As you may know, our Club collected \$2,400 in charity donations at the Ocean Lakes rally. Renee and I were honored to deliver the checks from CAC to MANNA Food Bank and Brother Wolf Animal Rescue in Asheville last month. The staff at both organizations were very grateful and overwhelmed with our Club's generosity.

The proposed JotForm-based survey of our Club membership's participation in the ACI International Rally in Minot, ND, will be live in January. At that time, please watch our website for the survey where we request that you login and complete it. Your answers will help us coordinate travel to this and future ACI rallies to improve planning for future CAC rallies. Even if you are not planning to attend the 2026 International Rally in Minot, your responses would be very much appreciated.

The 2026 CAC Punkin' Chunkin' Rally will now be hosted at the Murphy/Peace Valley KOA Holiday park in Marble, NC, October 15-19. Reservations must be made by phone. The reservation window for our club members opens on January 5, 2026. Call directly to the park office at 828-837-6223. Tell them you're with the Carolinas Airstream Club. They have blocked 25 sites for our rally. Our special rate of \$60 per night (vs the normal \$70/night rate) is good until January 31, 2026. So, you must call in January to be certain to get a site and to get this discounted rate. Once you have registered with Peace Valley KOA for your site, go to the CAC website and register for the rally itself. This rally will fill up quickly, and leaf season means the park will sell out, so be sure to book your RV site and register for the CAC Punkin' Chunkin' Rally in January.

2026 will be a busy rally year for the Carolinas Airstream Club. There is still a lot to be accomplished for these rallies, both before and during, and it takes volunteers from our CAC club membership to make each rally a success.

If you have the time, please volunteer. No specific skills are required. As you saw if you attended the Ocean Lakes rally in November, many hands make light work of what may otherwise seem to be a daunting task.

We will need volunteers to help with hosting, set-up, meal preparation, conducting events, and clean-up at each rally. If you are willing and able to contribute time and effort to the rallies you plan to attend, reach out to the host listed for those rallies and volunteer. That is how our club succeeds!

Cranberry Apricot Cream Cheese Spread

A PHONE CONVERSATION WITH CHARLIE FISHEL

- I was 37 years old when I joined. Back then, you could not join until two club members wrote up a history of us, we had to visit the club at least two times, and at the 2nd visit the club members voted us into the club.
- The club back then it was more family-oriented than today. We knew everybody.
- We did a lot of cooking and eating—Friday, Saturday, supper. My wife and I would fix dinner for the club for Thursday before the rally started. Have a poor man's supper. Made 100 tarts for dessert. Cooked about 17 pounds of beans, hush puppies, slaw, onions.
- We put a little tip jar on the table for outreach money. Did a lot of work for the hospital at Wake Forest for Ronald McDonald House. In winter, when we did not have a rally, we would help out.
- No one was allowed to have beer or wine in the campground, only in their trailer.
- Before we got our Airstream, we would camp at Lakewood. Then, Ocean Lakes opened up and went there its first year with my wife and three kids. There were only six sites in the sand. A photographer was there and took of picture of us with our unit. The next year, 1971, Ocean Lakes opened up and a photo of our unit was in the directory!
- I remember when CAC split into 3 different clubs. They each had 50 60 members. We could all go out and eat at one time. Enjoyed it. Had lots of good fun.
- My first international rally was in 1975. There were 4 trailers short of 4000! Water only. 500 of us were far away. Kids would get picked up and we wouldn't see them all day.
- We never locked our trailers.
- In 2003, we were up in NY where the World's Fair was. They lined us up so straight that I was in the 17th row back and could see people coming up from the first trailer.
- That's when grandparents used to bring their granddaughters and have queens and parades. Every club was required to bring or make a float for the parade. Each club would try to outdo the other. We spent the week making the float. My job was to space them out as they left in the parade so they wouldn't be on top of each other. It took 1 hour to get the parade out. We went last; my granddaughter was there and had finished her first year of college. She was the queen.

Chad previously worked at Blue Compass/Airstream of Greensboro, where this past year he became the number one Airstream salesperson in the world. He also runs *Chad's RV Reviews*, a YouTube channel focused on Airstream tours, upgrades, and camping tips.
