That's all guys! As always, it is our honor to serve you, the members of Region 2!



## Staying Safe Online: A Reminder for All Region 2 Members

Phishing emails, text messages, and even phone calls are becoming more convincing—and organizations like ours are often targeted simply because we are active, volunteer-driven, and well connected. These messages are designed to look legitimate and often rely on urgency to prompt a quick response.

Whether you are an officer or a general member, a few simple habits can help keep both your personal information and our club safe:

Before you click, reply, or take action:

- Look closely at the sender's email address or phone number, not just the name shown
- Be cautious of messages that create urgency or pressure ("act now," "account problem," "immediate action required")
- Never share passwords, verification codes, or login information by email or text
- Be especially careful with any request involving money, payments, or account changes

#### **A good rule of thumb:**

If something doesn't feel right—or feels rushed—pause and verify through another method, such as a phone call or direct conversation. Legitimate requests will always allow time for confirmation.

If you receive a message that seems suspicious, it's okay to ask questions or simply not respond. Staying alert and looking out for one another helps protect the entire Region 2 community.


## Winter Checkups for a Smoother Season Ahead

For many of us in Region 2, February means our Airstreams are sitting quietly, waiting for the travel season to return. While the road may still be a few weeks away, this is an ideal time for a low-key maintenance check that can help prevent surprises once spring arrives.

A winter walk-around can be as simple as looking for signs of moisture, checking seals and vents, and making sure tires are properly inflated. Inside, it's a good opportunity to test lights, inspect hoses and cords, and confirm that batteries are holding a charge. None of this requires deep mechanical knowledge—just a little time and attention.

It's also a great moment to think about the small comfort items that improve life on the road. Replacing worn door seals, refreshing drawer latches, or reorganizing storage can make a noticeable difference once you're traveling again. These small updates are often easier to tackle now, when schedules are slower and the camping calendar isn't full.

A little care during the winter months helps ensure that when rally season begins, your focus can be on the journey rather than the to-do list. February may be part of the off-season, but it's also when a smooth and enjoyable travel year really begins.



## What's In A Name? - Patti Galupo, Region 2 President

This is the second of a series highlighting our local units/club's history and newsletter monikers. Last quarter, we launched the series with our feature on AI-Mon-O and their monthly periodical, "The Point." Stay with me as we travel to the great north, and plop our tongues down at coordinates 51.2538° N, 85.3232° W, the Province of Ontario. Home to the Ontario Canada Airstream Club (OCAC) and her six installments of "The Trillium."

We untangled all of this a few nights ago thanks to the mighty Zoom machine. OCAC President Lesley Stewart, Past President and club historian Melanie Cornwell, newsletter editor Steve Ansell and pajama-wearing-president yours truly began with the obvious, what is a "trillium?" Before I googled the provincial flower in all of its leafy glory, President Stewart veered off in a different direction. Why was "Canada" in the club's name? After all, I'm not a member of the Washington, DC United States of America Unit, we're simply the WDCU, the Washington DC Unit. So, why was Canada imbedded in the name?

Turns out, in the early 1960's, Ontario was a bona fide town in seven locations in the United States. The OCAC received their charter in 1964 as the Ontario Unit. They quickly called an audible and renamed it the Ontario Canada Unit in 1965, finally dropping the Unit to Airstream Club a couple of years ago. Okay, moving on from the Civics lesson.....

Now, back to that flower! The trillium.

Did you know that it's known for the large, white flower that turns pink with age? How about that? It kind of does a Benjamin Button thing, ages in reverse. Wouldn't we all want the supple pink skin of a baby? I would plaster my neck with nectar from those trillium flowers if I thought it would help! I guess it would grow in Virginia???


Matilla in his Capital, to Capital caravan, Ottawa to Washington, D.C. It's just one example of cross-border fun! We gotta get that back on the books!

The OCAC is the largest club in Region 2, as of this writing, sporting 202 members. When you delve into the "health" of the club, meaning retention of and recruitment of new members, rally attendance, maintaining a full slate of officers etc., they are rock solid. They do use their deep bench-trustees and vice presidents are put to work rather quickly learning the ropes of organizing and hosting rallies. And, because they have long, cold winters, they are truly grateful when the trilliums start to pop out of the ground and average 50-60 rigs per rally. In the offseason, they hold lunches and happy hours indoors to keep the juices flowing. Geographically, most of the provinces are so large (other than the Maritimes) that they do not hold cross-province rallies. The land mass on its own just isn't conducive to it. But here's something that I was surprised to learn. Ontario boasts a rather prolific wine country. Step aside northern California and western New York! I must confess, I don't pay that much attention to such demographics anymore since I don't drink, but I love, love, love their play on words with their annual Wine-devous Rally. 


Above: The 1964 Charter, bearing the name "Ontario Unit" and signed by Secretary Helen Byam Schwamborn

## Why Stepping Up Matters: The Impact of Club Leadership in Region 2 - Cody Klingler

Our clubs in Region 2 don't thrive by accident. They thrive because members step forward—often quietly and behind the scenes—to serve in officer and leadership roles. Volunteering to lead is not always easy, but it is always important.

Officer roles are more than titles. They are the framework that allows our local clubs and Region 2 as a whole to function, grow, and remain welcoming. Presidents help set tone and direction, treasurers safeguard trust, secretaries preserve continuity, and membership and activity chairs keep the heartbeat of our clubs strong. When these roles are filled and supported, clubs flourish. When they are not, even the most enthusiastic membership can struggle.

Leadership transitions—whether planned or unexpected—remind us how much responsibility rests on a small number of volunteers and how essential it is to cultivate a deep bench of engaged members. Strong clubs don't rely on one or two people to “always do it.” Instead, they encourage shared responsibility, mentorship, and a culture where stepping up is supported.

Volunteering as an officer doesn't require having all the answers. It requires a willingness to learn, to listen, and to care about the Airstream community. Many who have served in Region 2 will tell you they grew into their roles—and that the experience deepened their connection to both their local club and the Region.

Strong leadership also provides stability across Region 2. It ensures continuity from year to year, preserves institutional knowledge, and helps clubs navigate change while maintaining the camaraderie and traditions that bring us together.

If you've ever thought, “*Someone else will do it,*” consider this your gentle nudge. That “someone” is often a fellow member already giving significant time and energy. Stepping up—even for a short term, or in a supporting role—can make a meaningful and lasting difference.

### A Call to Action
