

JUBILEE STATE PARK RALLY - DRAFT/WORKING

Thursday May 14th - Arrive any time after 3 p.m. (arriving earlier is not a problem)

Jubilee College State Park is a 3200-acre facility located in Peoria County between the towns of Kickapoo and Brimfield, just off US Route 150. This scenic area, with its rolling topography and meandering Jubilee Creek, offers various outdoor recreational activities. This park offers picnicking, camping, equestrian, hiking and biking trails and various hunting opportunities.

Directions:

You can reach Jubilee College State Park from I-74. Traveling west, you will want to take exit 82 at Kickapoo/Edwards Rd. Turn right onto Kickapoo//Edwards rd. and it is about a half mile into Kickapoo then turn left on U.S. Route 150. You will drive for 4 miles and the entrance to the park will be on the right. Those coming from the west should take exit 75, then left onto Maher rd. for about a 1000 ft. then you will make a right onto U.S. Route 150 and drive for 4 miles. The park entrance will be on your left.

Rate is \$20/day or \$80 total for the rally. All spots are back in with gravel except for a few handicap spots that are concrete, all spots have 30amp electric, there are water hydrants, at various locations in the camp area and a dump station at the entry into the camping area. I have reserved a handicap spot at 29H. We will have covered enclosures like last year for all the group activities.

Caterpillar Visitor Center – Tue-Saturday 10am to 5pm, seniors \$6, 110 S.W. Washington St. Peoria Il. 61602 It is 18 miles from the park.

Peoria Riverfront Museum is right next door to the Caterpillar Visitor Center and opens 10 to 5 daily, \$18 senior price.

Downtown near the museum there is a sidewalk sculpture tour, information on that is available at the museum and an attachment is included in the itinerary

The Bishop Hill historic site, 304 S. Bishop Hill St., Bishop Hill IL. 61419, Ph. 309/927-3345, Sunday 9am to 4 pm. 42 miles from the park.

Wildlife Prairie Park is 9.8 miles from Jubilee Park. Adults \$15, Seniors \$13, not open on Sundays.

Wheels O time museum, Wed – Sun, noon to 5pm, admission \$10 (senior) 1710 Woodside Drive, Dunlap IL., 16 miles from the park Ph. 309/243-9020, Laura Evancho, Executive Director, Cell 309/229-6430, self-guided tour (see map)

After the tour there are other venues that might be of interest that you can explore on your own. (see below). There are Geocaches in the park and there is always Brakers Market, Eureka IL. 32 miles from the park, everything there is super high quality, 1183 Cruger Rd., Eureka, IL 61530, Ph. 309/431-4700

Meet up and travel to the other side of the park and tour the Old Jubilee College Historic Site which dates to the earlier part of the 19th century. A guided tour is arranged through Jesse Gilles 309/243-9489.
