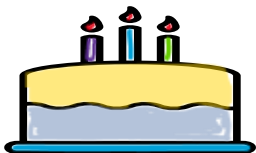

Top 10: Our Favorite Airstream HACKS - Simple & Easy!

Living the Airstream life is all about adventure, but it's also about making the most of your compact space. Whether you're a seasoned traveler or a new Airstream owner, these hacks can help you maximize comfort, functionality, and even save you a little money on the road. For more great camping ideas and gear, make sure to check out our [Amazon storefront](#).

1. Step Up Your Support:

Airstream steps can feel a little flimsy. Our first hack uses a simple 28-inch steel curb key as a brace for the bottom step, providing some much-needed reinforcement for a sturdier entry and exit.

2. Beat the Heat with Reflectix:

Summer sun can turn your Airstream into an oven. [This hack utilizes Reflectix](#), a radiant heat-blocking material readily available at hardware stores. Cut Reflectix to fit your windows and create a barrier that keeps the scorching rays at bay, helping you stay cool on those hot days.

3. Command Your Blinds:

Those all-or-nothing window shades can be frustrating. Here's where Command hooks come in handy. Stick a few upside down on the window frame, and voila! You've created a way to hold the blinds partially open, allowing for airflow and shade simultaneously – perfect for those times you want to keep cool while still enjoying some natural light.

4. Secure Your Stuff for the Journey:

Bumpy roads can wreak havoc on your Airstream's interior. This hack is a simple yet effective way to prevent cabinet doors from flying open and the faucet from turning on during travel. Just loop a bungee cord around your cabinet doors to keep them shut and secure the faucet handle with a hair tie. Problem solved!

5. Bake Like a Pro:

Pizza stones aren't just for pizza anymore. Placing one in the bottom of your Airstream oven helps distribute heat more evenly, leading to more efficient cooking and shorter baking times. No more unevenly cooked meals on the road!

6. Keep it Cool on the Move:

Keeping perishables fresh during travel can be a challenge. This hack utilizes ice packs and leftover curtain rods. Place ice packs on top of your eggs, milk, or meat to keep them cold, and use the curtain rods to prevent them from rolling around and getting jostled.

7. Freshen Up Your Shower:

Small spaces can get smelly fast. This hack is a simple solution to keep your Airstream shower smelling fresh. Place a car air freshener in the shower area to combat any lingering odors.

8. Pool Noodle Magic:

Those tiny gaps behind cabinets can become a black hole for lost items. This hack tackles that problem with a common pool noodle. Cut a pool noodle lengthwise and place it along the back of your cabinets to create a barrier. Now, items won't disappear into the abyss behind your cabinets anymore!

9. Breathe Easy with Upgraded Vents:

The original Airstream AC vents might not be the most efficient. This hack involves replacing them with high-efficiency vents made from repurposed stainless steel floor drain covers. This allows for better airflow, keeping your Airstream cooler with less strain on your AC unit.

10. Take Control of the Chill:

Once you've upgraded your vents, maximize their effectiveness with clear vent deflectors. These attach to the vents in your living area, allowing you to redirect the cool air and control exactly where it goes for optimal comfort.

We hope these hacks inspire you to create a comfortable and personalized Airstream experience.

Almost Heaven – West Virginia submitted by Bill & Sandee Welch (BRN #01399)

Thanks to the popular folk song, “Country Roads, Take Me Home,” most people have heard about West Virginia’s Blue Ridge Mountains and Shenandoah River. Both are beautiful and truly something to see. However, there are some other places in West Virginia that, while not mentioned in a song, are also definitely worth a visit.



Trans-Allegheny Lunatic Asylum:

Tucked away in the rolling hills of Weston, WV lies the Trans-Allegheny Asylum. A foreboding structure with a rich and haunting history, this National Historic Landmark housed the mentally ill/challenged from 1864 until 1994. Historic tours and – for those looking for something a little more spooky – paranormal tours are offered daily from the end of March until the beginning of November.

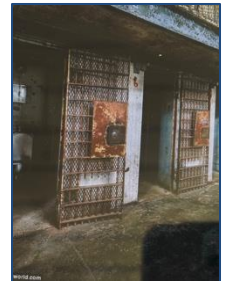
Prickett’s Fort State Park:

Located five miles from Fairmont, WV, this historic site features a reconstruction of the original Prickett’s Fort which served as a place of refuge during colonial times. It commemorates late 18th century life on the West Virginia frontier by offering guided tours and demonstrations of colonial crafts such as basketry, blacksmithing and weaving. It is open from mid-April until the end of October.

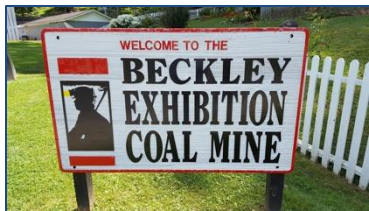


West Virginia Penitentiary:

Dating back to 1876, this site located in Moundsville, WV, continued to function as a prison until the 1960’s. From April through November, the ninety-minute tours of the gothic style structure include historical information, a touch of art, cold hard facts and an insight into the justice system.



Beckley Exhibition Coal Mine:



Visitors can ride on an underground train into the depths of the vintage coal mine. The guides are veteran miners and provide firsthand accounts of the daily responsibilities and work of past and present-day miners. In addition to the mines, visitors can tour the restored coal camp buildings situated throughout the grounds. Tours and visits are available April through November.



Bill and I have always enjoyed West Virginia’s beauty, but after visiting these different places, we now have a new appreciation for some of its historical sites as well!

Hot and Sour Soup



Ingredients:

- 6 cups beef broth
- ½ cup sliced mushrooms
- ¼ cup soy sauce (regular or reduced sodium)
- ¼ cup rice wine vinegar or white vinegar
- 1 Tbsp. siracha sauce
- 1 tsp. white pepper
- 3 Tbsps. cornstarch or (arrowroot or tapioca starch)
- 3 Tbsps. cold water
- 2 large eggs, well beaten
- 6 oz. firm tofu, sliced into thin strips (optional)
- 2 green onions, sliced

Instructions:

1. **Simmer:** Bring the broth to a simmer over medium high heat in a large saucepan. Add mushrooms, soy sauce, vinegar, siracha sauce and white pepper. Continue to simmer for 5 minutes.
2. **Thicken:** In a small bowl, whisk together the corn starch and cold water to make a slurry. Add it to the soup and stir well. Simmer for 5 minutes or until soup starts to thicken.
3. **Swirl in the eggs:** Pour beaten eggs into the soup while gently stirring the soup in a circular motion.
4. **Optional – add tofu:** Add the sliced tofu and green onions, stir and remove saucepan from heat. Serve immediately.
