#### **GROUND RULES**

#### **OHIO SWISS VILLAGE**

There's a village in Ohio down along the rolling land,
Where the eyes can gaze in wonder at the beauty close at hand.
And the people of the village, be they man or boy or miss,
Will bestow the smile of welcome characteristic of the Swiss.

Come to see us in the spring when the fields are turning green,
And the hills are grazing cattle in an atmosphere serene.

Or perhaps you'll come in summer and meander where you please,
Be it shop or store or market as the magic word is cheese.

Then come back in the autumn when there's music in the air,
For the atmosphere is festive and the country lanes are fair.
Hear the Alpine horns a-blowing, hear the yodeler's pipe and call;
Catch the gala Sweitzer music up above and over all.

For this village in Ohio has a touch of Old World grace,
As they toss the stone to contest who's the strongest in the place.
But to all a gentle welcome, happiness to those who seek,
As the Swiss turn out to greet you in our town of Sugarcreek.



**PARKING AREAS:** Your electrical pedestal has a location number on it. Your location will be tracked by that number. Your vehicle should be parked at your own RV site when on rally grounds. Guest parking areas are near the entrance gate.

**PETS:** All pets must be on a 6-foot, non-retractable leashes when outside the Airstream. Please always check collars and leashes to ensure they fit correctly and are working properly. A size-appropriate pet containment system can be used at the campsite. Except for working service animals, pets are not permitted in the buildings or during a meal in outside dining/food preparation areas. Well-mannered dogs are welcome to play and exercise in designated dog parks. Always clean up after your pet. And make sure your pet has an ID tag.

**SAFETY:** Be aware of your footing as you walk. The park has uneven ground, stones, water hoses, and electric cords. When rainy, expect slippery floors and stair steps and entrance/exit areas muddy. Use a flashlight to walk to your RV after the evening programs.

**SMOKING:** A city ordinance prohibits smoking anywhere on the park's grounds or in the Pavilion. You may smoke inside your RV unit or outside the rally ground's perimeter.

**SECURITY:** Protect and secure your RV, property, and vehicle at all times. We cannot always monitor "unwelcome" visitors from checking out our rally site (or your RV). Please help us keep a look-out for suspicious activity in our rally area.

**TREES:** Please do not trim branches or cut trees.

**WATER:** Keep your fresh water tank full. Your rally water supply is subject to disruptions and low pressure.

#### **GROUND RULES**

#### WELCOME and THANK YOU

**ELECTRICITY:** You are being provided <u>shared 30-amp</u> electric (one 30 amp circuit for 2 Airstreams). Electrical appliances such as AC, microwave, coffee pot, toaster/toaster oven, hair dryer, curling iron, electric blanket, overhead heat strip, or any appliance requiring large wattage cannot be used without coordinating with your shared neighbor. TVs and CPAP machines may be used with no problem.

**FIRST AID:** If you need medical attention, you must engage medical help on your own and at your own expense.

**GARBAGE:** Trash, cans, plastic bottles, etc. must be compacted as much as possible and placed in the <u>dumpster behind the Pavilion</u>. If the dumpster is full, **do not** leave trash bags on the ground.

**GUESTS:** Guests are always welcome at the rally. Whether staying in your RV for the duration of the rally or visiting on a day-by-day basis, all guests <u>must register</u>. If guests plan to attend rally programs and/or tours, they <u>must pay a rally fee</u> and wear a name badge and rally ribbon. Non-paying guests may not attend any rally activities. Please turn in badges before departure.

**HOLDING TANKS (GRAY WATER):** The Ohio Revised Code does not permit draining gray tank water on the ground because of the probability of food particles in it. This also prevents stench and attracting wildlife.

**HOLDING TANKS:** Holding tanks (both gray and black) will be pumped out on your choice of Tuesday or Friday. Attach your red tag to your dump valve by 7 a.m. on your choice of day. To dump on both days, buy an extra tag at the Chalet (when open) or before evening programs. There are convenient port-a-potty locations on the rally site. Listen for further instructions.

**IDENTIFICATION:** All rally attendees **MUST** wear their WBCCI name badge and rally ribbon while on the rally grounds and to gain entrance to our rally activities, evening programs, and tours.

Welcome to the 62 nd Swiss Festival National Rally, the longest continuously running rally in WBCCI history. We believe it's the best rally in the club! We hope you enjoy your time here and want to return next year with your friends. You are important to us.

**AMISH DINNERS:** Tickets are required for the limited seating. You may go to both a tour and Amish dinner on the same day. If necessary, leave your tour early to be back in the park by 5:15 p.m. Eat a light lunch-Amish meals are huge! Tickets will be sold on a first-come basis beginning on Sunday.

**CHAIRS:** The chairs are rented specifically for our rally and must not be removed from the Pavilion.

**DRIVING:** Many Amish buggies and bicycles use the roads in this area, so <u>please drive cautiously</u>. Buggies are slow-moving and may not be marked with a caution triangle or light at night. Horses can be skittish and are often controlled by young people. Please review the Amish Country Driving Tips flyer in your newsletter.

**ITEMS OF INTEREST:** Check the bulletin board and tables on a daily basis for information about our rally and the community. You may leave items of interest to be posted e.g., items for sale, in the designated folder.

**PHOTOS:** Please do not ask or take photos of the Amish in or out of our rally site. It is against their religious beliefs. When touring, ask your tour leader if you may take photos of the places you visit.


