


# **Sip of the Salem Witch's Brew Rally**

Location: Winter Island Park, Salem, MA

Date of Rally : June 24-28, 2026





Come join us for Grapes and Grains camaraderie and a truly unique collection of experiences! Our activities include a day in Boston with a duck boat tour, historic Fenway park tour and tasting of world class brews and then a day to learn Salem's unique history.

Winter Island Park and its lighthouse have welcomed maritime visitors into Salem's harbor for centuries. Located just minutes northeast of downtown Salem, it is accessible by foot, bike, Salem Trolley, car, and boat. Its recreational resources are extensively used by Salem residents and non-residents of all ages and abilities and include a historic fort and buildings, public beaches, a state-owned boat ramp, a state-financed pier,

This is a unique urban campground where half of our sites will be waterfront or waterview in the paved boat launch parking lot and the other half will be in a grassy field area that is a two minute walk from the water but does not have water view. . All have water and electric hookups. There is also a full bathhouse for campers. Sites will be assigned by the hosts based on first -come first serve basis, length of your rig, and attempting to match your preference of waterfront/waterview or field camping. All campsites have water and electric. A pump out service will come on day 3 (Friday) for those who would like it.

Salem is also only 25 miles from Boston with a local commuter train that will take you there directly in 30 minutes without dealing with traffic.

**Grapes & Grains Refund Policy:**

Members who cancel after being registered for any event will forfeit any third-party non-refundable fees incurred by Grapes & Grains (G&G) or the event sponsor including but not limited to reservation fees, processing fees, site cancellation fees, prepaid excursion, tour, entertainment, and event fees. Any member/registrant who cancels within 30 days of the Rally start date will forfeit any prepaid rally fees and depending on the venue, potential RV site fees. Regardless of the reason or cause, if the timeliness of cancellation of your attendance does not allow G&G or its Host(s) to find replacement attendees or obtain refunds from any of the vendors or providers, a refund will not be made, and forfeiture of those costs will be incurred by the cancelling member.

If Grapes & Grains should cancel a rally or event, all fees paid by any member/registrant will be refunded.

This Grapes & Grains refund policy is premised on the concept that the Intra-Club should neither profit from nor subsidize the cost of any member or registrant who cancels after registering for a G&G sponsored or hosted rally or event. We understand that circumstances arise where a cancellation may be necessary, and every effort will be made to minimize the financial impact on both the Intra-Club and the member/registrant.

Any member/registrant who does not agree with a refund decision made by the organizers of a G&G sponsored event may appeal that decision to the G&G Executive Board by filing a written appeal request, including the reasons for a reversal of the refund decision, within 30 days of the original refund decision.

11:30 am         Arrive at Trillium, Fort Point for guided tasting and pizza lunch. This is in the heart of the Seaport area. Trillium is a top national brewery famous as masters of the hazy New England IPA as well as stouts, wild ales and special with limited distribution – so prepare to take some home!  
  
2:00 pm         Optional Fenway Park tour. Otherwise explore the Fenway area or Seaport area on your own.  
3:00 pm         Board the bus  
3:30- 5:30         A tour, tasting and cheese pairing at Boston's favorite Sam Adams Brewery. This is global award winning craft brewery famous for ales, lagers, stouts and IPAs. We will have a private tour with entry to 4 special areas not open to the public.  
5:30         Board bus to travel back to the beautiful Salem Harbor.  
7:00         Light dinner served in the Function Hall. BYOB and celebrate the view and the day
