

I think a visit to this mansion is worth the time, if you are in the neighborhood.



Here are the details from webmaster John Cooper.

When you click on the link in the Airstream Club International web site, it sends you to the login page for our site. Our login is not the same as Airstream Club International. It is a different web site, and we don't have access to your login credentials on the Airstream Club International site. We added the login step because we added our club directory to our web site and no longer print it the way we did in past years. The login protects our directory information from people outside our club.

Everyone who wants to register for a Wisc-UP event will have to set up an account on our website. You can do this by clicking on the "Sign-up" menu option at the top right of the screen or by clicking on the "Need to sign up?" link below the log in information.



You can use the same password here that you use on the Airstream Club International (ACI) site, but be aware that there is no shared login information between the two sites. In other words, changing your password on the ACI site will not change it on our site, and changing it on our site will not change it on the ACI site. I would recommend keeping them different.

Member Update!

Steve Piotrowski (BRN 2900) Shares Health Update Through a Facebook Post



I have cut way back on my use of Facebook but I thought I would try this as a way to make a widespread summary of recent events. I am still fighting to recover from Guillaume Barre Syndrome, having regained most of my strength and feeling except for my legs below the knees. I had been going to the gym and working in the warm water pool for the last six months. The water supports me and lets me stand in spite of the limited feeling in my feet. I also was taking six to eight block walks around our neighborhood with the aid of two walking sticks. On the 18th of July, I started out on my walk and got a half block. From then on I do not remember a thing. I was told that Tom, one of our neighbors saw me leaning against his fence and looking odd. He came out in time to see me collapse, and immediately called 911. They helped lead him through CPR (he had not had a class in a long time), and he worked on me until a neighborhood woman who was a pharmacist at the VA came by and took over. I had gone into full cardiac arrest, and without their quick action I would be dead. I spent the next ten days in the hospital (the first few in an induced coma) and had a CID (Cardiac Implant Device) installed. It is a device that both acts as a pacemaker and will shock you if you go into erratic rhythm. I am home now, my heart function is very low, and the docs hope that with time and medication I can get better and resume normal life. I don't really know why I am writing this, other than to let people know what happened. I plan on recovering, but know it will take time. Getting old is a bitch. And in advance thanks for your well wishes and good thoughts.

A new experience was an early morning photo tour. Notice the photo with the rainbow at Yellowstone Falls! That only happens for about 10 minutes each morning!


Our route home followed the same path. A great trip!

AHOY There Ye Mates! Welcome aboard the Festival of Sail where the Pirates abound and ships are massive! The Tall Ships Festival was held in the spectacular downtown Harbor Plaza on the shores of Lake Superior. Saturday of the Rally was set aside for those that wanted to experience the Festival which did not disappoint. The harbor was lined with beautifully restored tall ships that you could walk aboard and interact with the crew. Some of the ships were for chartered short harbor cruises and others were for climbing aboard to explore. Rick & I were excited to step aboard the Pride of Baltimore as we were both raised near Baltimore. Of particular interest was the USCG Cutter Sundew, now privately owned and operated. The ship is under continuous restoration by a volunteer crew who also were very knowledgeable and entertaining

tour guides. Very interesting history in this area for ice breaking in the winter to keep the large cargo ships moving. The other Museum ship, the William A. Irvin, an ore cargo ship, was open to tour as well. The ship has a rich history of transporting 14,000 tons of ore through the great lakes and historic storms. The tour included the mighty engine area, the gallies, the cargo holds and

the not to be missed three story pilot house where the captain and the elite traveled.

The famous Lift bridge was in action as we

were onboard one of the tall ships! Such an engineering marvel to watch the bridge raise and let the massive cargo ships pass.

And as if not to be left out, what do you know, there appeared an Airstream coffee stand! They must have known we were coming!

The group toured the spectacular Glensheen Mansion on Friday. The 12-acre estate features gardens, bridges, and the famous 39-room mansion built with remarkable 20th-century craftsmanship, telling the story of the Duluth region. Chester and Clara Congdon built Glensheen between 1905 and 1908 as their home. This

influential family is known for opening up iron mining in this region and setting aside land for public use, such as the North Shore Scenic Highway and Congdon Park. The Congdons wanted to preserve as much of the natural beauty of the property as possible and make the estate self-sufficient, which required plans for a large vegetable garden, a greenhouse, an orchard, a cow barn and a water reservoir. So that the landscaping would not be marred, all utilities came into

the mansion, the carriage house, the boathouse, and the gardener's cottage underground. The water, gas, and power lines were run through a tunnel from London Road. Water used for the grounds was diverted from Tischer Creek into a 60,000-gallon reservoir located between Superior Street and London Road, which is still in use today. The pier on the estate was the largest private pier on Lake Superior and the only one shown on navigational maps of the lake. Glensheen was donated to the University of Minnesota and opened as a historic house museum in 1979 and maintains each and every room and all the gardens to its authenticity. I had to ask about the working vegetable garden and was told by a gardener, the food is all donated to the local area. IF you are ever in the area, don't miss this tour!

Hippie bus and Volkswagen Beatle. The bus driver is not original!











Chuck did attend two Brewer games, one at Wrigley Field (first time there). Janet took granddaughters to the Waukesha County Fair.





Member Update. Jeff & Caryle McCaffrey (BRN 1025) A New Puppy and Face Health Issues

After we lost Toby, our 12 year old Cairn Terrier last September 2024 it was too quiet in the house so we started to look for

another dog. We found a breeder in Woodstock, IL who had a puppy available. We brought MacTavish home in March. The breeder also runs a dog training business so we took him to Puppy and beginning obedience classes. All that said it took time away from our camping season. We got out for two trips which he did great in the converted kid's Burley trailer.



When we returned from the second trip to Eagle Cliff Campground in Lanesboro, MN I experienced a droopy lip on the left side of my mouth. We went to Immediate Care where they screened me for Bells Paulsey but the PA said I'm not seeing it, you need to go to ER to get checked out. At the ER they did a CT scan and discovered a mass in my brain which was pressing on the facial nerves. I met with a neurosurgeon who said he needed to remove the tumor. In a nine and a half hour procedure he got 95% of it. Unfortunately it turned out to be a high-grade stage 4 Glioblastoma tumor which is incurable but treatable.



I got the staples out two weeks after the August 6th surgery. I start radiation and chemo therapy September 10th. I'm also participating in a Clinical Study using an anti-rejection drug used for transplant patients. It's supposed to make the tumor cells more accepting to the chemo which they're resistant to. The radiologist said "I need to tell you the life expectancy is 1-2 years". I'm planning to last longer as Caryle and I have more Airstream adventures to do. We'll see how the treatment goes but have talked about selling the truck and trailer if things don't work out. Right now I'm feeling great and anxious to get started with the treatments. We're shut down for camping until next spring.


What I Did On My Summer Vacation 2025 "Gertie" The Excella Gets Out!
