Howdy Airstream Friends!

We have had a fantastic summer, but as always, the cooler temps are something we look forward to as we turn the corner into Autumn. We had a few things going on this summer and several things coming up that you'll want to be planning for.

68th International Rally in York: It was better than we could have ever imagined with near perfect weather and lots to do! Close to 100 rigs were there from Region 9. Members enjoyed many activities, volunteered for everything from equipment to room monitors, and celebrated at the Social. A big round of applause to our own, Stacey Daniel for all her efforts on the Pump Outs and to Scott Graham who once again led the Blood Drive. This year there was a whopping 132 Units of Blood collected in 2-days. Each unit could make a difference or save up to 3 lives, creating a very real opportunity to help up to 396 patients and an economic benefit of up to \$50,000. This was the 4th year for the Blood Drive at International and donors have given over 500 Units across these years.

Club Support: Region 9 Board is proud to keep the momentum going for the ACI Campus – Phase II and has donated a brick to the drive to complete the renovations on the ACI Member Clubhouse and Historical Center. The plans include renovations to the 803 Building, expanded Camp Sites & Fencing, along with a dog park, fire pit and pavilion. The estimated cost of this phase of the project is \$250,000 which is being raised solely through donations. The Region's donation is for one 8" x 8" brick commemorating Region 9. You're encouraged to be a part of this project – more information is available this link.




International Rally Overview Continued...

Greater Houston Airstream Club's Scenic Caravan to York, PA: A Journey to Remember

We embarked on an unforgettable Scenic Caravan to York, PA, from August 11 to August 20, 2025, filled with stunning landscapes, historical explorations, and camaraderie. Comprised of 9 Rigs – Gary & Pam Ally, Rick & Jennifer Cary, Rick & Tracy Elkins, Mitch & Mary Guinn, Ken & Lia Laney and Mimi (Lia's Sister), Dan & Maria McAnulty, David & Yi Rice, Sam & Ratna Singh, and Wayne Wilkerson we were York bound or bust with a motto of, "we're not lost, we're just taking the scenic route!" Here's a recap of our adventure-packed journey through thirteen states, showcasing the highlights of each of the five stops.

August 11: Baton Rouge, LA - Farr Park Equestrian **Center & RV Campground**

We kicked off our caravan in Baton Rouge at Farr Park Equestrian Center & RV Campground. Caravanners settled into first-come, first-served campsites and gathered for a lively happy hour featuring the signature 70/50 Cocktail at 5 PM, followed by a group meal under the park pavilion. The Leaders treated us to a delicious spread from the *original* Raisin' Cane's, complemented by a Mediterranean Orzo Salad and banana brownies. Caravan Leaders Rick Elkins and Wayne Wilkerson provided an overview of the upcoming day's route and divided the Caravanners into travel groups.





August 12: Collinsville, MS – Twiltley **Branch Campground (274 Miles)**

After staging groups for departure, we hit the road for a 274-mile drive to Twiltley Branch Campground in Collinsville, MS. Once settled into

assigned sites, we drove 20 miles to Meridian for a special 4 PM tour of the Soule Steam Museum, diving into the region's industrial history. The evening wrapped up with a lovely 10-minute walk to Weidmann's 1870 Restaurant for a delightful dinner, filled with great food and conversation

August 13-14: Woodville, AL – Cathedral Caverns State Park (251 Miles)

Our next stop was Cathedral Caverns State Park in Woodville, AL, a 251-mile journey which took us into Georgia. On day one, after arrival we enjoyed a fascinating group tour of the nearby caverns, a cool 60°F underground adventure covering about a mile. Day two was out-of-this-world, with a visit to the U.S. Space & Rocket Center in Huntsville. We explored the world's largest space museum, enjoying exhibits and a planetarium show. This is a beautiful State Park Campground that we would highly recommend to anyone traveling through the area.



August 15-16: Kodak, TN – Douglas Tailwater Campground (216 Miles)



Transitioning to Eastern Time, we traveled 216 miles to Douglas Tailwater Campground near Knoxville, TN. After arriving and setting up, the hosts and David Rice cooked hot dogs and hamburgers at the Pavilion overlooking the Dam and we celebrated those having birthdays along the way (David Rice, Ken Laney & Jennifer Cary). We also played a round of the 1% Club, which resulted in a tie between the travel groups they're pretty smart cookies! On day two, we explored the Ijams Nature Center in nearby Knoxville. This 318-acre oasis of forests, meadows, and wetlands had a Hummingbird Festival scheduled so we were able explore the Nature Center and learn about bird banding while soaking in the beauty of raised trails along the Tennessee River.

August 17-18: Natural Bridge, VA – Natural Bridge KOA (272 Miles)

Our 272-mile drive brought us to Natural Bridge KOA in Virginia. On day one, we relaxed and caught up on Laundry at this well-equipped KOA. Day two started with a 10 AM rangerled tour of the iconic 215-foot-high Natural Bridge, a 1.5-mile scenic hike through the park where we saw caves and waterfalls. Optional activities included visiting the free Cyrus McCormick's Museum to see a replica of the first reaper, or the D-Day Memorial in Bedford.

August 19-20: Gardners, PA – Mountain Creek Campground (232 Miles)

Our final stop before York was Mountain Creek Campground in Gardners, PA, a 232-mile drive that took us across several states including West Virginia and Maryland. We were deep into beautiful farm country with all sorts of fruit orchards and corn fields. Day one featured a special evening screening under the stars of the *Gettysburg* movie, hosted by Gary & Pam Alley, who shared ancestral stories—lawn chairs, beverages, and snacks in tow. On day two, members had a range of optional activities: touring the USA Heritage and Education Center in Carlisle, exploring downtown Carlisle's

historical markers, visiting Gettysburg National Military Park for a self-guided driving tour, or indulging in sweetness at Hershey's Chocolate World. We took this last opportunity to prepare for the International Rally by doing laundry, emptying tanks, and stocking up on groceries.

Final Stretch: York, PA

The caravan concluded with a 32-mile drive to York, staging at West Manchester Town Center near the Regal West Manchester Theater. Here we met up with the Express Caravan and a couple of rigs that were traveling together from a National Caravan in Newfoundland. We had only a short wait before we were welcomed to the fairgrounds for International Rally Parking.

The caravan concluded on Thursday with a gathering in York with the Scenic Caravan.


Overall, there were no safety concerns, no breakdowns, and members arrived at the target destination without incident.



Tech Tip

Stepping Safely.

During our recent summer trip to the Upper Peninsula of Michigan, we abruptly found an issue with our Airstream steps. When I exited the Airstream, stepping on the top step, a small screw flew off the step and the steps collapsed on the right side. I was ok but Holly and I took several minutes on the gravel to find the missing screw that popped out (very small). Thankfully we found it and were able to get the stairs back working temporarily. I did not have the tools at the time to fix the stairs for the long haul.

After much research, I now carry backup hardware (hinge pins (various sizes)) for the steps I purchased at International (you can also purchase at Airstream Supply Co). I also purchased an Allen wrench tool all in one needed to keep the screws tight. Lastly, I purchased some WD 40 Silicone to keep the steps lubricated on each moving joint.

I have learned that these steps are not to be ignored. They MUST be taken care of properly, ensuring the hinge pins are tight, the movement lubricated, and all is in good working order. My suggestion is to inspect before every trip and address as needed.


Failure to maintain these steps could result in someone getting hurt so make sure it's on your checklist before you leave on your next trip. Also, if your steps don't seem to be working right, have them looked at by a qualified professional such as Bob Jones RV or Foley.
