs increase, the only option for businesses and vendors is to pass that cost onto individual consumers who in theory get the benefit of the fees. The most palpable way to do that is blend the fee cost in with the entire rally or caravan cost as the International Club is doing. New Limited Edition Airstream



You may have heard the news about the newest Airstream Trailer: The Frank Lloyd Wright Usonian Limited Edition Trailer. This trailer is built on the 28 foot trailer platform. i.e., couch in the front, bed in the rear, separate dinette on the side. But it is unique. Airstream is limiting production to 200 units, with a starting price of \$184,900.

Evidently, Airstream designers spent time at the Frank Lloyd Wright Foundation's headquarters located in Arizona, delving into the core design elements of Wright's Usonian houses. Airstream designers incorporated the iconic use of wood, light, various Wright-related patterns and furniture styles used in his Usonian houses in the 1920s and 1930s.

Some of the features are pretty cool. I love the bed that starts as twins, can become separate couches or can become a king size bed with "the push of a button." (I don't know how comfortable it is though.) The wardrobe closet looks very nice. The rear hatch in the bedroom could be a plus. And the trailer does capture the Frank Lloyd Wright architectural style, containing it in an Airstream trailer that was initially designed in the same era's as Wright's Usonian houses. Together, the design elements are attractive.

But I cannot imagine ANYONE actually using this as a travel trailer. Notice the total lack of any lockers in the trailer. Lockers, both in the front of the trailer and in the back have been completely eliminated. In their place are shelves with fancy lighting boxes "where you can display your travel souvenirs." Yeah, right. Try travelling with your "travel souvenirs" on the shelves and see how that works for you.

Lockers over the galley area are also totally gone. Where do you store your food, glassware, plates, bowls, cooking pots & utensils, odds and ends, or clothes other than in the one wardrobe is beyond me. Plus, while attractive, the inside, including the furniture does not appear sturdy enough to withstand the rigors of the road. I can easily imagine it being trashed without much effort on the owners part.

The only thing I can come up with is that buyers will purchase this or a he/she shed, B&B or ADU, where it will be permanently hooked up and never go anywhere. Or they will buy it and put in a garage for an investment only. While beautiful in a Frank Lloyd Wright sort of way, it is totally impractical as a travel trailer, imop. 

PLEASE DO NOT SUBMIT MORE THAN ONE

JOTFORM as multiple jotform submissions make it difficult for the registrar and others. If you make a mistake or have new information to add, directly contact the registrar with your changes via wbccinorcal.registrar@gmail.com. Once you submit the Jotform you will receive an automatic confirmation from Jotflorm that you completed the Jotform, with a listing of the information you submitted. This is NOT a confirmation that you are in the rally, only that your Jotform was received. If you do not receive the automatic confirmation - check spam or other email accounts where it may have been sent.

Attendees are chosen on a first-come-first-serve basis based on the time the completed Jotform is sent to the registrar. After sending the Jotform, wait for **an email from the registrar either** confirming that you got into the rally or informing you that you are on the rally wait list.

If you got in, you may either pay for the rally via Zelle to the NorCal Airstream Club or send a check for the full amount directly to the treasurer before the deadline given to you. If you are placed on the wait list, do not pay until you hear from the registrar that you are confirmed for the rally. She will update your status via email.

Zelle is currently the preferred payment method. You must access Zelle through your banking institution's app or online platform. Most banks and credit unions offer payment through Zelle. If unsure, call your banking institution for information and instructions.

If using Zelle, make sure to add your name and rally location in the "memo" or "message" area before sending payment. If you pay by check, make your checks payable to "WBCCI/NorCal" and mail directly to

Treasurer Gordon Krauter, 4672 Sarah Ct, Livermore, CA, 94550. Your registration is incomplete and not fully confirmed until we receive BOTH your registration and payment. Contact the registrar to if you have ANY changes to your registration or wish to register after the deadline, which is October 31st. Best to email her at the email above. She will contact you as soon as she can.

Cancellation Policy: Cancelling your reservation on the day of or within 3 days prior to arrival will result in no refund. Cancellations 4 or more days will receive a full refund minus the 1 night deposit.

Pet Policy: Please abide by the NorCal Pet Policy.



ATTENTION: The Board voted at the latest Board Meeting in Clio to move to a "credit card only" method of payment for rallies, if workable. There were many reasons for this, including the results of the survey offered to all members a few months ago, where a clear majority of those who responded said they didn't care about the payment method, and the lack of Zelle availability to all members.

However, before this policy becomes a reality, NorCal needs to investigate the various platforms available to it in order to offer the best deal for its members while keeping the rally transactions simple for the volunteers most impacted by rally registration such as the treasurer and rally registrar. Consequently the policy of "credit card only" will not be implemented until the investigation has been completed and decisions made on the best way to proceed. 




















