Avoid Falling for Phishing Scams

ACI Headquarters was recently alerted to a phishing scam with a suspicious PDF attachment. The email claims to contain an important document regarding your membership and asks for your email and email password to open it. Do not open the attachment or enter any information. The ACI Membership team will never send you a PDF requiring your email login information.

Cybercriminals are always looking for new ways to trick people into sharing personal information. Phishing–impersonating a trusted organization to get you to click a harmful link, download a malicious attachment, or share sensitive information—is one of their most common tactics.

Recognize the Signs of Phishing

- Urgent or threatening language such as "Act now or your account will be suspended."
- Unfamiliar or misspelled sender addresses.
- Sender names that don't match the sender email address.
- Requests for passwords, payment information, or personal details.
- Suspicious links or unexpected attachments.

Now to Stay Safe

- Do not click links or download attachments from unknown or unexpected senders.
- Check the sender's email address to make sure you recognize it and for subtle spelling errors or differences.
- If you're unsure about an email, contact the sender directly using known, official contact information.
- Do not reply. Replying can confirm your email is active to scammers.

A few extra moments of caution can help protect you and your personal information from phishing scams.

Do you know about the Airstream Club's "Star" Recognition program?

One of the meaningful traditions in the Airstream Club is the awarding and display of **membership stars** that recognize years of commitment and loyalty to the club.

What Are Membership Stars?

- For every **five years** of continuous membership in the Club, a member becomes eligible to receive a star to add to their display.
- These stars are typically placed adjacent to your Airstream Club decal on both the front and rear of your rig, serving as visual recognition of your longevity as part of the community.
- The Club issues these stars to members (usually at no charge) once their membership milestone is verified.

How to Display the Stars

A guideline from the Club's documentation, "Star Placement," suggests the following for positioning:

- Begin measuring from the edge of the Club emblem or decal to find the center point for your first star.
- Each additional star is offset by a specified distance (for example, 4½" from the decal edge for the second star, 6½" for the third, etc.).
- Using lightly soapy water during placement can help adjust positioning before fully adhering the stars.

Why Stars Matter

- They serve as a **badge of honor** for long-term members, publicly displaying the years of investment in the Airstream community.
- Seeing stars on another's rig can be a conversation starter and a sign of shared experience.
- The system reinforces the sense of belonging, continuity, and tradition that club members value.

If you want to know how many stars you can display, please reach out to your local club or Region Membership Chair. ACI has also added Maple Leaves that can be used in place of the stars. Stars and Maple Leaves can be ordered at no charge from the ACI Web store.

For many of our members, the 2026 Membership Renewal season begins October 3rd. Below are a few highlights to remember:

- Membership dues are \$99 per year.
- The primary or partner member MUST be logged in to the member-only portal to renew online.
- Members with multiple Big Red Numbers (BRN) can renew their additional BRN in the member-only portal at the time of renewal.
- HQ is collecting Affiliate and Intra-Club dues.
- All Lifetime members must go through the renewal process.
- HQ will be notifying members it is time to renew by postcard, email and social media starting November 1st.
- HQ will notify Local Clubs if there is an issue contacting a member.
- The deadline for the 2026 Published Membership Directory is January 31, 2024.
- Members can pay by credit card or ACH (bank transfer).
 - Credit card payments will be charged a 3% convenience fee but are processed immediately.
 - ACH payments may take 3-5 business days to process.
