Ingredients:

2 cups whole wheat flour

¼ cup oats

¼ cup raisins

¼ teaspoon cinnamon

5 tablespoons margarine

3-4 tablespoons sugar

½ teaspoon salt

1 egg

1 teaspoon baking powder

½ teaspoon baking soda

½ cup milk (may need to add more to make sticky)



Directions:

Mix dry ingredients. Cut in margarine. Add egg, milk, then raisins. Flour board and pat down about 1 and ½ inches thick. Cut with biscuit cutter. Bake at 475* degrees for 8-10 minutes. *or 450 degrees, depending on your oven



FROM THE TREASURER

CAC 2025 Treasurer's **Annual Report to Members**

Since the Carolinas Airstream Club (CAC) was established in 1960 it has been registered as a not-for-profit organization, 501(c)(7), for government reporting purposes. The 501(c)(7) designation indicates that our organization exists to benefit our members.

The financial health of our club is overseen by the Executive Officers and Board of Directors who receive a detailed financial statement each month from the Treasurer. At the beginning of each year, the newly elected Officers and Board Members work to establish an operating budget for the year. The committee uses data from previous years to build the financial framework for the club's operations.

The club has two primary sources of funding, membership dues and rally fees. Traditionally, the largest expenditure for the club is the reimbursement of rally expenses to the rally hosts. Another significant budget item is the purchase of gift cards for rally hosts. A gift card is presented to the hosts as a small token of the club's appreciation for the time and effort that goes into making each rally a success.

By the end of the 3rd quarter of 2025, CAC had collected over \$4,000 in membership dues and over \$29,000 in rally fees. Our current checking account balance is in the \$33,000 range.

It should be noted that the amount of rally fees collected this year is atypical for the club. This increase in collected fees is a result of two of the rallies, Ocean Lakes and Biltmore, charging a higher rally fee to cover planned activities. The checking account balance will drop significantly when the expenses for Ocean Lakes and Biltmore are paid. However, the club will remain in good financial shape heading into 2026.



The Adventures of \$ir Cost A Lot

If you've ever wondered how one couple could own *three Airstreams* in three years, pull up a camp chair — you're in for a treat! Robin and Russ are no strangers to the camping life. Before discovering Airstreams, they were already pros at restoring vintage beauties, such as a **1949 Boles Aero**, a **1963 Shasta**, and a **1973 Baby Bell**. So, when they found themselves driving past the Seattle Airstream dealer one fateful day, Russ made the innocent suggestion: "Let's just take a look." Robin's response? Pure wisdom: "If we go in there, we're coming out with one." And boy, was she right.

They walked out the proud owners of a 2019 23' International Rear Corner Queen — shiny, new, and full of promise. That is, until the nightly obstacle course of climbing over each other to get to the bathroom set in. Three months later, it was out with the old and in with a 2020 25' Flying Cloud Rear Twin — problem solved! Or so they thought...at a rally, their dealer rolled in with a 2021 Ultimate Airstream Grand Salon 25' Front Twin Globetrotter, and it was love at first sight. The Flying Cloud didn't stand a chance, "Three trailers in three years...whew!"

Why ACI and CAC? Robin and Russ joined Airstream Club International (ACI) as soon as they bought their first trailer — because everyone said it was *the* best way to meet other Airstreamers and dive into the rally scene. Fast-forward to 2024 — after moving from Seattle to North Carolina, they joined Carolinas Airstream Club (CAC) to find a new community. "We had such wonderful friends out west," they said, "and CAC has been just as warm and welcoming!"

Making the Most of It- They attend as many rallies as they can — and they don't just show up, they *pitch in*. "Helping out and getting involved is part of the fun," they shared. "The people are incredible, and the rallies are always fantastic."

☐ Their previous Airstream, a Flying Cloud, was affectionately known as Ollie Luminum. Clearly, creative naming is part of the adventure!

Lessons from the Road: Robin and Russ's best advice? Slow down and take the scenic route. "Get off the interstates! Wander into small towns, eat at local spots, and skip the chains and big-box stores. That's where the magic happens." They've also learned that towing an Airstream is a bit like giving your house a constant earthquake and hurricane test — things shake, rattle, and sometimes break. But that's okay. "Be ready for flat tires, loose fixtures, or dead batteries. And don't be afraid to ask for help — there's always a fellow RVer nearby who knows a fix or two."

Life Beyond the Campsite- When they're not rolling down the road, **Russ** can usually be found fishing or kayaking while **Robin** is busy crafting — paper, fiber, or in the kitchen teaching others how to cook.

Fun Fact: Robin and Russ actually lived in Raleigh, NC, for 28 years before life took them to Seattle — and then back again! Their grandkids moved to Greensboro during COVID, and when Russ's job at Seattle Children's Hospital was "reorganized," the choice was easy. Now back in North Carolina, Russ works for Caring Cross — a not-for-profit that helps lower-income countries manufacture immunotherapy treatments for cancer, HIV, and sickle cell disease. How cool is that?
