






A Message from your Incoming 2026 GHAC President By Lisa Feine



Tech Tip

By Eric McMurphy

Better Air Flow.

Have you ever sat in your rig and thought about the air vents? Why were they designed the way they were and is there a better solution? Well, I certainly did and after many conversations with other members, I decided to make the purchase to increase airflow in my rig and make it an even more comfortable place to enjoy.

Whether you're looking for more air from the AC or a better way to heat your rig with your heat pumps from the AC, I can tell you from personal experience this is some of the best money I've spent on my rig.

There are several options to improve your air flow, I'm going to show you the option I chose and provide some pictures but there are also other companies with other options. I'm very happy with my choice and I think the cost was very reasonable.

So why did I do this? Well, the time it took to cool down the rig or warm up the rig seemed to take too long. I have two small dogs that we do leave in the rig for a few hours at a time and heating/cooling the rig quicker was very beneficial and, in the long run, better for our AC units because they don't have to work as hard. In the end, we are real believers that the rig is much more comfortable, we can control the air flow much better and our rig is not working as hard to heat or cool.

We purchased our new vents from rivetedmarket.com. We purchased the Campair High-Flow spot diffuser air vent – steel series with radius mount which is the picture below in the middle. Recently, Campair has come out with an aluminum diffuser (far left) as well that is \$20 more than the steel diffuser, I purchased at \$70 each. My personal rig install in our bedroom below (far-right picture) looks pretty good!

There are other options such as erPOD at \$145 each and Airstream Ceiling Vent Registers (new version) at \$28 each from Airstream Supply Company (part # 204438-01).

From personal experience, the installation is easy for the

Campair. If you can turn an Allen wrench and use a drill,

you can install these air diffusers. You first need to put the hardware together on each diffuser. I put together 9 of them for my rig and it took me about 45 minutes. Next, you need to remove the old diffusers in your rig with a drill and drill bit, for my 9, it took me about 20 minutes. Then you need to install the new diffusers which took about 30 minutes. Overall, it's about a 2-hour investment that you will NOT regret. Now, air is pushed all the way to the floor vs out along the ceiling. The feel in the rig is much better than before and frankly, I think the look is even better as well!

Photos are not judged on quality, but based on correct responses to clues given. Follow the easy steps below.

- 1) Look for **links to clues** below footer on various newsletter pages; **watch brief video clues** to determine which Christmas item is being described. Send me a list of items from the clues you watched. You can identify one, two, or all eleven. It's totally up to you! You will get an entry into the contest drawing for each item you identify correctly, for a total of 11 items.
- 2) **Extra credit: Take a picture of each item** you identified for an additional entry on each one.  - You can also send a brief story of anything you encountered while figuring out the clues of taking the pictures, but this is optional. No additional entries for this option, but it can be fun.
 - ** I would appreciate you sending me a text 863-670-2828 to let me know you sent me an email. Sometimes my mail decides it is junk for no reason. If you do not have email, you can send me your answers and photos in a text message.

For each correct item or picture, you will get **one entry** into a drawing for a chance to win! Exception: BONUS Holiday Contest Clue #11 will earn you **FIVE** entries into the drawing for correctly identifying the item AND sending a picture, for a total of 25 possible entries. No more than 11 guesses and 11 pictures (e.g. one per category) per entrant will be accepted.
